

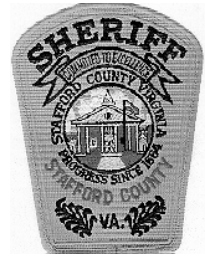

BRAVO

A Theros Equipment employee responding after they received an alarm noticed the lights on and bay door open at the adjacent White Oak Equipment. He saw a black Ford F150 go around their gate in the grass and quickly head EB on Kings Highway. The rear gate was pushed over and tire tracks were found in the grass. The center bay door had been rammed off track and was pried open; paint transfer was noted. The right bay door and an office door on that side were found open. The truck was located in Spotsylvania with fresh paint damage. The driver was drunk, but advised he was not in Stafford that night; the truck was seized. A White Oak Equipment employee later advised that no doors on the building had been secured. An old, inoperable Murray Go Cart (\$1100) that they had just brought there a week before had been stolen. Also stolen were a spray paint gun, jacket, and cell phone.

She heard a single loud bang; when she looked downstairs, her front door had been knocked completely off. She asked who was there and got no answer; when she went downstairs, both the subjects and the car were gone. A tennis shoe footprint was located at the bottom right side of the door. Complainant and her two teenaged daughters had no idea who these subjects might be.
