ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway | A deputy responded to a shoplifting complaint. Loss Prevention advised that they observed a subject placing items into a bag they brought with them. The subject then went to the check-out line and skipped-scanned items using an alternate price tag, while scanning other items. The subject then passed all points of sale to leave before being apprehended by Loss Prevention. The subject was identified, arrested, and charged with shoplifting and altering price tags.

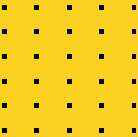
DUI

1600 Block of Poplar Road | A deputy responded to this area for a report of a single-vehicle accident. It was also reported that a female was walking away from the scene of the accident. The deputy located the female and confirmed that she was involved in the accident. The deputy observed signs of impairment while speaking with the suspect and also detected an odor of marijuana coming from the suspect's purse. The suspect was incapable of performing field sobriety tests and was taken into custody for driving under the influence. During a search of the vehicle, the deputy located a small plastic baggie containing a white powdery substance consistent with a controlled substance. The suspect refused to provide a blood sample, and a search warrant was executed to obtain a blood sample. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence 3rd or subsequent offense, driving after forfeiture of license, possession of a controlled substance, hit and run, reckless driving, refusal to submit to a blood sample, and driving under the influence endangering while revoked; she was held in the Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

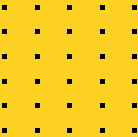
830 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to a report of an individual asleep behind the wheel. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, lethargic behavior, and glassy eyes. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect had a DUI-revoked license. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was refused. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and driving after forfeiture of a license.

VANDALISM

River Acres Lane and Old Banks Drive | A deputy responded to a vandalism report regarding street signs. Information had been provided that a stop sign pole had been cut, street signs were missing, and a speed limit sign was defaced by spray paint. The deputy observed the damage to the signs and notified the Virginia Department of Transportation.



BRAVO ZONE



PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Town and Country Drive | A deputy observed an individual stumbling while walking in the area and stopped to check on them. The suspect displayed signs of impairment, with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. Alcoholic beverages were found on the suspect's person, and they were subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Wawa | 3099 Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to a disturbance. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance, slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. An alcoholic beverage was found next to the suspect. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

FRAUD

Holly Tree Lane | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding an altered check. The victim reported mailing a check, but it was never received. The victim then visited their bank, where they were informed that the check had been altered and cashed. The bank launched an investigation.

Forbes Street | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding an unauthorized account opening. The victim reported receiving a letter regarding a phone account being opened in their name. The victim notified their credit agency and the phone company. The deputy advised the victim to lock their credit and monitor for any suspicious activity.

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Acadia Street/Richmond Highway | A deputy responded to a vehicle accident in this area. It was determined that the vehicle ran a red light and struck the victim's vehicle. While speaking with the driver, the deputy detected a strong odor of alcoholic beverages coming from his person. Field sobriety tests were administered, and at the conclusion of the tests, the driver was taken into custody. Inside the vehicle, empty containers were observed on the passenger's seat, and two empty mini bottles were located behind the driver's seat. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, reckless driving, failure to provide insurance, and open container.



DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

Monument Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny complaint. The victim reported that someone entered their vehicle and stole items from within their purse.

WEAPONS OFFENSES

Cliff Circle | A deputy responded for a weapons violation report. The victims reported hearing fireworks going off in the neighborhood. The victims went to bed at around 2:00 a.m. When they woke the next morning, they observed a hole through their ceiling and a bullet on the floor. It appeared that a bullet came straight through the roof, possibly from someone firing in the air during the fireworks celebrations.

FRAUD

Ramoth Church Road | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft. The victim reported receiving a letter regarding educational debt owed out of Louisiana. The victim contacted the Louisiana Department of Justice and was informed that the suspect had used the victim's identity to apply for student loans and enroll in community college. A police report was needed to clear the debt. The deputy also advised the victim to monitor their credit and bank accounts for suspicious activity.

LARCENY

Wawa | 920 Wonder Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that two suspects entered the store, selected items, and then passed all points of sale without paying. Camera footage confirmed the recount of events. An initial search of the area provided no further information.

ASSAULT

Hunting Creek Lane and Popes Creek Lane | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. The victim reported that they got into an argument with the suspect, and the suspect had shoved the victim. A visible mark could be seen on the victim's body. Camera footage in the area showed the suspect running toward the victim, but it was unable to capture the altercation. Upon making contact, the suspect admitted to shoving the victim. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with assault and battery and was released with a set court date.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported receiving a phone call, and the caller claimed to be from Wells Fargo's security department regarding suspicious activity. The suspects then instructed the victim to withdraw funds for security purposes and to hand over the funds in cash to the suspects. The suspects then instructed the victim to transfer additional funds to a separate bank account. After the funds were sent, the victim contacted the legitimate Wells Fargo, which notified the victim of the scam and froze the account. Deputy Ramos advised the victim to block the suspects' phone numbers.

Victim reported receiving an email from the suspect claiming to be their boss. The suspect instructed the victim to purchase gift cards for employees. After the gift cards were purchased and shared with the suspect, the victim recognized the scam. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported receiving several phone calls from the suspects claiming to be from Walmart or the Social Security Administration. The suspects claimed that the victim's identity had been compromised, leading to several bank accounts established under the victim's name with the intent to be used for organized crime in different countries. Across more than a month, the suspects instructed the victim to purchase gold coins, withdraw funds, and hand over all monetary items to the suspects to avoid being involved with the fraudulent criminal investigation. The suspects also instructed the victim to change their phone number, which led the victim to notify their family. The victim's family advised the victim of the scam. The victim then notified their bank and stopped all contact with the suspects. No suspects have been identified at this time.
