WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

WEAPONS

Warrenton Road | A deputy observed a vehicle with an expired inspection sticker and conducted a traffic stop. An initial investigation into the driver revealed that they were wanted out of Hanover County, as well as being a convicted felon. The driver was subsequently arrested. A firearm and a machete were found inside the vehicle, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with carrying a concealed weapon without a permit and possessing a weapon as a felon, along with being served on his outstanding warrants. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Halite Court and Limestone Way | A deputy responded to a fight in progress. Upon making contact, the parties were separated. One of the suspects displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, an unsteady balance, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect refused police orders and was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

DUI

Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident. Information was provided that the vehicle had hit a fence. Upon making contact, the deputy observed two individuals in an altercation next to the vehicle. After the parties were separated, the driver admitted to consuming alcohol right before driving. An alcoholic beverage was found next to the vehicle. The driver displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance and slurred speech. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The victim had bruises and abrasions on their body, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and assault and battery.

ASSAULT

William J. Howell Library | Lyons Boulevard | A deputy responded to a fight in progress. Upon arriving on scene, the victims reported that the suspect brake-checked the victims and then followed them into the library parking lot. The victims then reported that the suspect confronted them, shoved one of the victims, and punched the other. The suspect then reportedly left the scene. A witness on scene confirmed the recount of events. Upon making contact with the suspect, they admitted to confronting the victims and throwing a punch. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with two counts of assault and battery.

FRAUD

Charter Gate Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. The victim reported that he had noticed suspicious activity on their account earlier in June. The victim then received a phone call from their bank regarding the suspect impersonating the victim. The victim checked their bank account and found different unauthorized transactions. The victim's bank launched a fraud investigation. A police report was needed for the investigation.

BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

VA ABC Store | 43 Town and Country Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Camera footage revealed that the suspect entered the store, placed a bottle of alcohol inside their tote bag, paid for a separate case of alcohol, and passed all points of sale without paying for the stolen item. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Plantation Drive and Adair Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen vehicle. The victim reported that their vehicle was missing from where they last parked it. An initial search of the area provided no further information. The vehicle was entered as stolen.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Ferry Road | Deputies responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was walking unsteadily in the roadway. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.



CHARLIE ZONE

FRAUD

Summerwood Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding multiple stolen checks. The victim reported mailing three separate checks, which never reached their destinations. One of the checks had been altered and cashed. The victim notified their bank, which began an investigation and closed the account. The victim also reported sending a card that contained cash. The card reached its destination, but had been opened, and the cash was removed. No suspects have been identified at this time.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Motel 6 | 2868 Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report. Information was provided that the suspect was looking into people's vehicles. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, an unsteady balance, and slurred speech. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

WARRANT SERVICES

195 | A deputy observed a vehicle with an expired inspection sticker and improperly displaying their license plate. An initial investigation revealed that the registered owner was wanted out of Maryland. A traffic stop was conducted. The passenger in the vehicle was identified as the registered owner and was subsequently arrested. The passenger was identified and charged with fugitive from justice and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

DUI

195 | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver admitted to not having a driver's license. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and driving without a license.

WEAPONS

Jason Lane and Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver advised that they had a firearm inside the vehicle. An initial investigation found that the driver did not have a concealed weapons permit nor a driver's license. The driver was subsequently arrested. The driver was identified and charged with carrying a concealed weapon without a permit, a traffic lane violation, and driving without a license.

DELTA ZONE

FRAUD

Brixham Court | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding an altered check. The victim reported mailing a check to pay their bills, but was then notified by their bank that the check had been cashed for a different amount. The victim's bank launched an investigation.

Eastbrook Court | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding a fraudulent check. The victim reported noticing a fraudulent check on their account, which was a similar amount to a check they had mailed earlier. The victim notified their bank. A police report was needed for investigation.

LARCENY

Pear Blossom Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen license plate. The victim reported that the front license plate had been taken off their vehicle. The victim then notified the DMV. No suspects have been identified at this time.

GNC | 1465 Stafford Marketplace | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect entered the store, selected one item, and then passed all points of sale without paying. No cameras were available to capture the incident. No suspects have been identified at this time.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported that the suspect called their parents and claimed to be with Prince William County law enforcement. The suspect claimed that the victim had been incarcerated and instructed the victim's parents to transfer funds for bail. The victim's parents called the victim, who advised them of the scam. The suspect then stopped all contact with the victim and their family. The victim's family suffered no monetary loss at the time of the report.

Victim reported receiving a phone call while delivering an order for DoorDash. The suspect claimed to be from DoorDash, instructed the victim to cancel the order, and requested information regarding the victim's account so that the victim could still be paid. The victim then noticed an unauthorized transaction on their account. The victim notified the legitimate DoorDash, which advised the victim of the scam and declined the transaction. The victim suffered no monetary loss at the time of the report.
