## WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

# ALPHA ZONE

## **VANDALISM**

Deacon Road, deputy responded to a vandalism. The victim advised his mailbox was "blown up." Neighbors advised they heard a loud boom at approximately 3:00 a.m.

Red Roof Inn, 386 Warrenton Road, deputy responded to a vandalism. The victim advised he recently ended a relationship with a female suspect. She did not take the news well and instead vandalized his vehicle. a warrant for destruction of property was obtained.

## **LARCENY**

7/Seven, 1 Commerce Parkway, deputy responded to a report of someone's "future-so-bright", they had to steal shades. Staff advised a male they are familiar with stole two (2) pairs of sunglasses. The deputy was able to locate the suspect and the stolen shades nearby. The suspect was charged with shoplifting and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail pending his ability to participate in a bond hearing.

## **ASSAULT**

Bellows Avenue, deputy responded to a disturbance. It was discovered a male suspect assaulted his girlfriend and brandished a firearm twice towards two of her friends. Warrants for four (4) counts of brandishing a firearm and one (1) count of assault and battery were obtained.

## **DUI**

3000 block of Warrenton Road, deputy was traveling in the area when he observed a motorcycle traveling at speeds just under 100 MPH. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and the driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to doubling his alcohol intake by having two (2) beers and two (2) shots at a local bar. During their interaction, deputies learned the suspect was carrying a concealed firearm, knife, and brass knuckles without a valid concealed weapons permit. He was charged with driving under the influence, carrying a concealed weapon, and speeding.

## **LARCENY**

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised a female just walked out with a child seat and was fleeing the area in a silver van. The deputy located the suspect vehicle just down the street at Wawa and made contact with the suspect. The suspect, still in possession of the child seat, attempted to use the excuse of diarrhea as a valid reason to commit the larceny. That did not work and she was issued a summons for shoplifting.

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, deputy responded to a shoplifter. Staff advised they stopped a female suspect who had exactly 69 stolen items in her possession. The business received the stolen items back while the suspect received a summons for shoplifting.

# BRAVO ZONE

## **DISTURBANCE**

Clear Spring Lane, deputies responded to a disturbance. An unsupervised party got out of hand and numerous people were fighting in the street. Deputies arrived and separated the parties. As a result, two (2) females were charged with assault and battery by mob, one (1) female was charged with assault and battery by mob and providing a false identity to law enforcement, one (1) female was charged with disorderly conduct, one (1) female was charged with public intoxication, and one (1) male was charged with disorderly conduct and obstruction of justice.

## **DRUGS**

Kings Highway, deputies responded to an unknown problem. The unknown problem was discovered to be a drug problem, for the suspect was "extremely high." The suspect would be found in possession of suspected controlled substances and providing a false identity to deputies. After figuring out his secret identity, it was discovered the suspect had three (3) outstanding warrants. He was served on those warrants and additionally charged with possession of controlled substances, as well as, providing a false identity to law enforcement. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

## **DUI**

Primmer House Road, deputy discovered a small fender bender in the turn lane. The at-fault driver had signs of intoxication. The victim advised the suspect threw a can into a nearby storm drain before the deputy arrived. The can was discovered to be a Four Loko. The driver was charged with driving under the influence 2nd offense within 5 years with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2.

Murphy Express, 450 Kings Highway, deputy was traveling Eastbound on Kings Highway when he observed a vehicle with no tail lights failing to maintain the lane of travel and making questionable driving decisions. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and the driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming multiple cocktails at home before getting behind the wheel. He was charged with driving under the influence.

Intersection of Richmond Highway and Centreport Parkway, deputy was traveling in the area when she observed two (2) vehicles parked in a travel lane. The deputy made contact with both drivers and it was discovered the 1st driver struck a curb and disabled her vehicle. She would then call the 2nd driver to assist her. As noble as his actions were, it was discovered the 2nd driver was under the influence. He would admit to consuming "a couple" Beat Boxes before driving. He was charged with driving under the influence.

## **THREATS**

Edwards Drive, deputy responded to a threat report. The juvenile victim received threats to her life through Instagram. The deputy was able to identify the juvenile suspect and obtained a criminal complaint for threats of death.

# CHARLIE ZONE

## **PUBLIC INTOXICATION**

Brittany Manor Way, deputy responded to a public intoxication call. It was advised an intoxicated female was walking down the roadway. The deputy located the suspect lying on the ground listening to the "Mulan" soundtrack. 'This Girl Worth Fighting For' had signs of intoxication and admitted to being "not sober." She was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

## **WEAPON OFFENSE**

Area of Richmond Highway and Washington Drive, deputy responded to a weapon offense. The victim advised they were involved in a road rage incident in the area when the suspect brandished a firearm. The suspect was described as a black male in his mid to late 20s with short black hair and a Taurus firearm.

## **DUI**

Fas Mart, 2142 Richmond Highway, deputy was traveling in the area when he observed a vehicle with an expired registration. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the driver, who not only had multiple traffic-related offenses but had signs of intoxication. He was charged with driving under the influence, driving without insurance, driving a vehicle with an open title, driving without a license, having an expired registration, and having an expired state inspection. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

## **FRAUD**

Papa Johns, 2769 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to a report of someone trying to con "Papa" out of pizzas. Staff advised a male suspect attempted to pay for his order with a poorly made counterfeit bill. When staff informed the suspect that they knew the bill was fake, the suspect attempted to pay with three (3) additional counterfeit bills. Again, his "dough" wasn't good enough for their dough.

## **LARCENY**

Decatur Road, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised her vehicle was broken into overnight and a number of items were taken, including a PlayStation 5, numerous high-priced shoes, and valuable hats.

## **VANDALISM**

Wind Ridge Drive, deputy responded to a vandalism. The victim advised an ex-lover unlawfully entered her residence and damaged two (2) televisions. Warrants for destruction of property and unlawful entry were obtained.

## **WARRANT SERVED**

Wawa, 860 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to a service request. The Fredericksburg Police Department had warrants for felony attempted malicious wounding, destruction of property, and aggressive driving to injure for a 32-year-old Stafford man. While the deputy couldn't locate the suspect at his residence, she would observe him at the Wawa. With the assistance of additional first responders, the suspect was detained. In his possession were stolen credit cards. The suspect was served on his outstanding warrants and additionally charged with four counts of credit card theft and larceny. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



# DELTA ZONE

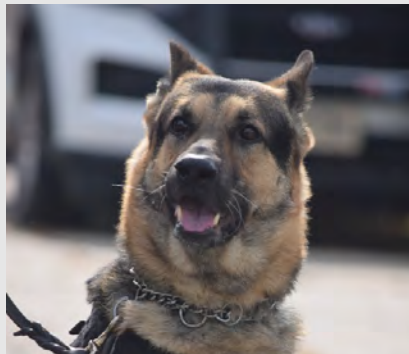
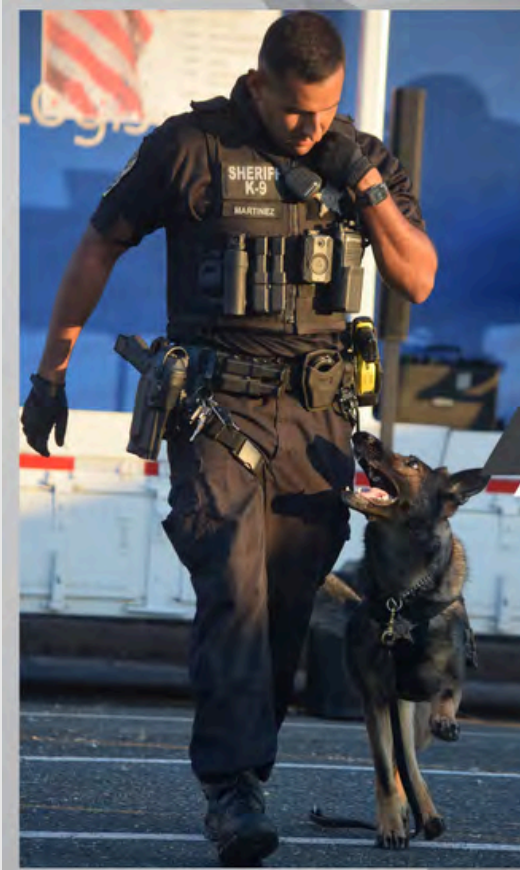
## LARCENY

Buffalo Mo's, 33 Wicomico Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised his toolbox and tools were stolen from his vehicle.

ABC, 50 North Stafford Complex Center, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised a male suspect requested to use the business's phone to call his mom. While he would return the phone, he wouldn't return the Crown Royal hidden in his jacket. At approximately 9:59 p.m. deputies responded to a public intoxication call and discovered the suspect was one in the same as the larceny suspect. Magically, the Crown Royal was gone and the suspect had signs of intoxication. He was charged with larceny, underage possession of alcohol, and public intoxication.

## THREATS

Riverton Drive, deputy responded to a threat call. The victim was scammed during a Facebook Marketplace transaction. When the victim confronted the suspect, the suspect made threatening statements, including sending a picture of a gun stating "I'm coming tonight." The suspect did not show up; however, the deputy was able to identify the suspect and obtained a warrant for threats of death.





# SCAM-AWARE



**Victim** reported that he attempted to purchase a vehicle listed on Facebook Marketplace and sent a \$300.00 deposit using Cash App. The seller, identified as "Connor McBowlen," requested this amount to hold the vehicle due to multiple offers. The seller refused to provide an address for vehicle pickup before the deposit was sent. After sending the deposit, the seller ceased responding to the victim's messages.

**Victim** received a call from someone identifying themselves as "Lt. Jeffery Jenkins" with the "Sheriff's Office" and informed the victim that she had missed court. The suspect then advised the victim that she would need to pay \$420 dollars to him in order for her to not be arrested. The suspect then provided the victim with directions to go to Dollar General and buy a gift card. "Lt. Jeffery Jenkins" stayed on the phone throughout the whole process instructing the victim that only she could purchase the cards. After purchasing the gift card, the victim was then instructed to drive to the Sheriff's Office. Once she arrived at the Sheriff's Office "Lt. Jeffery Jenkins" advised the victim once she provided him the code to the gift card he would give her an access code to enter the Sheriff's Office. The victim provided the information and was advised that the Lieutenant would be out to see her shortly so she could sign some paperwork. After waiting for several minutes, the victim realized she had just been scammed.

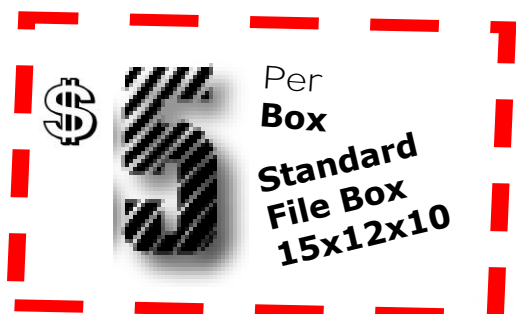

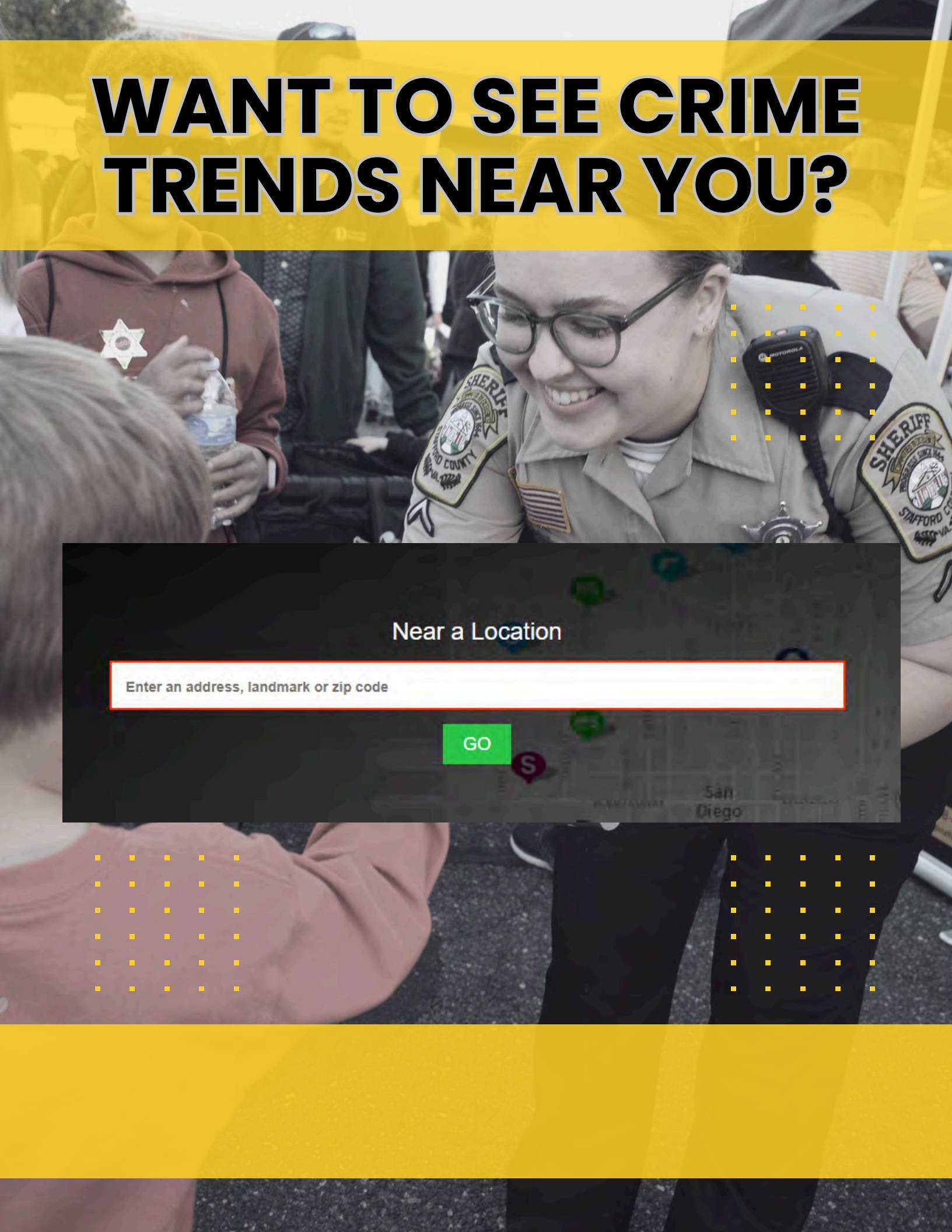
