COUNTERFEIT CHECKS UTTERED/ FALSE PRETENSE

On Monday, October 29, 2007, Rappahannock Regional Jail staff advised that during the above-cited time frame, an unknown subject(s) forged and uttered seven counterfeit checks using the Inmate Trust Fund account number (though not identifying the specified account as true checks on the account do). All seven checks were uttered at an Ashland VA Wal-Mart store and totaled over \$6800. None of the names to which the counterfeit checks were made payable have ever been inmates at the RRJ. Complainant advised that on release, inmates are issued such checks, which would be easy to duplicate using the right computer software.

COUNTERFEIT \$100 BILL UTTERED

The bill was apparently photocopied; it had no embedded red and blue fibers, security strip, watermark, or color changing ink. There were also areas of white around the outside of the back of the bill. The clerk advised she recalled he had a second similar bill in his wallet. He advised his grandmother had given him the bill. He provided an IL ID card with NC address.
