ALPHA ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Thomas Lane | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect had walked up to the caller's residence and fallen asleep on the porch. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, an unsteady balance, and slurred speech. An alcoholic beverage was found next to where the suspect was located. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Giant | 550 Celebrate Virginia Parkway | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect was lying down behind the store. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, an unsteady balance, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. An initial investigation found that the suspect was wanted out of Fredericksburg. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and was served on his outstanding warrants.

University Boulevard | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy observed the suspect fall on the sidewalk. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and the inability to stand. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Rugby Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

DUI

Poplar Road | A deputy responded to a report of an individual unconscious behind the wheel. Information was provided that drug paraphernalia was outside the vehicle. Upon making contact, deputies observed the drug paraphernalia next to the driver's side door. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. An initial investigation revealed that the driver had a DUI-revoked license. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect refused to provide a breath sample or a blood sample. Narcotic residue was later found inside the drug paraphernalia outside the suspect's vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance, driving with a revoked license, and refusal to test.

VANDALISM

White Pine Circle | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. Information was provided that the vehicle had left the scene. The deputy then observed the vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The vehicle displayed an expired license plate. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. An investigation revealed that the suspect had used a power drill to puncture the victim's tires and had previously damaged the victim's bumper. The power drill was found inside the suspect's vehicle. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect then refused field sobriety tests and a breath sample. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect refused a breath or blood sample. The suspect was identified and charged with destruction of property, an interlock violation, driving with an expired registration, driving after forfeiture of a license, refusal to test, hit and run, and driving under the influence.

Venture Drive | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported that their vehicle and trailer had been tampered with over the past few months, including having their gas siphoned and tires deflated. No cameras were available in the area. Deputy advised the victim the advantages of parking the vehicle and trailer in a secure lot.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Brooke Road and New Hope Church Road | A deputy observed an individual sitting on the side of the road and stopped to make sure they were okay. The individual displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, an unsteady balance, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The individual admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The individual was subsequently arrested and charged with public intoxication.

DISTURBANCE

Indian Point Road | Deputies responded to a disturbance in the area. Information was provided that there were loud noises and several vehicles at a residence. While en route, a vehicle stopped the deputy and advised that shots had been fired. As individuals and vehicles were leaving the scene and confirmed none had any weapons, deputies found shell casings in several separate locations around the residence. An investigation revealed that the residence was being used for a house party. No victims were injured due to the shots being fired. Deputies observed one individual failing to follow police command and using marijuana in front of deputies. The individual displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The individual was subsequently arrested and charged with public intoxication.

On June 14, 2026, at approximately 9:54 a.m., units were dispatched to a report of five suspects in the wooded area near Indian Point Road, who had recently left in a vehicle. Deputies conducted a traffic stop and separated the parties. An investigation of the vehicle revealed several firearms and cash. More firearms, narcotics, and a scale were later found inside the residence on Indian Point Road. It was determined that one of the firearms contained an autosear, one of the firearms was stolen out of Alexandria, and one of the firearms had the serial number removed, so additional charges were brought forward.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Rock Hill Church Road | A deputy observed a vehicle with a flat tire and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment, with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Wawa |920 Wonder Road | A deputy observed an intoxicated person. The suspect was swaying back and forth and was unable to maintain their balance to get onto an e-bike. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment. A THC device was later found on the suspect's person. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Arrowhead Drive and James Lane | A deputy observed a suspicious person walking down the road. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. The suspect then admitted to being intoxicated and consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

WARRANT SERVICES

Green Acre Drive | A deputy responded to a suspicious vehicle report in the area. Upon making contact, the deputy observed the suspect to be asleep with the vehicle running and the door open. An initial investigation found that the vehicle's license plate was registered to a different vehicle, and the suspect had a warrant for their arrest out of Washington, D.C. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with fugitive from justice, driving an unregistered vehicle, and driving with a license plate belonging to another vehicle.

LARCENY

CVS | 388 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that three suspects entered the store and stole a display. No suspects have been identified at this time.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported receiving a phone call from the suspect claiming to be from the PNC Bank Fraud Department. The suspect claimed that the victim's account had been compromised and instructed the victim to transfer funds to a separate account. After the funds were transferred, the suspect stopped all contact with the victim. The victim then notified their bank, and reported to the Sheriff's Office.

Victim reported receiving several phone calls over the past couple of weeks, with the suspects claiming to be from both Pricewaterhouse and the Department of the Treasury. The suspects instructed the victim to purchase gift cards and turn over several items because the victim's identity was being used to open fraudulent bank accounts. The victim had provided the gift card information, but refused to turn over the items. The deputy assisted the victim in blocking the suspects' numbers and advised that no government or law enforcement agency would request payment through gift cards.

Victim reported noticing an unauthorized withdrawal from their account. The victim then noticed that one of their mailed checks had been stolen, altered, and cashed at a separate bank. The victim notified their bank, which froze the account. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported a fraud regarding a Stafford County Sheriff's Office impersonation scam. The suspect claimed to be a part of the Sheriff's Office and instructed the victim to send gift cards to avoid arrest. Only some of the funds were transferred before the victim hung up the phone. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Victim reported that the suspect claimed to be from their employer, "Spark", and had directed the victim to cancel a delivery. The suspect then instructed the victim to take an advance for the delivery. After the transactions went through, the victim recognized the scam. The suspect then stopped all contact with the victim. No suspects have been identified at this time.
