WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

Wawa | 830 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance. Information was provided that the suspect had stolen from the store previously and had been rude to employees. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect entered the store, selected two items, but scanned only one at the self-checkout before passing all points of sale without paying for the additional item. An initial investigation confirmed that the suspect stole from the same Wawa on April 22, 2026. Units relocated to the suspect's residence, where the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with two counts of petit larceny.

STOLEN PROPERTY

535 Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a vehicle with a stolen license plate at the nearby Shell. Upon making contact, the suspect claimed that the license plate had been put there when they retrieved the vehicle from a tow yard. An initial investigation also revealed that the suspect had a suspended license. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with possession of stolen property and driving on a suspended license. The stolen license plate was removed from the vehicle, and the vehicle was towed.

WARRANT SERVICES

Kelley Road | A deputy observed a wanted individual in the area. Information was provided by the Fredericksburg Police Department that the suspect was wanted for grand larceny and obtaining money by false pretenses. Upon making contact, the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and served on his outstanding warrants and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

DUI

17 Commuter Lot | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and the driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and a traffic lane violation.

Stony Hill Drive | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the suspect's vehicle had overturned and was blocking the roadway. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. Several alcoholic beverages were later found inside the vehicle. An investigation into the vehicle found that the registration had expired and the vehicle lacked insurance. The suspect reported that the vehicle was not theirs. After contacting the registered owner of the vehicle, it was revealed that the suspect was not authorized to drive it. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, unauthorized use of a vehicle, driving with an expired registration, driving without insurance, and reckless driving.

BRAVO ZONE

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Cambridge Street | A deputy observed a suspicious vehicle driving in the area and conducted a traffic stop. The deputy noticed the vehicle displayed an expired registration sticker and an expired inspection sticker. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect's license was revoked and that the vehicle was not in the DMV database. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with driving after forfeiture of license, driving with a revoked license, failing to obtain vehicle registration and title, and driving with an expired rejection sticker.

WEAPONS

Butler Road and Cambridge Street | A deputy responded to a reckless driving report in the area. Information was provided that there were two vehicles involved, and the suspect had threatened the victim with a firearm. Upon making contact with both parties, the suspect claimed that the victim was driving aggressively and that the suspect had moved their firearm onto the dashboard for safety. The victim then reported that the suspect had been driving aggressively before the suspect pointed the firearm at the victim and threatened them. Dispatch confirmed hearing the threat while on the line with the victim. The deputy observed the firearm in the suspect's vehicle, and the suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with brandishing a firearm.

DUI

Kings Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. Several open alcoholic beverages were observed inside the driver's vehicle. The driver refused the field sobriety tests and was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving after forfeiture of license, and refusal to test.

WARRANT SERVICES

430 Kings Highway | A deputy observed a wanted individual at the Fredericksburg Motor Sports. The suspect was subsequently arrested. After conducting a search of the suspect, a bag with white powdery residue and drug paraphernalia was found on their person. The suspect was identified and charged with possession of a controlled substance and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

CHARLIE ZONE

PURSUIT

195 Highway | A deputy observed two vehicles racing at a high rate of speed and initiated a traffic stop. Only one of the suspects stopped, and the deputy observed the driver switch seats with the passenger. The suspect was subsequently arrested. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect was wanted out of Prince William County and Stafford County. The suspect was identified and charged with obstructing justice, driving with a revoked license, and reckless driving, along with being served on his outstanding warrants.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

1947 Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report at the nearby 7-11. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. An alcoholic beverage was found next to where the suspect was located. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, an unsteady balance, and slurred speech. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

FRAUD

Aquia Bay | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding a forged check. The victim reported that they had mailed a check to their credit card company, but the business never received the payment. The victim then noticed that the check had been forged and deposited into a separate bank account. The victim notified their bank, which launched a fraud investigation.

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

101 Hospital Center Boulevard | A deputy responded to a reckless driving report. Information was provided that the suspect had almost caused several collisions while driving and was now parked at the Stafford Hospital Center. Upon making contact, the suspect denied driving and refused to provide any information. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect's license was revoked. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect was driving recklessly and had almost caused a collision on Jefferson Davis Highway. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with reckless driving and driving with a revoked license.

DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

105 Tech Parkway | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen tire. The victim reported that after work, they noticed a yellow jack underneath their vehicle, and one of the tires was missing. There were no cameras pointed toward the incident. No suspects have been identified at this time.

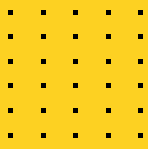
PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Red Roof Inn | 153 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a report of a person asleep on the curb. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier in the day. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with public intoxication.

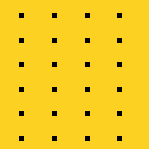
Hardees | 20 Prosperity Lane | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech and an unsteady balance. An alcoholic beverage was later found on the suspect's person. En route to the Magistrate's office, the suspect admitted to consuming two bottles of alcohol earlier that day and threatened the deputy. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Ramoth Church Road and Dog Patch Lane | A deputy observed a vehicle with expired registration tags and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the suspect exhibited suspicious behavior before admitting to using narcotics and having illegal items in the vehicle. The suspect was then asked to exit the vehicle and speak with another deputy on-site. During this interaction, the suspect became upset and attempted to flee. While being detained by deputies, the suspect resisted arrest and attempted to pull deputies tasers from their holsters. A deputy redirected the suspect's hand, but the suspect grabbed the deputy's radio and tried to rip the microphone cord. Before finally being detained, the suspect also managed to bite a deputy's right pinky finger. Deputies were able to gain control of the suspect and place them inside a patrol vehicle without further incident. Inside the suspect's vehicle, several pieces of drug paraphernalia and narcotics were found. All narcotics and drug paraphernalia were submitted as evidence. The suspect was identified and charged with possession of Schedule I or II controlled substances, obstructing justice, two counts of attempting to disarm a law enforcement officer, and assault and battery of a law enforcement officer. Blackburn was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported that they received a call from the Sheriff's Office non-emergency number, and the suspects claimed to be a captain with the agency. The suspects claimed that the victim had missed jury duty and was required to appear in federal court. The suspects then instructed the victim to withdraw funds and deposit them into Bitcoin through a QR code. After the transfer was complete, the victim recognized it was a scam. No suspects have been identified at this time.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
