ALPHA ZONE

SHOOTING INTO AN OCCUPIED BUILDING

England Run Apartments. Deputies responded to a shots-fired call in this area. Evidence showed that multiple apartments and apartment buildings were struck by gunfire. Fortunately, no one was injured as a result of the gunfire. This incident is being actively investigated by the Criminal Investigations Division.



BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

Centreport Parkway. A deputy responded to a past-occurred larceny. The victim advised that an unknown person broke into a storage container on the job site and stole tools from the container.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Dollar Tree, 411 Chatham Heights Road. A deputy responded to the business for a disturbance. It was described that a customer in the business was acting erratically. Prior to the deputy's arrival, the customer had left the area on foot, but a description was provided of the subject. Deputies located the subject in the area who was displaying signs of intoxication. This included slurred speech, glassy and bloodshot eyes, and an odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. The subject was taken into custody and charged with public intoxication and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.



CHARLIE ZONE

LARCENY

Sunnyside Nursery, 3357 Richmond Highway. A deputy responded to this location for a past-occurred larceny. The victim reported that an unknown person had stolen a large trailer that was parked on this property.

Executive Circle. A deputy responded to a past-occurred larceny. The victim reported that someone had stolen a package that was delivered to their residence.

2000 Block Courthouse Road. A deputy responded to a past-occurred larceny. The victim reported that they had a package that was delivered stolen. The theft occurred back in mid-December.

CVS, 2614 Richmond Highway. A deputy responded to a shoplifting incident. A subject had stolen merchandise from the store. The subject was allegedly still in the nearby area, but deputies were unable to locate the suspect.

DUI

Den Rich Road/Telegraph Road. A deputy initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle in this area for traveling 61 mph in a 35-mph zone. Upon making contact with the driver, the deputy noted that the driver had glassy eyes, smelled of alcoholic beverages, and empty beer cans were observed within the vehicle. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, drinking while driving, reckless driving, and driving without a license, and held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

3000 Block Richmond Highway. A deputy was travelling on Northbound Richmond Highway when he observed a vehicle in the process of making an illegal U-turn. The deputy got in behind the vehicle and, while they were following the vehicle, also observed the vehicle to be failing to maintain the lane of travel. The deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle and made contact with the driver, noting an odor of smoked marijuana coming from the vehicle. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody and refused to submit to a blood test. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence of drugs, refusal to submit to a breath or blood test, and failure to maintain lane. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under a secured bond.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

McDonald's, 303 Town Center Boulevard. A deputy responded to the business for a subject sitting in a booth and reportedly bleeding from the head. The deputy located the subject and noticed that the subject had injuries to his face. The subject would not state how he received the injuries, and was slurring his speech and had glassy, bloodshot eyes, as well as numerous bottles of alcohol found on his person. The subject was identified and arrested for public intoxication.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Garrisonville Road/Southbound I-95 Entrance. A deputy conducted a traffic stop on a possible intoxicated driver. The vehicle had been observed by the deputy failing to maintain the lane on multiple occasions. The driver of the vehicle was noncompliant and refused to exit the vehicle. With the assistance of other responding deputies, a high-risk stop was initiated. After shedding a layer of clothing, the driver finally exited the vehicle and was detained. After attempting to administer field sobriety tests, the driver was placed under arrest. A search for the vehicle recovered numerous suspected controlled substances within the jacket the suspect had taken off. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, obstruction of justice, possession with the intent to distribute a controlled substance, drinking while driving, and the traffic lane violation. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail under no bond.

Northampton Boulevard. A deputy responded to the area of Northampton Boulevard and Eustace Drive for a vehicle that struck a mailbox and drove up on the sidewalk. The deputy located the suspect's vehicle on Northampton Boulevard and made contact with the driver. The driver displayed signs of intoxication: glassy and bloodshot eyes, slurred speech, and the odor of alcoholic beverages. After administering field sobriety tests, the driver was taken into custody. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence (with an elevated blood alcohol content above .20) and hit-and-run. He was held at the Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

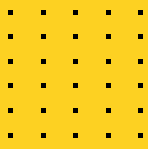
FRAUD

St. Peters Drive. A deputy handled a fraud complaint. A fraudulent account was opened in the victim's name and was used in an attempt to obtain a loan.

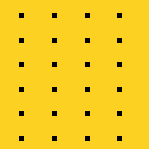
Boulder Drive. A deputy handled a fraud complaint. The victim reported that an unknown person opened a fraudulent student account in their name.

LARCENY

Target, 1090 Stafford Market Place. A deputy responded to the business for a past-occurred shoplifting incident. Loss Prevention advised that on January 8, 2026, a male suspect was seen placing items into a cart, one of those items being a soundbar. At checkout, a female who was with the male subject scanned several items but did not scan the soundbar. Both subjects left the store without paying for the soundbar. Approximately one hour later, the same male suspect comes back into the store and leaves the business with a television that was unpaid for. A suspect vehicle was developed, and further investigation was able to identify a male and female associated with suspect vehicle. A pawn records check showed that they had pawned the soundbar to a local pawn shop on January 8, 2026. The deputy responded to the pawn shop to recover the soundbar and located the suspect inside of the pawn shop actively attempting to pawn the television that was stolen. He was placed into custody. The second suspect was found in the vehicle outside the pawn shop and was also taken into custody. Both were charged with shoplifting and obtaining money by false pretense and released on an unsecured bond.



SCAM REPORT



Victim had been scammed into sending over \$10,000.00 to an unknown individual via a Bitcoin machine located in an Exxon gas station in Spotsylvania County, Virginia.

The victim advised she was at work and received a call that she let roll to voicemail. The message left advised the victim to call as soon as possible and identified himself as “Deputy Chase Young” of the “Stafford County Sheriff’s Department”. The Stafford Sheriff’s Office has no employees named Chase Young. When the victim heard the message, she immediately called back and was advised that she had a warrant for her arrest for missing federal court, and she could avoid being arrested by paying 10% of a \$100,000. She was directed to deposit the money into a Bitcoin machine and was provided with a QR code for the deposits.

After gathering the money, she made two different deposits. One deposit was \$6,269.00, and the second deposit was \$4500.00.

After making the deposits, the victim realized she had been scammed and reported the incident to the Stafford County Sheriff’s Office.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
