ALPHA ZONE

WARRANT SERVICES

Target – 25 South Gateway Drive. Deputies observed a wanted individual. The suspect was wanted out of Kentucky for failure to appear in court. Upon making contact, the suspect's identity was confirmed, and they were subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with fugitive from justice and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

VANDALISM

28 South Gateway Drive. A deputy responded to a disturbance call in the area and observed individuals confronting each other and immediately separated the parties. The suspect reported that they had observed the victim's vehicle swerving behind them and became agitated, then hit the victim's side mirror. The victim then reportedly chased the suspect and exited the vehicle. The deputy spoke with the victim, who stated that the suspect was walking in the middle of the road before they struck the victim's side mirror. The deputy confirmed the damage and advised suspect of the charges. The suspect was identified and charged with destruction of property and was released with a set court date.

LARCENY

Walmart – 11 Village Parkway. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Employees reported that the suspect was detained in the Loss Prevention office for stealing food items. When arriving on scene, the deputy was informed that the suspect was attempting to flee on foot. The suspect was returned to the office and searched for weapons, finding a pair of scissors and knives. The deputy obtained the suspect's identification, which was different from the name previously provided. Employees reported that the suspect concealed croissants, eggs, ham, and a water jug before passing all points of sale without attempting to pay. The suspect was identified and charged with concealment, false identification, identity theft to defraud, and identity theft to avoid arrest.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Royal Farms – 125 Royal Falls Drive. A deputy responded to a disturbance. Information was provided that the suspect was intoxicated and yelling at customers. Upon arriving on scene, employees reported that the suspect was refusing to leave despite multiple requests. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. The suspect then began yelling at other deputies and was subsequently arrested and the store requested the suspect trespassed by deputies. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication, trespassing, and obstructing justice.

THUNDERSTORM ASSISTANCE

Stafford County. Deputies worked throughout the night to assist with removing trees, debris, and other obstacles from roadways so that drivers could safely travel. Covering areas such as Stefaniga Road, Parkway Boulevard, Stony Hill Road, Mount Olive Road, and more, the Stafford County Sheriff's Office remained on duty, ready to serve those who needed our help.

BRAVO ZONE

WARRANT SERVICES

180 Centreport Parkway. Deputy responded to a hit and run report at the FedEx Federal Express in the area. Upon making contact, information was provided that one of the drivers had an active felony warrant out for their arrest. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect then admitted to driving without a license. The suspect was identified and was served on his warrant, charged with driving without a license.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Chatham Heights Road. A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect had tried to forcefully enter a residence that was not theirs. Upon arriving on scene, the deputies were able to detain the suspect. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. The suspect then became agitated with the deputies and claimed they did not understand what they had done wrong. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

501 Cambridge Street. A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was screaming for help before running away. A deputy observed the suspect running across the football field at Drew Middle School. The suspect then made erratic movements and screamed before reporting that they had taken psychedelic mushrooms earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. Once placed into the patrol vehicle, the suspect was then transported to the Magistrate's Office. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication, trespassing on school property, and obstructing justice.

DUI

McCarty Road. A deputy responded to a self-reported auto accident in the area. The caller reported that they had driven into a ditch and admitted to being intoxicated. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect advised that they were headed home when they lost control of the vehicle. They also reported that they had consumed 1-2 alcoholic beverages. A field sobriety test was administered, and a breath sample was collected. The suspect was subsequently arrested and charged with driving under the influence and refusal to test.

CHARLIE ZONE

FRAUD

Doria Hill Drive. A deputy responded to a fraud complaint regarding a forged check. The victim reported that they dropped off a mortgage check at the post office but later received a notification that the payment was not received. Looking at their bank account, the victim noticed that the check had been intercepted, wiped, and the amount was withdrawn under a separate name. The victim notified their bank, which began a fraud investigation. No suspects have been identified at this time.



DELTA ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Girlfriend's Tap House - 225 Garrisonville Road. A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report. Information was provided that the suspect was running around the business and yelling. Upon arriving on scene, a friend of the suspect claimed that the suspect had mixed alcohol with prescribed medication. The deputy made contact with the suspect, who displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The suspect then admitted to having six alcoholic beverages. They were subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

LARCENY

Walmart - 217 Garrisonville Road. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Employees reported that the suspect had skipped-scanned multiple times at the self-checkouts and was detained after passing all points of sale. Video footage confirmed that the suspect covered the barcodes of items and slid them across the scanner without it registering. The suspect was identified and charged with petit larceny.

Wawa - 15 Eustace Road. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy observed the suspects and conducted a traffic stop. Additionally, the deputy observed a bag being thrown into the backseat of the vehicle and advised the suspects of the larceny complaint. The suspects then admitted to stealing items from the store. Camera footage confirmed that the suspects had stolen items during this incident, along with previous incidents. The store manager requested the suspects trespass from the store. The suspects were identified, trespassed from the property, and charged with concealment and petit larceny.

Mountain View Road. A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding. When attempting to return the license plates of their vehicle to the DMV, the victim discovered the plates were missing. Nobody within the residence was aware of the plates' location. The victim advised that they had the plates deactivated through the DMV. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Burger King - 269 Garrisonville Road. A deputy responded to an alarm. Upon arriving on scene, employees also reported that there was a suspect who was causing a disturbance. The employees claimed that the suspect was in the bathroom for an extended amount of time, had been playing music in the lobby, and had sworn at staff members. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and glassy eyes. The suspect was subsequently arrested. Several bottles of alcohol were found on their persons. The suspect was and charged with public intoxication.

Giant - 317 Worth Avenue. A deputy responded to a larceny report. The Loss Prevention team provided information that the suspect entered the store with a backpack in their shopping cart, entered the frozen food section, and removed items before placing them in their backpack and leaving the store without attempting to pay. Camera footage confirmed the information. No suspect has been identified at this time.
