

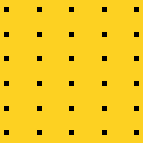

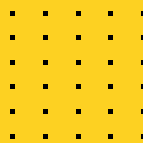
WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE



NARCOTICS VIOLATION

Days Inn Motel, 14 Simpson Road. A deputy responded to this business in an attempt to locate a wanted subject. The deputy had developed information that a subject, who was wanted on a capias out of Prince George, Virginia, was staying at this motel. The deputy located the subject inside of his motel room and taken into custody without incident. Inside of the room in plain view was a plastic baggy containing a white powdery substance consistent with a controlled substance. The subject was served on his outstanding capias warrant and additionally charged with possession of a controlled substance and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond for the narcotics offense and was provided no bond for his outstanding capias.

DUI

Mountain View Market, 1259 Mountain View Road. A deputy responded to the area of 1717 Mountain View Road for a report of debris in the roadway. The deputy located the debris, which was clearly the result of a vehicle striking a couple of mailboxes in this area. Amongst the debris was a license plate to a vehicle. The vehicle the license plate belonged to was located at the Mountain View Market by a deputy, which had damage consistent with previously striking the mailboxes. The deputy responded to the market and made contact with the driver. The driver was displaying clear signs of intoxication. Inside of the driver's vehicle was an open bottle of alcohol. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, drinking while driving, and two counts of hit and run. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

LARCENY

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive. A deputy responded to the business for a shoplifting incident. Loss Prevention was with a female who had been caught taking a large handbag from the store and filling the handbag with additional merchandise. The female was released on a summons for shoplifting.

BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Sheetz, 10 Washington Square Plaza. A deputy was travelling westbound on Kings Highway when he observed a large, lifted truck pull into the parking lot of All Star Pawn and Gold. The deputy proceeded to observe the truck drive over the curb, down the embankment, through the grass, and then over another curb ending up in the Burger King parking lot. The truck continued through the Burger King lot and came to rest at the Sheetz. The deputy made contact with the truck and observed a subject stumble out of the driver's door of the truck. This subject displayed clear signs of intoxication to include bloodshot and glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence with an elevated blood alcohol content and drinking while driving. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under no bond.



CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Staybridge Suites, 2996 Richmond Highway. A deputy was patrolling businesses in this area when he located a male subject who appeared to be urinating by a vehicle in the parking lot. The deputy made contact with the male who had slurred speech, bloodshot and glassy eyes, and an odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. While dealing with the male subject, a female in the driver's seat of the vehicle began to exit. The deputy requested the female to stay in the vehicle and continued with his investigation, making contact with the female driver. He noticed evidence of an alcoholic beverage being freshly poured onto the pavement outside the vehicle. The female also displayed obvious signs of impairment. After administering field sobriety tests, the female was taken into custody. The female was identified and was charged with driving under the influence (with an elevated blood alcohol content), and the male was identified and charged with public intoxication.

VANDALISM

Richmond Hwy. A deputy took a report regarding damage to a vehicle that initially was believed to be a hit-and-run. The reporting party stated his vehicle was parked at the El Gran Charro parking lot and was later found to have significant damage to the front passenger-side quarter panel and hood. Based on the damage pattern and location, the damage was determined to be more consistent with vandalism rather than a vehicle strike. There are no known suspects at this time.

FRAUD

3000 Block Richmond Highway. A deputy responded to a fraud complaint. The victim advised that an unknown person used the victim's personal information to purchase a used vehicle.

LARCENY

Jaffa Court. A deputy responded to a past-occurred larceny. The victim reported that house siding had been stolen from a job site in this area.

DELTA ZONE

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

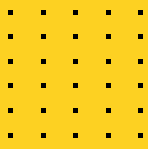
Garrisonville Road. A deputy received a hit on a stolen license plate that was displayed on a vehicle. Once confirmed the license plate was stolen, the deputy initiated a traffic stop. The deputy made contact with the driver and learned there was a firearm concealed within the vehicle. Additionally, the deputy observed a second license plate within the vehicle that had been taken from another vehicle. The deputy confirmed that the driver did not have a valid concealed weapons permit and conducted a search of the vehicle, finding a suspected controlled substance, marijuana, and other evidentiary items indicative of the distribution of marijuana. There was a firearm recovered from the vehicle as well. The driver was arrested and charged with possession of a controlled substance, possession with the intent to distribute marijuana, possession of a firearm while in possession of a controlled substance, carrying a concealed weapon, petit larceny, driving on a suspended license, and not having a valid vehicle registration. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under no bond.

PURSUIT

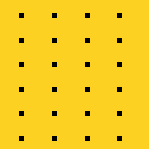
Mine Road Commuter Lot. A deputy was in the area of Garrisonville Road and Salisbury Drive when he heard what appeared to be the sound of squealing tires from the area of the commuter lot. The deputy arrived at the commuter lot and noticed a large amount of smoke in the parking lot and two vehicles that began driving away as the deputy approached. The deputy attempted a traffic stop on one of the vehicles, and the vehicle began to flee at a high rate of speed, and a pursuit was initiated. As the vehicle was fleeing, it ran directly through a red light at Garrisonville Road and Mine Road. The vehicle continued onto Staffordboro Boulevard, including driving on the wrong side of the road. The vehicle ended up striking a curb, causing the vehicle to go down an embankment in the area of Pike Place and Staffordboro Boulevard. The deputy did not initially see anyone flee from the driver's side of the vehicle but had noticed a female in the passenger's seat. The female was detained and provided the deputies with information that a male suspect had fled from the stop. The female passenger, after locating additional evidence supporting that there was only one occupant in the vehicle at the time of the offense, ultimately admitted to being the driver during the pursuit. The female was placed under arrest and charged with felony eluding, failure to obey traffic lights, reckless driving in a parking lot, failure to drive on the right side of the road, window obstruction, possession of false identification, reckless driving – general and driving without a license. She was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under no bond.

DUI

Garrisonville Rd. A deputy observed a vehicle behaving suspiciously in the parking lot of Sheehy Toyota and attempted a traffic stop. The driver failed to promptly stop and continued driving while disregarding a stop sign and struggled to navigate speed bumps before eventually stopping. Upon contact, the driver showed clear signs of impairment and refused to perform field sobriety tests and a breath test. He was charged with DUI and refusal of a chemical test and subsequently held without bond at the Rappahannock Regional Jail following uncooperative behavior during the bond hearing.



SCAM REPORT



Victim was contacted by an individual impersonating her bank about a suspected unauthorized purchase. The caller falsely alleged that a bank employee was stealing her personal information and directed her to withdraw funds for security purposes. The victim complied, withdrawing \$1,300 and loading the money onto a prepaid card at several retail locations while remaining on the phone. After the transactions were completed, the caller admitted to the scam and used profane language before ending the call.

Victim reported receiving several scam phone calls. All of the calls involved an unknown subject asking the victim to purchase Apple gift cards for a certain dollar amount. On one of the calls, the victim was told that they would receive a larger sum of money in exchange for the gift card. The victim disconnected and contacted the Sheriff's Office.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
