

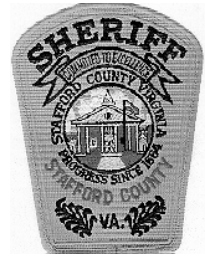

**UNAUTHORIZED USE

ALPHA/ THE GREENS AT FALL RUN

On Saturday, September 22, 2007, complainant advised his daughter's ex-boyfriend has complainant's white 1992 Pontiac Bonneville (IA/273GYY) that his daughter left behind after returning to IA when they broke up. The boyfriend admits to driving it, despite being told by complainant's daughter that he is not to.

**LARCENY FROM NEW HOME CONSTRUCTION SITE
QUARTER HORSE LN (LOT 11)**

DELTA/ EQUESTRIAN ESTATES

Caller (owner of Builders Salvage and Supply) advised that he bought 12 interior doors and an exterior door from two subjects who claimed they had no ID; when a check-cashing store called to verify the check, they obtained identification. Caller advised the \$600 double French exterior door had a label with a builder name and the reference address noted. Checks with the builder confirmed the larceny of the door from that site, though no interior doors were taken from there.
