WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



JANUARY 26TH – FEBRUARY 1ST 2026

ALPHA ZONE

DUI

McWhirt Loop/Warrenton Road. A deputy responded to this area for a report of a disabled vehicle in the turn lane, causing a hazard. Upon arriving at the scene, the deputy observed a male subject in the driver's seat who appeared asleep. After taking precautionary measures to box in the vehicle, deputies attempted to wake the driver. After multiple attempts, the driver woke up. The driver was displaying signs of intoxication, including slurred speech, glassy and bloodshot eyes, and a strong odor of alcoholic beverages. The subject refused to submit to field sobriety tests and also refused to provide a breath sample. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, stopping on a highway, and refusal to submit to a breath test.

500 Block of Popular Road. A deputy responded to this area for a vehicle accident. Upon arriving at the scene, the deputy located a vehicle upside down in a ditch. The deputy was able to verify that a male and a female on scene were the occupants of the vehicle at the time of the accident. The female initially advised that she was the one driving the vehicle. After further investigation, it was determined that the male was the actual driver of the vehicle. The male was identified and, after administering field sobriety tests, taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond. The female occupant was identified and was released on a summons for obstruction of justice.

LARCENY

Broad Lake Drive. A deputy responded to a larceny complaint. The victim reported that someone had stolen two interior doors from a home that was under construction.



BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Ferry Road/Kings Highway. A deputy responded to this area for a reckless driving complaint. It was advised that a dark-colored Toyota RAV 4 was all over the roadway. A registration for the suspect vehicle was provided, and the deputy was able to locate the vehicle and observed it failing to maintain the lane. The deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle, and the driver was displaying signs of intoxication, including glassy eyes and the odor of alcoholic beverages coming from their person. The driver, who was unsteady on his feet, refused to submit to field sobriety tests and refused to provide a breath sample. Inside the vehicle, there were four empty alcohol containers and one partially empty alcohol container in the center console. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence (2nd offense in 10 years), refusal to submit to a breath test, drinking while driving, reckless driving, and failure to maintain proper control. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

Colemans Mill Road/Leeland Road. Deputies responded to this area for a reckless driving complaint. It was advised that a white truck was doing donuts in the middle of the road. Upon arrival, the deputies located a BMW stopped in the roadway that appeared to have been in an accident. The white pickup was also on scene. Deputies made contact with the drivers of the BMW and the driver of the white truck. The investigation revealed that the white truck had spun out of control, and the BMW struck the truck. The driver of the BMW displayed signs of intoxication. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence while underage, underage possession of alcohol, and driving on a revoked registration. The driver of the truck also displayed signs of intoxication. After administering field sobriety tests, he was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence (2nd offense within five years) and reckless driving.

100 Block Bethel Church Road. A deputy responded to this area for a single-vehicle accident. A pick-up truck was stuck in a ditch and was spinning its tires. The deputy made contact with the driver, who was the only occupant of the truck. The driver had slurred speech, a strong odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person and was unsteady on his feet. The driver was identified and refused to submit to field sobriety tests or a breath sample. He was placed into custody and refused to provide a blood sample. A search warrant was obtained to conduct a blood draw. During this time, he made racial slurs toward a deputy and made threatening statements to another deputy. He resisted having his blood drawn, requiring multiple deputies to restrain him. He was charged with driving under the influence, refusal to provide a breath or blood sample, obstruction of justice, and using abusive language towards another person.

Sheetz, 10 Washington Square Plaza. A deputy responded to the business for a reported accident. It was described as a pick-up truck backing into another vehicle. It was further described that the driver of the truck appeared to be passed out at the wheel. A deputy approached the vehicle and noticed the vehicle still running and in reverse gear. The driver of the truck was slumped over the steering wheel and appeared asleep. The deputy was able to wake the driver, who appeared disoriented. The driver had slurred speech and bloodshot eyes. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was placed under arrest. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence (3rd offense within 10 years).

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Maryanne Avenue. A deputy responded to a reported disturbance in this area. Further information indicated that a subject was intoxicated and asleep inside a vehicle. A deputy arrived and observed a subject asleep in the driver's seat. The deputy also noticed the keys were in the ignition of the vehicle. The deputy observed an unopened can of alcohol in the center console and an empty can of alcohol in the passenger seat. He knocked on the window of the vehicle to wake the driver and ask him to step out of the vehicle. The deputy asked several times for the subject to exit the vehicle, and the subject continued to refuse. The deputy opened the door and immediately detected a strong odor of alcoholic beverages when the subject spoke. The subject had slurred speech and glassy eyes. The subject was able to be extracted from the vehicle and taken into custody. The subject was identified and charged with driving under the influence (2nd offense within 10 years), driving after forfeiture of driver's license, and obstruction of justice. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under no bond.



DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

Kohl's, 1220 Stafford Market Place. A deputy responded to the business for a shoplifting incident. An unknown male subject concealed and stole numerous pieces of jewelry from the store.

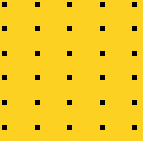
Target, 1090 Stafford Market Place. A deputy responded to the business for several past shoplifting incidents. Loss prevention advised that a female suspect had skipped-scanned items during checkout in eight different incidents between October 2025 and January 19, 2026. During these transactions, the female scanned some items while bagging multiple other items without scanning them. A suspect vehicle and suspect name were developed, and the deputy was able to locate the suspect vehicle and verified that the suspect's vehicle was registered to the same suspect as in the offenses. Additionally, the deputy was able to confirm that the female was responsible for all the previous thefts. The female was identified and charged with eight counts of shoplifting.

DUI

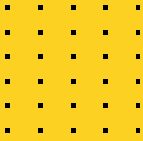
Sterling Court/North Vine Place. A deputy responded to a reported vehicle accident in this area. It was also reported that one of the vehicles had left the scene of the accident. A deputy arrived on scene and assessed the damage to the victim's vehicle. The suspect vehicle was located on Providence Street. The driver of the suspect vehicle was identified and displayed signs of intoxication, including slurred speech, being unsteady on her feet, and having a strong odor of alcoholic beverages. After administering field sobriety tests, she was taken into custody and charged with driving under the influence and felony hit and run.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Providence Street. A deputy was on scene assisting with the accident investigation in this area. While on scene, a male subject tried to speak with one of the parties involved in the investigation. The deputy noted that the male had glassy and bloodshot eyes, was unsteady on his feet, and had a strong odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. The deputy requested the male subject to go inside and not hinder the investigation. Despite this request, the male subject continued to stay outside in his intoxicated state. The subject was taken into custody, identified and charged with public intoxication.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported being contacted by an individual claiming to be affiliated with the Sheriff's Office. The caller advised the victim that there was an active warrant for their arrest due to missing federal court and stated that payment of a specified amount was required to avoid arrest. The victim later received a second call regarding an additional alleged warrant, at which point the victim contacted the Sheriff's Office to report the incident.
