WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

20 Plantation Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen tip jar. Employees reported that the suspects entered the store, distracted an employee, and stole the tip jar from the counter before exiting. Camera footage confirmed that the suspects glanced around the restaurant before speaking with an employee. Once the employee left the counter, the suspects were seen running out of the store with the tip jar. The deputy gave employees his contact information just in case the suspects return or are seen in the area.

DUI

South Gateway Drive and Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically in the area. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol earlier in the day and had an open alcoholic beverage in the vehicle's cupholder. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, drinking while operating a motor vehicle, and a traffic violation.

Wawa | 830 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated driver report. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect was wanted out of Fredericksburg. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, a lack of balance, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. Field sobriety tests were administered, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving without a license, driving with a revoked license, and driving with an expired inspection, along with being served on her outstanding warrants.

BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Caisson Road | A deputy responded to a suspicious vehicle report in the area. Information was provided that an unknown vehicle had entered a private driveway and broken the residence's gate. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day and breaking the gate. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and felony destruction of property.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Jefferson Avenue | A deputy responded to an unresponsive male in the nearby woods. Information was provided that the suspect would not wake up and have an alcoholic beverage next to them. Upon arriving on scene, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. A THC vape wrapper was later found on the suspect's person. While en route to the Magistrate's office, the suspect admitted to taking a nap after smoking marijuana and then threatened the deputy. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Chatham Bridge | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report in the area. Information was provided that there was a suspect lying on Chatham Bridge. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. Two bottles of alcohol were later found in the suspect's backpack. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

CHARLIE ZONE

FRAUD

Courthouse Road | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. The victim reported that when making a payment, they noticed several unauthorized transactions originating in Florida on their account. The victim contacted the businesses where the unauthorized transactions happened and received information regarding the suspect. The victim then forwarded this information to our deputies.

LARCENY

CVS | 2614 Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect entered the store, selected cosmetic items, and passed all points of sale without paying. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect placed several cosmetic items in their bag and then left the store on foot without paying. No suspects have been identified at this time.

DUI

Chik-Fil-A | 30 Wyche Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated driver report. Information was provided that the suspect was driving on the sidewalk. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. More alcoholic beverages were later found in the suspect's vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

George Mason Road | The Stafford County Sheriff's Office Street Crimes Unit received information regarding a wanted individual in the area. The suspect was observed getting into a vehicle with a second individual. Upon making contact, a deputy made contact with the wanted suspect and detained them for their active warrant. The wanted suspect admitted to purchasing narcotics from the second individual. Additional narcotics and drug paraphernalia were later found on the wanted suspect. A search of the second individual's person and vehicle revealed several more narcotics and a firearm. The second individual was subsequently arrested. The wanted suspect was identified and charged with three counts of possession of Schedule I/II substances, probation violation, and served on her outstanding warrant. The second individual was identified and charged with two counts of possession with the intent to distribute, two counts of distribution of a controlled substance, and two counts of possession of a firearm while distributing narcotics.

WARRANT SERVICES

Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon investigation, it was revealed that the driver was wanted out of Fairfax County. The driver also had a suspended license and was subsequently arrested. The driver was identified and charged with failure to maintain lane and driving with a suspended license, along with being served on his outstanding warrant.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Windsong Way and Stefaniga Road | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver admitted to being on their phone while driving. The driver initially denied any alcohol consumption that day but later changed their story. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. Due to there being a child in the passenger seat, additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, abuse and neglect of children, holding a phone while operating a vehicle, and a traffic lane violation.

Mountain View Road | Deputies responded to an auto accident in the area. Upon arriving on scene, a deputy observed a telephone pole that had been hit and had fallen over. Upon making contact with the driver, they displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Parkway Boulevard | A deputy observed a suspicious person in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, an unsteady balance, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested and identified. He was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Wonder Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was stumbling around outside the Mary Washington Healthcare Center. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, the inability to stand, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. A partially consumed alcoholic beverage and marijuana were later found on their persons. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

FRAUD

Saint Georges Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft. The victim reported that when claiming their child on their taxes, the forms were rejected because the child's personal identifiable information had already been used. The victim had then notified the IRS and FTC. The deputy advised that the victim check their credit reports and monitor their bank account for suspicious activity. There was no reported monetary loss.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported receiving an email from the suspect claiming to be a school principal. The email stated that the principal's family was holding an estate sale. The victim contacted the suspect to purchase two vehicles and sent funds for a deposit. The suspect then refused to allow the victim to see the vehicles and obtain a Carfax report before paying the full amount. The victim subsequently sent the full payment. The victim contacted the principal, who confirmed their email had been compromised and that the estate sale was a scam. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported receiving a phone call from their bank regarding a fraudulent LLC application in Charlotte, North Carolina. The bank reported that the suspect had access to the victim's driver's license number and had attempted to file an application. A fraud alert was placed on the victim's account, and they were advised to notify the appropriate agencies: DMV, SSA, and FTC.

Victim reported receiving a phone call claiming to be from the Atlantic Union Bank's Fraud Department. The suspects claimed that there was suspicious activity on the victim's account and instructed the victim to transfer funds to a separate bank account. After the funds were sent, the victim notified the bank, which was unable to stop the transfer.

Victim reported that the suspect contacted them through FaceTime and claimed the victim had won money, a new car, and a bonus. The suspects then instructed the victim to purchase a prepaid gift card. The victim then hung up, but the suspects continued to contact them. The suspects instructed the victim to put a reduced amount onto the prepaid gift card, to which the victim agreed. The suspects continued to reassure the victim that it was not a scam despite hesitation from the victim. After the victim sent the gift card information, the suspects advised the victim that they would be at the victim's residence in one hour. When the suspects called the victim back, they claimed they were stuck at the FIDC and that the victim needed to pay a substantial tax to receive their prize. The victim then stopped all contact with the suspects, despite several other attempts.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
