ALPHA ZONE

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Sheetz | 567 Warrenton Road | Deputy conducted a traffic stop. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect had a DUI-revoked driver's license. It was determined that the suspect had failed to comply with their court order. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving after forfeiture of a license.

DUI

Wyne Drive and Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the driver had driven off the road into the nearby woods. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day and feeling intoxicated. A breath sample was received, and the driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

Cropp Road and Skyline Drive | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the driver had hit a tree while riding a four-wheeler. Upon making contact, the driver became argumentative with deputies. The driver displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech and an unsteady balance. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

Walmart | 11 Village Parkway | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect was walking in front of vehicles and had an unsteady balance. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and slurred speech. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

BRAVO ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Chatham Heights Road and Chatham Lane | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report. Information was provided that the suspect was running through the woods, screaming, and was now lying on the road. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with erratic movements, rapid speech, confusion, and significant sweating. The suspect admitted to using a CBD device earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.



CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

3099 Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle speeding in the area and conducted a traffic stop. The driver initially would not stop, eventually pulling into the nearby Wawa. An initial investigation revealed that the driver had a DUI-revoked license. The driver displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol right before driving. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was refused. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. Open containers of alcohol were later found inside the vehicle. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving after forfeiture of a license, reckless driving, and drinking while operating a motor vehicle.

Eskimo Hill Road and Brooke Road | A deputy responded to a 9-1-1 hang-up in the area. The deputy observed the suspect walking down the road. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and vomit on their clothing. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol. A breath sample was received, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

LARCENY

Dollar General | 1348 Courthouse Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect had stolen several items and then left the scene on foot. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect entered the store, selected several items, concealed them in a yellow vest, and passed all points of sale without paying. No suspects have been identified at this time.

DELTA ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Cabell Road | Deputies responded to a disturbance in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

LARCENY

Grosvenor Lane | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a firearm. The victims reported that they noticed their firearm was missing. No cameras were pointed at the area. The firearm was entered as stolen.

St. Mary's Lane | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen license plate. The victim reported that their license plate had been stolen from their motorcycle, including the bolts. There were no cameras in the area that pointed towards the incident.

DUI

Mine Road and Courthouse Road | Deputies responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the driver had driven off the road into the nearby woods. Upon making contact, the driver admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The driver displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

15 Eustace Road | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. A bottle of alcohol was later found inside the vehicle. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

VANDALISM

Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported that the side of their vehicle had been damaged by a key. There were no cameras in the area and no witnesses who saw the incident.

Barnum Drive | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported that their mailbox had been damaged by a vehicle. Camera footage provided no further information on the suspect.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported sending checks in the mail for their taxes, but was contacted by their bank regarding potential fraud. It was determined that the suspect had stolen one of the checks, altered it, and then cashed it. The victim's bank began a fraud investigation.

Victim reported being notified of a trailer being registered in their name without authorization. The deputy advised the victim to notify their bank and to contact the DMV for investigation.

Victim reported their phone turning white while on a call, and then noticed fraudulent messages posted to their social media account. The victim also noticed several unauthorized transactions and Bitcoin transfers. The victim notified their bank and obtained a new phone.

Victim reported listing an item for sale and being contacted by the suspect. The suspect then requested to pay for the item through Venmo. The victim created a Venmo account but did not see any payment. The suspect then instructed the victim to look for an email claiming to be from Venmo. After finding the email, the victim called the fraudulent customer support line, which advised the victim to send funds to open a business account. After several transfers, the victim notified their legitimate bank of the fraud. The victim has closed their account and changed their information.

Victim reported mailing a check for payment, but noticed it had been cashed by another person. The deputy observed a copy of the check. The victim notified their bank. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported mailing a check for payment earlier this month before receiving a call from their bank. The bank advised the victim that the check had been altered and had been attempted to be cashed. The bank began a fraud investigation.

Victim reported receiving a message on their computer claiming they had been hacked. The victim then called the number provided and was instructed to withdraw funds to save their account. After the victim transferred the funds through Bitcoin, the victim notified their bank, which froze the victim's account. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported that the suspect was attempting to list the victim's property for sale using the victim's personal information and identification. The victim shared copies of the suspect's fraudulent identification with Deputy Buzzard.
