WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

DUI

Truslow Ridge Court and Truslow Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Upon arriving on scene, a vehicle was found in the grass with the driver asleep, and a case of alcoholic beverages was observed in the backseat. After waking up, the driver displayed signs of impairment with erratic behavior and slurred speech. The driver also admitted to having consumed alcohol earlier that day. A field sobriety test was administered, and a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was arrested and charged with driving under the influence and drinking while operating a motor vehicle.

WARRANT SERVICES

564 Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a wanted suspect at the nearby Clarion Inn. Upon making contact, the suspect shut the door in the deputy's face. Eventually, the suspect opened the door again and complied with deputies. The suspect was subsequently arrested and served on his outstanding warrant and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

LARCENY

Walmart | 11 Village Parkway | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspects had stolen a cart full of items from the store on April 7, 2026, and had attempted to do so again on April 14. The Loss Prevention team had detained one of the suspects before they left the store. The deputy made contact with the second suspect in the parking lot, who claimed to know nothing about the shoplifting attempt. Camera footage confirmed that both suspects threw items into the cart before the second suspect left the store. Shortly after, the first suspect passed all points of sale without attempting to pay and was stopped by the Loss Prevention team. The suspects were identified and released with a set court date.

FRAUD

Carter Bank and Trust | 175 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding a stolen check. Information was provided that the suspect had attempted to cash a stolen check, which had been flagged in their system earlier that day. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect also had an outstanding warrant out of Henrico for failure to appear in court. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with forgery and served on his warrant.

Elkton Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding altered money orders. The victim reported attempting to mail money orders to pay their bills, but the money orders never arrived. When the victim contacted the bank, the bank notified the victim that the money orders had been altered and deposited into a separate account. No suspects have been identified at this time.

HIT AND RUN

Holly Corner Road and Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a hit-and-run report in the area. The victim reported that they were driving on Route 17 when the suspect hit them while changing lanes in traffic. The suspect then left the scene. No suspects have been identified at this time.

BRAVO ZONE

FRAUD

Sutter Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized charges. The victim reported two unauthorized charges on their credit card that were completed in Florida. Deputy advised the victim secure their credit cards and notify their bank.

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

FedEx | 180 Centreport Parkway | A deputy responded to an embezzlement report. Information was provided that the suspect had reportedly concealed an item from a package. When confronted by management, the suspect placed a large bottle of prescription medication on the table. The deputy made contact with the suspect, who claimed they had found the bottle on the ground and had planned to turn it over to management, but had forgotten. After speaking with employees, the suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with possession of a Schedule I/II controlled substance.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

540 Auto | 486 Cambridge Street | A deputy responded to a disturbance. Information was provided that a customer was shouting and getting into people's faces. Upon making contact with the customer, they displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The customer admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that morning. An initial investigation revealed that the customer was wanted out of Caroline County for a probation violation. When the deputies went to arrest the customer, the customer resisted arrest and ran toward Route 1. After the pursuit ended, the customer was arrested and charged with public intoxication, fleeing from law enforcement, and interfering with traffic, along with being served on his outstanding warrant.

LARCENY

Westie Way | A deputy responded to a hit-and-run report in the area. The victim reported that their vehicle was struck before the suspect left the scene. The deputy confirmed the damage done to the vehicle's rear bumper and hatch. There were no cameras able to see the incident, and an initial investigation of the area provided no further information.

CHARLIE ZONE

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

195 North | A deputy responded to a traffic stop. An initial investigation of the vehicle revealed that the plates belonged to a different vehicle, and the driver had a revoked license. Searching the vehicle before it was towed, deputies found narcotics on the floorboard. The driver was subsequently arrested. More narcotics and drug paraphernalia were later discovered in the vehicle. The driver was identified and charged with possession of a controlled substance, driving with a revoked license, and driving a vehicle with unregistered license plates.

WARRANT SERVICES

Clarion Inn | 564 Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a wanted suspect. Upon making contact, the suspect shut the door in the deputy's face. Eventually, the suspect opened the door again and complied with deputies. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and served on his outstanding warrant and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



DELTA ZONE

FRAUD

Hermitage Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding fraudulent arrest warrants. The victim reported receiving a call from the suspect regarding two fraudulent arrest warrants for missing a federal court date. The suspect claimed that the victim signed a certified letter stating that they would appear. The suspect instructed the victim to send funds through Bitcoin, and the victim completed the transaction. The deputy advised the victim that federal agencies do not call requesting money over the phone and that law enforcement would serve a warrant in person. The deputy advised the victim to notify their bank.

Kinross Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft. The victim reported that they faced complications while filing their taxes and contacted the IRS. Speaking with an IRS representative, the victim was informed that somebody had already filed their taxes in March. The IRS representative then informed the victim that the suspect was using their personally identifiable information to obtain employment and report their income. The victim advised the deputy that earlier this month, they had also received a phone call from a loan company about trying to obtain a loan. The victim then reported that they believed their computer was hacked in 2025, which gave the suspect access to the victim's information. The victim notified their bank, credit bureaus, and the Federal Trade Commission regarding the identity theft. At this time, no money has been lost due to the identity theft.

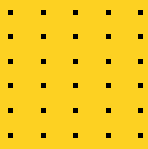
DUI

Wawa | 105 Garrisonville Road | A deputy observed a suspicious vehicle. Upon making contact, the deputy noticed the driver was asleep with the car in drive. After the car was parked, the deputy also noticed alcoholic beverages in the vehicle. The driver also displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech and glassy eyes. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and drinking while operating a motor vehicle.

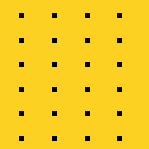
PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Walmart Neighborhood Market | North Stafford Complex | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect was stumbling around and falling on the ground. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, the inability to stand, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day and was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Home Depot | 305 Worth Avenue | A deputy responded to a disturbance at the nearby Home Depot. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and glassy eyes. The suspect claimed that they were involved in an altercation. After speaking with the other parties involved, it was determined that the suspect had lied about the altercation. Additionally, the suspect then admitted to stealing a tool kit from the Home Depot. The suspect was subsequently arrested, identified, and charged with public intoxication, concealment, and filing a false police report.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported that they received a phone call from the suspect claiming to be from Navy Federal Credit Union about fraudulent activity. The victim verified important account information to the suspect before receiving an alert about their password being changed. The victim questioned the suspect, who stated that they were securing the account. The call suddenly ended, and the victim contacted the legitimate Navy Federal Credit Union, which advised the victim of the scam. The victim then noticed several fraudulent transactions appear on their account. The victim notified their bank, which froze the account.
