WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

NARCOTICS

Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a suspicious vehicle displaying a license plate that belonged to a different vehicle. An initial investigation revealed that the registered owner did not have a license. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and observed three individuals in the vehicle. The driver claimed they had purchased the vehicle from a relative and were working to re-register it. The driver also admitted to having a restricted license. The inspection sticker from the vehicle returned to a 2nd different vehicle. Additional units arrived, and a K-9 alerted to the presence of narcotics near the vehicle. Narcotics were found on the passenger seat floor. The passenger was subsequently arrested. Drug paraphernalia was later found on the passenger's person. The driver was identified and given a summons for improper registration. The passenger was identified and charged with possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance and possession of controlled paraphernalia.



BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Centreport Parkway | A deputy observed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed and swerving across lanes before conducting a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with bloodshot eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver claimed not to have a license and provided a fake name. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was declined. The driver was subsequently arrested, and a search of the driver revealed a driver's license that had the driver's real name. A juvenile was in the back seat, so additional charges were brought forward. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver was identified and declined to provide a breath sample. He was charged with driving under the influence, driving after illegally consuming alcohol, abuse and neglect of children, reckless driving, a traffic lane violation, refusal to test, falsely identifying himself to law enforcement, and an unlawful change of name.

Wawa | 275 Butler Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance. Information was provided that there was a dispute occurring outside. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy observed the suspect shouting at three other individuals. After speaking with all parties, it was determined that the victims had said something to the suspect, who had their dog off leash, and the suspect became angry. The suspect then hit one of the victim's phones out of their hand as they went to call the Sheriff's Office and began threatening them. During the deputy's conversation with the suspect, they displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect declined to participate in the field sobriety tests or to provide a breath sample. The suspect was subsequently arrested. During transport, the suspect made several threatening comments toward the deputy. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, disorderly conduct, obstructing justice, preventing the summoning of law enforcement, assault and battery, simple assault and battery, driving without a license, driving with an expired inspection sticker, and a leash ordinance violation.

WARRANT SERVICES

Falmouth Drive | A deputy responded to a report of a wanted individual in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was wanted out of Spotsylvania County. Upon making contact, the suspect was subsequently arrested. During the arrest, the suspect made threatening statements toward deputies, so additional charges were brought forward. Narcotics were found during a search of the suspect's pockets. The suspect was identified and charged with possession of a Schedule I/II controlled substance and obstruction of justice, as well as being served on his outstanding warrants.

CHARLIE ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Abberly Drive | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was wearing only half of their clothes and did not live in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect was found asleep. After the suspect woke up, they displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and slurred speech. A firearm and narcotics were found on the suspect's person. An initial investigation found that the suspect was a convicted felon. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication, weapon possession by a felon, sexual display, and concealing a weapon while intoxicated.

SUSPICIOUS PERSON

White Pine Circle | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report in the area. The victim reported that the suspect attempted to open the door to their residence, but the victim locked it before the suspect could enter. The suspect attempted to open the door again before leaving the scene. An initial search of the area provided no further information.



DELTA ZONE

DUI

Deshields Court | A deputy responded to a drunk driver report in the area. The deputy observed the vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The driver declined to participate in the field sobriety tests or to provide a breath sample. The driver was subsequently arrested. The driver later admitted to drinking alcohol earlier that day. Alcoholic beverages were found inside the vehicle. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver declined to provide a breath sample, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, refusal to test, failure to wear a seatbelt, and a traffic lane violation.

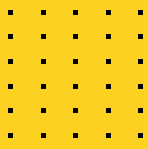
HIT AND RUN

Parkway Boulevard and Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a hit and run. The victim had been traveling eastbound on Route 610 when they were rear-ended by the suspect. The victim reported that after they were hit, the suspect left the scene at a high rate of speed. Witnesses provided additional statements about the vehicle and the accident. A deputy responded to an accident that occurred on Berkshire Drive involving a vehicle that fit the description of the hit-and-run. Upon making contact, the driver admitted to hitting the vehicle on Route 610 while racing. The driver was subsequently arrested. The driver was identified and charged with felony hit-and-run and reckless driving.

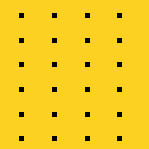
PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Providence Street | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect initially denied drinking alcohol that day, but later changed their story. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Greenspring Drive | A deputy responded to a trespass report in the area. Information was provided that there was a suspect on the property who had an unsteady balance. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy observed the suspect sitting on a curb with an alcoholic beverage near their feet. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and slurred speech. The suspect was subsequently arrested. During transport, the suspect made several threats toward the deputy. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported receiving a call from the suspect claiming that there was a warrant out for the arrest of the victim. The suspect stated that the victim could avoid arrest by paying a fee through Bitcoin. After the funds were sent, the victim contacted the Stafford County Sheriff's Office, which advised them of the scam. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported being alerted that they had won a monetary prize. The suspect then instructed the victim to share their Cash App to secure their winnings, but first the victim had to pay a series of fees. After the victim transferred the funds for the fees, they noticed it was a scam and contacted Cash App. A police report was needed for the investigation.

Victim reported receiving a phone call claiming to be with Citibank. The suspects stated the victim's account had been used to launder money and instructed them to provide personally identifiable information. After the victim recognized the scam, they froze their credit. The victim had not suffered any monetary loss at the time of the report.
