WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

FRAUD

Wallace Farms Lane | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft and unauthorized transactions. The victim reported being notified of suspicious activity on their account, including several unauthorized withdrawals and transfers. The victim then contacted their bank, which advised the victim that the funds had been used to purchase a vehicle in Texas and car insurance in Arizona. The vehicle's paperwork used the victim's personally identifiable information. No suspects have been identified at this time.

DUI

Stafford Lakes Parkway | A deputy responded to a hit-and-run in the area. Information was provided that the suspect had rear-ended the victim before running a red light and fleeing the scene. The suspect's vehicle was found with significant front damage and several opened alcoholic beverages on the floorboards. The suspect was then located sitting on the curb near the vehicle. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance, slurred speech, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. An initial investigation found that the suspect was also wanted out of Spotsylvania County. The suspect declined to participate in field sobriety tests or provide a breath sample. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect again declined to provide a breath sample, so additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with willfully circumventing an ignition interlock system, driving under the influence, driving after forfeiture of license, refusal to test, driving without a title, drinking while operating a motor vehicle, hit-and-run, and driving with a revoked license, along with being served on his outstanding warrants. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

Truslow Road | A deputy responded to a drunk driver report in the area. Information was provided that the driver was unable to maintain their lane before hitting a fence. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The driver admitted to not having insurance. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was refused. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver refused to provide a breath sample, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, refusal to test, and driving without insurance.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

347 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report at Car City. Upon making contact, the suspect was seen sitting on the property with an open bottle of alcohol next to their feet. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and profuse sweating. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

BRAVO ZONE

WEAPONS

Sandy Ridge Road | Deputies responded to a report of a brandished firearm in the area. After speaking with all parties, the suspect admitted to brandishing a firearm in relation to an incident at the residence. The suspect was subsequently arrested. During the initial conversation with the suspect, they displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The suspect was identified and charged with brandishing a firearm and public intoxication.



CHARLIE ZONE

VANDALISM

Brentsmill Drive | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported noticing their vehicle's back window was broken and contacted the Sheriff's Office. The deputy observed the damage to the vehicle. An initial canvass of the area provided no further information.

DUI

Shady Hill Lane and Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to an abandoned motorcycle in the area. After arriving on scene, a vehicle was observed backing up to the motorcycle. After making contact with the driver, it was determined they were there to help pick up the motorcycle. The deputy observed an open bottle of alcohol inside the driver's vehicle. The driver displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was refused. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. An initial investigation also found that the driver's license had been revoked for DUI-related offenses. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving after forfeiture of a license, and drinking while operating a motor vehicle; he was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

Richmond Highway and Bells Hill Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the vehicle had gone off the road and crashed into a ditch. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was declined. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Arla Court | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and incoherent statements. The suspect admitted to drinking alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

WARRANT SERVICES

Fidelity Lane | A deputy observed a suspect wanted out of King George and conducted a traffic stop. The suspect was subsequently arrested. During a search of the suspect, narcotics were found. The suspect admitted to driving without a valid driver's license, so additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance and driving without a license, along with being served on his outstanding warrants; he was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Mine Road and Courthouse Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the suspect had hit the victim while moving into the victim's lane. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to drinking earlier that day. Empty alcoholic beverages were found inside the vehicle. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, drinking while operating a motor vehicle, and a traffic lane violation.

Woodstream Boulevard and Staffordboro Boulevard | A deputy observed a disabled vehicle with its hazard lights on and went to check on it. Upon making contact, the driver was found asleep behind the wheel. Bottles of alcohol could be seen in the passenger seat. After waking up, the driver displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and slurred speech. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

NARCOTICS

20 Sanford Drive | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report at the nearby Holiday Inn. Information was provided that two suspects were stumbling around outside of the building. Upon making contact, one of the suspects displayed signs of impairment, including the inability to stay awake and large pupils. A search of the suspect's backpack revealed narcotics and drug paraphernalia. Both suspects were subsequently arrested. The suspects were identified and charged with two counts of possession of Schedule I or II controlled substances. Damanda was released on an unsecured bond. Beal was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond. The narcotics and paraphernalia were submitted as evidence.

FRAUD

Scotland Circle | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. The victims reported not receiving a credit card statement for months. After further investigation, the victims noticed that an unauthorized check had been cashed and their mailing address had been changed. The victims then notified their bank, which froze the account. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Malvern Lakes Circle | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. The victim reported noticing several unauthorized transactions on their account. The deputy advised the victim to contact their bank and provide copies of the unauthorized transactions for investigation.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported being contacted by their bank regarding unauthorized charges in California. The victim then went to the bank to discuss the charges and was later contacted by the suspect, claiming to be with the FDIC. The suspect stated that they were investigating the victim's bank and instructed the victim to withdraw funds for security reasons. The victim noticed the scam and stopped all contact with the suspect. The victim was then notified that a check they sent to pay for their property tax never arrived. After speaking with their bank, the victim was advised that the check had been altered and cashed. The victim's bank launched an investigation. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported receiving a phone call claiming to be with the Waynesboro Police Department. The suspects stated that the victim failed to appear for jury duty, so there was a warrant out for the arrest of the victim. The suspects then instructed the victim to withdraw funds and transfer them through Bitcoin to avoid arrest. After the funds were transferred, the victim recognized the scam and contacted 9-1-1. A deputy advised the victim to contact their bank and credit unions to freeze their accounts and credit.
