WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



JUNE 2ND – JUNE 8TH, 2025

ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, a deputy responded to a cosmetic crime. Staff observed a female suspect was stuffing various face care products into her purse. While a healthy skin care routine is important, the nearly \$60 worth of items was recovered, and she was issued a summons for shoplifting.

Edgewater Drive, a deputy responded to a larceny. The victim had a laptop delivered. Six (6) minutes after being dropped off, a male riding an electric scooter spotted the package. He would quickly stuff it into his backpack before scooting off.

Everett Lane, a deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised that in the early morning hours, two people entered his vehicle and stole credit cards. The larceny was caught on camera. The victim would then later receive notification of fraudulent activity on those credit cards.

DUI

Olde Forge Drive, a deputy responded to a rush-hour accident. A Toyota struck an unoccupied semi-truck. The Toyota driver had signs of intoxication, admitted to consuming two (2) shots, and a nearly empty bottle of tequila was located near the crash. The driver was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2, as well as drinking while driving. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,500 secured bond.



BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Ferry Road, a deputy responded to a drunk driver complaint. A fellow deputy, who was off-duty, observed a vehicle traveling in the opposite lane of travel and nearly hit another vehicle. The off-duty deputy followed the suspect vehicle until a deputy could make contact with the driver. The driver had signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming three (3) drinks prior to driving. The driver was charged with driving under the influence.

LARCENY

Walmart, 125 Washington Square Plaza, a deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised that they observed a female suspect stuff her purse with unpaid items. The stolen items were recovered, and the suspect was issued a summons for shoplifting.

Walmart, 125 Washington Square Plaza, a deputy responded to a larceny. Despite attempting to conceal items in a bag in secluded areas of the business, camera footage showed the female suspect shoplifting. She was stopped after she had passed all points of sale with "the nearly" \$200 worth of stolen items. She was issued a summons for shoplifting.

Walmart, 125 Washington Square Plaza, a deputy responded to a larceny. When you are wanted, it's best not to draw attention to oneself. A female suspect did the opposite by shoplifting using a bright pink duffle bag. The "over \$100 worth" of items was recovered, and it was confirmed she was wanted out of both Fredericksburg and Rockingham. She was served on her outstanding warrant, as well as charged with shoplifting. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

ABC, 43 Town and Country Drive, a deputy responded to a Hennessy heist. Staff advised that a regular visitor stole a bottle of Hennessy. Using the power of technology, the deputy sent out a picture of the suspect to other deputies, who found the suspect on Kings Highway. The suspect was still in possession of the bottle and admitted that stealing it was a "stupid decision." He was issued a summons for shoplifting.

Grafton Street, a deputy responded to a report of a missing Monkey. The victim advised that his cat, named Monkey, went missing and had reason to believe the pet had been stolen. The curious case of Monkey is still ongoing.

VANDALISM

Area of Richmond Highway and Centreport Parkway. Deputies were on a traffic stop when they were flagged down by another driver. The driver advised that while traveling on Centreport Parkway, an unfocused Ford Focus driver began driving recklessly and threw an item at his vehicle.

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Jay's Sport Lounge, a deputy responded to a drunk driver complaint. The caller advised that an "extremely intoxicated" male just left the business in a Dodge Ram. The deputy located the vehicle driving recklessly in the area and conducted a traffic stop when the deputy responded to assist. Coincidentally, the driver pulled over in front of an ABC store. The driver had signs of intoxication; however, he blamed his driving behaviors on his vehicle. He was charged with driving under the influence and refusal. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail pending his ability to participate in a bond hearing.

EMBEZZLEMENT

7-Eleven, 1947 Richmond Highway, a deputy responded to an employee testing her luck. Using business cameras, staff determined that an employee not only stole cash from the register but also stole multiple scratch-off lottery tickets. The suspect's winnings now include a warrant for grand larceny.

ASSAULT

Telegraph Road, a deputy responded to a roommate ruckus. When the victim attempted to discuss rent with the suspect, the suspect assaulted the victim with a golf club. The suspect was charged with assault and battery. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$5,000 secured bond.

LARCENY

Decatur Road, a deputy responded to a larceny. The victim woke up to discover her vehicle was no longer where she had parked it. In the early hours of June 5th, a deputy located the stolen vehicle on Olympic Drive.

Draper Circle, a deputy responded to an unfortunate high school reunion. The victim had been receiving threatening messages from a former high school friend for the past few months.

Sutton Court, a deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised that his firearm was stolen from his vehicle.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Lakeview Court, a deputy responded to an unknown problem. The caller advised that there was an unconscious male. The deputy located the suspect in an intoxicated state. It was also discovered the suspect was wanted out of Maryland for a failure to appear. He was charged with public intoxication and served on his failure to appear charge. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

DELTA ZONE

HIT AND RUN

Lily Nail & Spa. A spa day turned into a traffic offense in a matter of moments. The victim was inside the business when she observed a vehicle hit her unoccupied vehicle. Luckily, a family member was able to run out of the business and obtain the suspect vehicle's license plate. Using that, a deputy was able to identify and locate the driver, who admitted to the crash. He was issued a permitted warrant for hit and run.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Moss Drive, a deputy responded to a disturbance. The caller advised that an unknown female was trying to enter homes. When the deputy arrived, he quickly observed the shoeless suspect running around the street. She was discovered to be wanted out of Stafford for trespassing and was detained. While escorting her to jail, she would attempt to kick a deputy multiple times and even assault a correction officer. She was charged with public intoxication, assault and battery on a correctional officer, as well as served on her outstanding warrant. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

LARCENY

Wawa, 105 Garrisonville Road, a deputy was in the area when he observed a Hyundai backing up into a crane. The deputy made contact with both occupants, and while doing so, noticed damage to the inside of the vehicle consistent with someone stealing it. Both the driver and the juvenile passenger were detained. Contact was made with the vehicle's owner, who confirmed it was stolen out of Maryland. The driver was charged with possession of stolen goods, driving without a license, destruction of property, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. She was released by the magistrate on personal recognizance. A criminal complaint for possession of stolen goods was submitted for the juvenile.

Oak Drove Lane, a deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised that her motorcycle was stolen. The bike was entered as stolen into a law enforcement database.

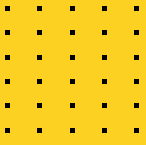

DUI

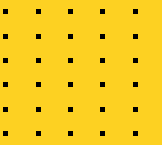

Deputies made contact with the poor park job driver and noticed several signs of intoxication. The driver was charged with driving under the influence and driving without insurance. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

ASSAULT

Providence Street, a deputy responded to an assault. It was discovered that one juvenile assaulted another at the park because the victim was "running her mouth." A criminal complaint for assault and battery was filed for the predominant aggressor.
