# ALPHA ZONE

## DUI

Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a hit-and-run report in the area. Information was provided that the victim had been rear-ended after stopping at a red light, and the suspect had fled the scene. Meanwhile, another deputy observed the suspect texting and driving and conducted a traffic stop. The suspect's vehicle matched the report's description and displayed significant front-end damage. Upon making contact, the suspect admitted to rear-ending the victim's vehicle. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving without a license, holding a phone while operating a vehicle, driving with an expired inspection, hit-and-run, and failure to obey traffic lights.

## PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Wawa | 9 South Gateway Drive | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, an unsteady balance, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. Information was provided that the suspect had also attempted to strike an employee. Camera footage confirmed the recount of events. Alcoholic beverages were found on the suspect's person. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and simple assault and battery, along with being trespassed from the store.

## LARCENY

Celebrate by Del Webb | 10 Montera Avenue | 6/24 10:30 a.m. | A deputy responded to a vandalism report. Information was provided that employees noticed their shed had been pried open, and several items were missing. No cameras were available in the area to capture the incident.

## ASSAULT

Hidden Brook Drive | A Deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. The victim reported that the suspect had acted hostile towards them. After speaking with both parties, it was determined that the suspect had made derogatory remarks towards the victim and then spat on their face. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with assault and battery.

# BRAVO ZONE

## DUI

McDonald's | 419 Chatham Heights Road | A deputy responded to a report of an individual asleep on their steering wheel. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a drowsy demeanor and an unsteady balance. The deputy observed drug paraphernalia inside the vehicle. The suspect refused field sobriety tests and was subsequently arrested. Weapons, narcotics, and other items were found inside the vehicle. An investigation revealed that the suspect was on probation, so additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with weapon possession by a felon, driving under the influence, and possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance.

Albion Lane and Kings Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle driving at a high rate of speed and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with unsteady hands and dilated pupils. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver refused to test, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, speeding, and refusal to test.

## PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Sheetz | 10 Washington Square Plaza | A deputy responded to a drug activity report and made contact with the suspect and observed a container of CO2 in the suspect's lap. Information was provided that the suspect had tilted their head down and then would go unconscious for a few minutes before abruptly opening their eyes. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with lethargic speech and provided incoherent statements. The suspect was subsequently arrested. A search of the vehicle provided more containers of CO2 and drug paraphernalia. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and inhaling noxious chemical substances.



# CHARLIE ZONE

## FRAUD

Landmark Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding an altered check. The victim reported that they mailed a check for their mortgage payment before being notified that it was never received. The victim then noticed that the check had been altered and placed for a mobile deposit by the suspect. The victim notified their bank, which began an investigation.





# DELTA ZONE

## **DUI**

Lawhorn Road | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was driving a vehicle and threatened to shoot people. The deputy located the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Three suspects were inside the vehicle. Upon making contact, the suspects displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. Field sobriety tests were administered to the driver, but a breath sample was refused. All three suspects were subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the driver refused to provide a breath or blood sample, so additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and refusal to test. The two passengers were identified and were both charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

## **FRAUD**

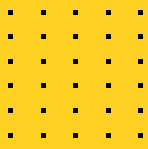
Kinross Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft. The victim reported that multiple lines of credit and credit cards had been opened in their name without authorization. The victim also reported that funds had been removed from their account without authorization. The victim had notified their bank and credit bureaus, which froze the accounts. A police report was needed for the investigation.

## **PUBLIC INTOXICATION**

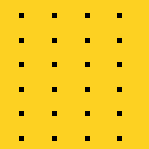
225 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance at the Girlfriend's Taphouse. Information was provided that the suspect was intoxicated, aggressive, and refused to leave. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance, bloodshot eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober, along with being trespassed from the bar.

Quality Inn | 23 Greenspring Drive | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect had been stumbling around and damaging items in the hotel gym. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The deputies observed the damage to the gym equipment and mats. The suspect was identified and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Pancho Villa Mexican Restaurant | 155 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a report of an intoxicated person. Information was provided that the suspect refused to leave the restaurant despite being asked by employees. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and slurred speech. The suspect repeatedly failed to follow police directions and was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober, along with being trespassed from the restaurant.



# SCAM REPORT



**Victim** received a call and the suspect claimed to be with USAA and reported that the victim had fraudulent activity on their account. The suspect then instructed the victim to provide their account information and send a picture of a completed deposit slip to the suspect's email. After the information was provided, the victim recognized the scam. The victim notified their bank, which froze the account. No suspects have been identified at this time.

**Victim** reported buying an item off of Facebook Marketplace before noticing several unauthorized transactions on their bank account. The victim notified their bank, which canceled the card. A police report was needed for the investigation.

**Victim** reported mailing a check to pay for their taxes. The victim was then notified by their bank that the check had been altered and cashed for a separate amount. The deputy assisted the victim with paying their taxes online and advised them how to avoid future scams.
