WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



APRIL 6TH – APRIL 12TH 2026

ALPHA ZONE

DUI

Quarles Road. Deputies were preparing to perform a warrant service and protective order on the suspect when they observed the suspect driving the victim's vehicle. Attempting to initiate a traffic stop, the suspect accelerated before stopping at the victim's residence. The suspect was instructed to get on the ground, but instead initiated a foot pursuit. The suspect was subsequently arrested despite attempts to resist. The suspect then made several derogatory statements toward the deputies. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then began kicking and threatening deputies before being secured in a cruiser. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect's blood alcohol content was determined to be above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with unauthorized use of a vehicle, obstructing justice, assault and battery of a police officer, driving under the influence, eluding police, and violating a protective order.

LARCENY

Baldwin Drive. A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding an unpaid item. The victim reported that they were selling an item on Facebook Marketplace when the suspect contacted them to purchase it. The suspect requested to pay in person at the victim's residence, which the victim agreed. Upon arrival, the suspect's partner completed the transaction, but the payment was never received. The suspects then left the residence and did not respond to further contact with the victim. No suspects have been identified at this time.

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

626 Warrenton Road. A deputy observed a suspicious vehicle at the nearby Wawa. The suspect had been parked at the Wawa for an extended period of time before another vehicle pulled up to exchange something with the suspect. An initial investigation of the suspect displayed an expired registration and improper display. The suspect then drove onto Warrenton Road and ran a red light, leading the deputy to conduct a traffic stop. After the vehicle stopped at the nearby Shell, the suspect became argumentative and would not comply with directions. The suspect claimed the vehicle wasn't theirs. Due to the suspect's suspicious activity, deputies attempted to detain the suspect, but the suspect immediately began resisting. The suspect attempted to pull their arms away and began yelling at deputies. Once secured in the cruiser, the suspect was transported to the Magistrate's Office. The suspect was identified and charged with obstructing justice, driving without a title, driving without insurance, and improper display of his license plate.

BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

Potomac Creek Drive. A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding stolen license plates. The victim reported that they noticed both plates were missing when selling the vehicle. The deputy advised the victim go to the DMV and cancel the tags. The plates were entered as stolen.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Ridgemore Circle. Deputies responded to a disturbance in the area. Upon arriving on scene, the suspects displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The suspects were subsequently arrested. The suspects then began yelling several profanities at the units on scene. While searching the first suspect, a bag containing a white powdery substance was found on their person. The first suspect then attempted to bribe a deputy to lie to their probation officer. The first suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication, possession of a Schedule I/II controlled substance, and bribery of an officer. The second suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication. The white powdery substance was submitted as evidence.

Ralph Williams Drive and Stafford Indians Lane. A deputy responded to a suspicious person report. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy observed the suspect in the bushes with no clothes on. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and the inability to stand up. The suspect was subsequently arrested. While being transported to the Magistrate's Office, the suspect began kicking the cruiser's windows and ceiling. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

WARRANT SERVICE

175 Cambridge Street. A deputy responded to assist with a warrant service. The deputy observed a suspicious vehicle at the Falmouth Shopping Center, and an initial investigation revealed that the suspect was wanted for a felony probation violation. Upon making contact, the suspect was subsequently arrested. Multiple pieces of drug paraphernalia and narcotics were later found inside the suspect's vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with felony possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor possession of a controlled substance, along with being served on her warrant.

CHARLIE ZONE

LARCENY

Wendy's | 145 Garrisonville Road. A deputy responded to a larceny report. The victims reported they had left their purse at the restaurant, and when they retrieved it, they discovered the cash had been taken. Camera footage showed that an employee had taken the purse into the bathroom before putting it in the back office. The employee was subsequently arrested. The employee was identified and charged with petit larceny.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

3817 Richmond Highway. A deputy observed an individual stumbling on Route 1. Attempting to make contact, the deputy then observed the individual attempt to flee and deny requests to stop. The now "suspect" was then detained at Spring Lake Motel. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, an unsteady balance, and glassy eyes. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

7-11 | 1947 Richmond Highway. A deputy responded to an indecent exposure report. Employees from the store reported that the suspect was standing around without any clothes on. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy made contact with the suspect, who had been detained. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The suspect was charged with indecent exposure and public intoxication and held without bond.

7-11 | Tracey Street and Draper Circle. A deputy responded to a disturbance. Upon making contact at, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glossy eyes, slurred speech, and an erratic recollection of the day's events. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Woodstock Lane and Telegraph Road. A deputy observed a vehicle driving above the posted speed limit. As the deputy attempted a traffic stop, the suspect accelerated to a high rate of speed and fled the area. A deputy then observed the vehicle on Garrisonville Road and conducted a traffic stop. Two suspects were subsequently detained. The deputy made contact with the driver, who claimed they had got scared and then fled the area. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect did not have a valid driver's license, updated registration, or insurance on the vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with eluding police and reckless driving, along with driving without a license, expired registration, and no insurance.

DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

Target | 1090 Stafford Marketplace. Deputies responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that two suspects at the store had been caught shoplifting two days prior. In the first incident, the suspects reportedly put clothing items at the bottom of their cart before grabbing grocery items as well. Then at checkout, the suspects scanned only the grocery items and passed all points of sale without attempting to pay for the clothing items. During the second incident, the loss prevention team identified that the suspects had attempted to do the same with cosmetic items. The deputies stopped the suspects before they could exit the store. The suspects were identified and given two summonses with a set court date, along with being trespassed from Target.

DUI

General Chambliss Way. A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the suspect had struck two parked vehicles and rolled over. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glossy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol right before deputies arrived. A field sobriety test was administered, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample confirmed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

201 Garrisonville Road. Deputies responded to an intoxicated driver report at the nearby 7-11. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, bloodshot eyes, and slurred speech. Information was provided that the suspect had been yelling and had consumed alcohol before driving to an adjacent parking lot. The suspect refused a field sobriety test, along with the breath sample, and was subsequently arrested. On the transport to the Sheriff's Office, the suspect made several threatening comments toward the deputy. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect refused a second breath sample. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and refusal to test.

VANDALISM

Bristol Court. Deputies responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported that a glass sliding door at their residence was damaged the night before. The victim could not identify a suspect, and there were no cameras pointed toward the scene.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported receiving an alert from Apple regarding a fraudulent charge. The victim provided their bank account information to the suspect and gave remote access to their iPad. The suspect claimed that the victim was in financial trouble due to the fraudulent charges and instructed them to purchase gift cards to verify their identity. After sending the initial gift cards, the victims became suspicious when the suspect asked for additional gift cards. Deputies arrived while the victim was still on the phone with the suspect. The victim continued to receive several phone calls from suspects claiming to be from their bank. The deputy advised that they disconnect from the calls as it was part of the ongoing scam. Victim was advised to contact their legitimate banks and cancel all compromised cards, along with changing all important information for their accounts.

Victim reported being contacted by Publishers Clearinghouse about winning money. The suspect included a picture of the award with the victim's name on it, along with providing paperwork to receive it. The suspects then instructed the victim to purchase gift cards to cover fees. After the initial gift cards were sent, the victim recognized the scam and contacted the Sheriff's Office, who advised the victim to stop all communication with the suspects and notify their bank.

Victim reported receiving a phone call informing them that their bank account information had been compromised. The suspect then instructed the victim to create a Bitcoin account to verify their identity. The victim hung up, but when attempting to make additional calls, it appeared the suspect had control of the victim's phone and could download digital banking apps remotely. The deputy advised the victim to go to their bank and close all accounts.

Victim reported that they had mailed a check on their way to go shopping. When at checkout, their card declined, leading the victim to review their statements. The victim then noticed that their payment never went through and that the check had been stolen and altered. The victim notified their bank and filed a police report to begin the investigation.

Victim reported receiving a phone call from the suspect about raising the victim's credit. The suspect claimed that the victim could raise their credit score by depositing a fraudulent check and then reimbursing the suspect with gift cards. The suspect then sent fraudulent checks to the victim through email. After several deposits and reimbursements, the victim notified their bank of the incident, which alerted the victim to the scam. The bank closed the victim's account and opened a fraud investigation.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
