## General Assignment

**GRAND LARCENY (FIREARMS)

Complainant advised he realized three guns had been stolen from his residence; he believes it is related to a check larceny investigation the previous year, when a man he hired for jobs around the house stole and uttered some of his checks. He suspects either the man who forged the checks or a second man who also did work around the house.
