WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

Southbound I-95/Mile Marker 136. A deputy conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle in this area due to the registered owner returning as a wanted subject. The deputy identified the driver, who was confirmed to be wanted on an outstanding warrant from Spotsylvania. He was taken into custody. And during a search of his vehicle, marijuana and a drug scale were located. He was charged with possession with the intent to distribute marijuana.

DUI

Bearded Monkey, 564 Warrenton Road. A deputy responded to the business for an assist Fire and Rescue call. The deputy was directed towards a red pick-up truck that was actively running. The deputy made contact with the driver of the truck and observed signs of intoxication, including unsteadiness on his feet and an odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence.



BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway. A deputy responded to the business for a shoplifting incident. Loss Prevention advised that a female concealed multiple items and left the store past all points of sale without paying. A description was provided of the female, and the deputy located the female in the parking lot and recovered the stolen items. The female was identified and arrested for shoplifting.

Town and Country Drive. A deputy handled a larceny complaint. The victim reported that they had previously shipped a package that had since gone missing. The victim advised that they believe the package was stolen in transit.



CHARLIE ZONE

TRESPASSING

Wawa, 72 Austin Park Drive. A deputy responded to the business for a reported a trespass. A description was provided for the trespasser. The deputy was aware that the business had previous issues with the subject trespassing, and matched the suspect description provided. On scene, the deputy located the subject, and the deputy verified that he had previously been trespassed from the business. He was arrested and charged with trespassing and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

FRAUD

Granville Drive. A deputy handled a fraud complaint. The victim advised that someone used their personal information for a fraudulent IRS filing.

WEAPONS

White Pine Circle. A deputy responded to this area due to a road rage incident where a driver allegedly pointed a gun at another driver. A suspect description and suspect vehicle description were provided. The deputy located the suspect vehicle, and a high-risk traffic stop was conducted. The driver of the vehicle matched the description provided for the suspect. A black semi-automatic firearm was found in the center console, which also matched the description of the firearm used. The driver was identified and charged with brandishing a firearm.

PURSUIT

Richmond Highway/Corporate Drive. A deputy observed a vehicle traveling 68 mph in the posted 45 mph zone. The deputy caught up to the suspect vehicle and attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The vehicle continued to travel on Richmond Highway and would not pull over despite the deputy being directly behind the suspect with emergency lights and siren activated. The suspect vehicle briefly stopped at the traffic light at Telegraph Road, but immediately continued without stopping for the deputy. An additional deputy arrived on scene to assist, and between the two patrol vehicles, they were able to get the suspect vehicle slowed and stopped. The driver of the suspect vehicle was immediately taken into custody. The driver was identified and charged with misdemeanor eluding and reckless driving and was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

Publix, 1630 Publix Way. A deputy responded to the business for two past-occurred shoplifting incidents. The business advised that on February 4th and February 5th, the subject concealed merchandise and left without paying for the items. The subject was already known to law enforcement due to being arrested for a separate larceny earlier in the day. The deputy confirmed the identity of the suspect and obtained two warrants for shoplifting. The deputy served the warrant to the identified suspect, who was already being held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail.

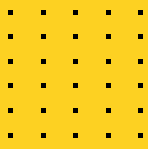
DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Buffalo Moe's, 33 Wicomico Drive. A deputy responded to the business for a fight-in-progress call. Upon arriving at the scene, the deputy observed another deputy attempting to take the subject into custody. The deputies were able to get the subject under control and placed them into handcuffs. The subject remained combative the entire time. The deputy observed obvious signs of intoxication. The investigation also revealed that during the disturbance inside the establishment, the subject threw a barstool at a security guard. The subject was identified, arrested, and charged with assault and battery, obstruction of justice, and public intoxication.

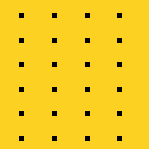
DUI

Neville Court. A deputy responded to this area for a complaint of a vehicle parked in the cul-de-sac with the vehicle lights on. Information was also provided that it appeared the driver was asleep in the vehicle. The deputy located the vehicle and observed the driver asleep inside the vehicle. He was able to wake the driver, and while speaking with the driver, the deputy observed that the driver was mumbling and had glassy, bloodshot eyes. The driver declined to participate in field sobriety tests. The driver refused a breath test, so a blood draw was conducted. The driver was identified and charged with felony driving under the influence, driving revoked, and driving revoked with multiple DUI convictions.





SCAM REPORT



Victim advised that they received a phone call from someone stating that they were with USAA. The subject had details about the victim's bank account. The subject was able to fraudulently wire funds from the victim's bank account.

Victim advised that they were contacted by someone claiming to be with a loan company and convinced the victim to wire funds. The victim later found out that it was not a legitimate loan company.
