WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Royal Farms, 125 Royal Farms Drive. A deputy responded to the business for an intoxicated person complaint. A female at the business was previously unconscious in the bathroom but was found sitting at a table within the business upon the deputy's arrival. While speaking with the female, the deputy observed that the female had glassy eyes, an odor of alcoholic beverages coming from her person, and was unsteady on her feet. The female was taken into custody, identified, and charged with public intoxication and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

FRAUD

Norwood Lane. A deputy responded to a report of suspected identity theft. The victim reported discovering multiple fraudulent activities on his financial accounts over the past several weeks. Unauthorized attempts were made to redeem his hotel rewards points for gift cards, and \$300 was withdrawn from his checking account via an online payment service; both transactions were either stopped or reimbursed. He was subsequently notified that a replacement credit card had been requested and mailed to an unfamiliar name and address in Missouri without his authorization. The shipment was cancelled; the account was frozen.

PURSUIT

Warrenton Road. A deputy stopped in the left turn lane on southbound Warrenton Road at Cambridge Street behind a white Mitsubishi Outlander when the vehicle suddenly changed lanes and proceeded through the intersection onto Butler Road. The deputy attempted to stop the vehicle, but the driver attempted to evade law enforcement, striking four vehicles and causing minor injuries before abandoning the car and fleeing on foot, where he was apprehended. Evidence recovered from the vehicle indicated marijuana use, which the driver later admitted. The driver was identified, arrested, and charged with felony eluding, DUID, 4 counts of hit-and-run, driving on a revoked license, expired registration, and no state inspection. He was held without bond at the Rappahannock Regional Jail.

BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

Town and Country Drive. A deputy handled a larceny complaint. The victim reported that they had previously shipped a package that had since gone missing. The victim advised that they believe the package was stolen in transit.

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway. A deputy responded to the business for a shoplifting incident. Loss Prevention advised that a female concealed several items of merchandise and proceeded past all points of sale. The female was identified and released on a summons for shoplifting.

DRUGS

Fas Mart, 620 Cambridge Street. A deputy initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle for not having an inspection sticker. Before the deputy could approach the vehicle, the driver had gone inside of the store. The deputy located the subject inside the store and identified the driver, whose driver's license was suspended, and he had a previous offense for driving suspended. An inventory search of the vehicle was completed due to the vehicle being towed, and deputies located several suspected controlled substances, drug paraphernalia, and evidence indicative of distribution. Deputies also located a title for a similar, but different vehicle than the one being operated by the suspect. He was arrested and charged with possession of a controlled substance, possession of drug paraphernalia, possession of an open title, no vehicle inspection, no vehicle registration, and driving revoked, and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

PURSUIT

Morton Road/West Ridge Court. A deputy was travelling westbound on Morton Road when a large truck approached at a high rate of speed with both drivers' side wheels in the deputy's lane of travel. The deputy had to swerve to avoid a collision. The deputy activated his emergency equipment and attempted to conduct a traffic stop, but the vehicle refused to pull over. The vehicle continued driving at high speeds until it pulled into a driveway on Slusher Court. Contact was made with the driver who was displaying signs of intoxication to include glassy, bloodshot eyes and a strong odor of alcoholic beverage coming from his person. The deputy also observed two large cans of alcohol sitting in the cupholders of the center console. Once the driver was removed from the vehicle, it was also determined that there was a firearm concealed in the center console. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody. The driver was identified, charged with driving under the influence, driving after illegally consuming alcohol, possessing a concealed weapon while intoxicated, drinking while driving, felony eluding, reckless driving, failure to maintain lane, failure to signal, and underage possession of alcohol. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

CHARLIE ZONE

PURSUIT

Richmond Highway/Corporate Drive. A deputy observed a vehicle passing through radar in his area, travelling 68 mph in the posted 45 mph zone. The deputy caught up to the suspect vehicle and attempted to initiate a traffic stop. The vehicle continued to travel on Richmond Highway and would not pull over despite the deputy driving directly behind the suspect with emergency lights and siren activated. The suspect's vehicle briefly stopped at the traffic light at Telegraph Road, but immediately continued without stopping for the deputy. An additional deputy arrived on scene to assist, and between the two patrol vehicles, they were able to get the suspect vehicle slowed and stopped. The driver of the suspect vehicle was immediately taken into custody. The driver was identified and charged with misdemeanor eluding and reckless driving. She was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

LARCENY

1900 Block of Richmond Highway. A deputy responded to a larceny complaint. The victim advised that several debit cards and cash were stolen from her purse. There was a fraudulent charge made on one of the debit cards.

Mineral Spring Way. A deputy responded to a larceny complaint. The victim advised that vinyl siding had been stolen from a construction site in this area.

DRUGS

Richmond Highway/Telegraph Road. A deputy conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle in this area for failing to maintain the lane of travel. The vehicle was occupied by a female driver and a male passenger. It was determined that the driver was operating the vehicle on a suspended license. Deputies responded to assist with the investigation. A deputy and his K-9 partner conducted a free air scan around the vehicle, which yielded a positive alert for narcotics. During a search of the vehicle, narcotics paraphernalia were located within the vehicle. During a search of the passenger, a glass smoking device containing residue of a controlled substance was located. The driver was identified and released on a summons for driving on a suspended license. The passenger was identified and arrested for possession of a controlled substance. She was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secure bond.

DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

Virginia ABC, 1630 Publix Way. A deputy responded to a shoplifting incident. The business reported that a female concealed several mini bottles of alcohol inside of a bag. The female paid for a separate item at the register but never paid for the concealed mini bottles.

FRAUD

New Brunswick Court. A deputy responded to a fraud complaint. The victim reported that an unknown individual made numerous fraudulent purchases on their credit card. One of the purchases was able to be confirmed to have occurred outside of the state.

Apricot Street. A deputy responded to a complaint of fraud involving the attempted sale of a mausoleum. After advertising the property online, the victim received a \$16,990 check via FedEx from an interested buyer, deposited it, and was advised the funds were available. The buyer then requested \$1,850 be sent to a Wells Fargo account for burial-related expenses, which the victim sent. Shortly after the transfer, the original check was returned as fraudulent and removed from the victim's account. A stop payment was placed on the \$1,850 check.



SCAM REPORT

Victim reported receiving a job offer by email that included a check for over \$4,500, with instructions to keep a portion as wages and wire the remaining funds for equipment. After depositing the check, he wired \$3,000 as directed, but the check was later returned as fraudulent. He immediately notified his bank, which attempted to stop the transfer; however, the funds had already been sent, and a fraud investigation was initiated.

Victim advised they were contacted by individuals claiming to be with law enforcement. The individuals advised the victim that there was a federal arrest warrant for them relating to jury duty. The individuals requested funds to be paid through Apple Pay for the offense.

A local retail store employee expressed concern about an elderly man purchasing large quantities of gift cards and claiming he was in a relationship with Selena Gomez. An investigation revealed that the man had been sending thousands of dollars' worth of gift cards over several years to someone he met through Facebook Messenger, believing the person to be the famous actress. That individual allegedly promised him a vehicle and other benefits, which never materialized. The suspect's identity is currently unknown at this time.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
