WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

Walmart | 11 Village Parkway. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect had left the store after concealing items in their backpack. An initial investigation of the area provided no suspects. At the Loss Prevention office, camera footage showed the suspect walking into the beverage aisle with items in their hand and then proceeding to walk out with nothing but their backpack. The suspect passed all points of sale without attempting to pay. No suspects have been identified at this time.

VA ABC Store | 9 Village Center Drive. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect had attempted to purchase a bottle of alcohol, but didn't have their ID. The suspect then left the store and didn't return. The suspect exhibited suspicious behavior, so employees examined camera footage and noticed that the suspect had concealed a second bottle of alcohol in their clothing before reaching the checkout counter. Then, when the suspect left the store, they failed to return the second bottle of alcohol and passed all points of sale without attempting to pay for it. No suspects have been identified at this time.

DUI

7-11 | 1 Commerce Parkway. A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol before driving. A field sobriety test was administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and failure to maintain his lane.

TRESPASS

Holiday Inn Express | 560 Warrenton Road. A deputy responded to a trespassing complaint. Upon arriving on scene, the general manager advised that the suspect, who had been trespassing, had entered a guest's room the night before without authorization. Employees could not identify how the suspect had obtained a key card. Camera footage showed the suspect walking into the room, coming back out, and then running down the hallway as the guest came out to confront them. Upon making contact with the guest, they advised that they woke up to the suspect walking into the room. The suspect then claimed to be in the wrong room and left. Deputies located the suspect on Warrenton Road and subsequently arrested them. The suspect was identified and charged with trespassing and petit larceny.

VANDALISM

Warrenton Road and Cambridge Street. A deputy responded to a vandalism complaint in the area. The victim reported that they were traveling south on Richmond Highway when the suspect began honking their horn. The suspect then got in front of the victim and attempted to brake-check them. The suspect and the victim ended up next to each other and came to a stop at the red light. The suspect then instructed the victim to roll their window down before throwing a bottle and damaging the window. No suspects have been identified at this time.

BRAVO ZONE

LARCENY

Cambridge Street. A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a missing independent dealer tag. The victim reported that they noticed that one of their vehicles was missing a front independent dealer tag while moving their auto business. The victim canceled the tag and wanted it entered as stolen.

Chapel Green Road. A deputy responded to a fraud complaint regarding personally identifiable information being used by somebody else. The victim reported that they filed their taxes through Block Advisors, which provided a scam shield. When looking at the scam shield, the victim noticed that their personally identifiable information was being used by the suspect. The victim then put a lock on their credit through different credit bureaus. No suspects have been identified at this time.

VANDALISM

CVS | 450 Chatham Heights Road. A deputy responded to a vandalism report. The victim reported that their vehicle had been scratched from the headlight to the rear taillight on the driver's side. No camera footage outside of the CVS was available.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

McDonald's | 545 Ferry Road. A deputy responded to a disturbance. Information was provided that the suspect had become confrontational and would not follow directions to leave the restaurant. Employees then advised that they wanted the suspect to be trespassed from the store. Upon making contact, the suspect admitted to having consumed alcohol right before arriving at the restaurant. The alcoholic beverage was later found inside the suspect's vehicle. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober, along with being trespassed from the McDonald's.

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Briarwood Drive. A deputy responded to an auto accident. Upon arriving on scene, the victim reported that the suspect had driven through an intersection, despite having a stop sign, and struck the victim's vehicle. The suspect had reportedly provided their contact information, left the scene, and was returning when the deputy arrived on scene. The suspect claimed that they believed the intersection was a four-way stop and proceeded after an initial check. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect had a suspended license and was suspected of having been driving under the influence earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received, but no indication of impairment was determined. Due to the suspended license, the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with driving after forfeiture of a license and felony driving revoked while endangering others.

CHARLIE ZONE

FRAUD

Confederate Way. A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding an unauthorized insurance policy. The victim reported receiving a phone call from an insurance company claiming they owed money on their account. The victim believed that the suspect had added the insurance policy after stealing their credit card information during a recent phone call. Looking at their bank account, they also noticed an additional unauthorized transaction. The victim notified their bank, which refunded the money.

Potomac Hills Drive. A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. When looking at their account, the victim noticed multiple unauthorized charges from California and contacted their bank. The victim then notified different credit bureaus, reported their identity as stolen, and placed a lock on their credit.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Town Square Circle. A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. After talking with the parties involved, one individual displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and aggressive behavior. They were subsequently arrested. While en route to the Magistrate's Office, the suspect began arguing with the deputy and changing their story about how much alcohol they had consumed. After getting out of the cruiser, the suspect began resisting and attempted to flee. The suspect continued being argumentative and failed to follow directions in the courtroom. Finally, when the suspect was being booked at Rappahannock Regional Jail, they made several threatening statements toward the deputy. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and obstruction of justice. McCain was held without bond.



DELTA ZONE

TRAFFIC OFFENSE

Embrey Mill Road and Mine Road. Deputy Jones observed a vehicle driving recklessly above the posted speed limit. After pursuing the vehicle, other deputies found the suspects walking down Apricot Street. The deputy spoke with one suspect, who was identified as the driver of the vehicle. When asked why they were driving recklessly, the driver claimed that they wanted to ensure the vehicle was operating properly. The driver then admitted to parking away from their residence and attempting to conceal their association with the vehicle, knowing that deputies were looking for it. The driver was subsequently arrested. Two other suspects were detained and questioned. The driver was identified and charged with reckless speeding and eluding police. The second suspect was identified and charged with eluding police and released with a set court date. The third suspect was identified and charged with eluding police.

LARCENY

Walmart | 217 Garrisonville Road. A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that an off-duty employee was stealing from the store by skip-scanning items at self-checkout. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect had stolen several items across multiple incidents. The suspect was identified and charged with concealment.

DUI

True Road. A deputy observed a vehicle hit an electrical box while attempting to park. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of marijuana and droopy eyelids. The suspect confirmed they used marijuana shortly before hitting the electrical box. A field sobriety test was administered, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. Marijuana was later found inside the vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

FRAUD

Sundance Drive. A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized withdrawals across multiple accounts. The victim reported that they had posted an item for sale and were contacted by the suspect. The suspect requested to send payment through Zelle, but the transaction was never completed. The suspect provided a Zelle customer service number to the victim, which they later learned was fraudulent. The victim then noticed several unauthorized withdrawals from their bank accounts. After the withdrawals, the victim notified their banks and changed all important information.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Chili's | 1030 Stafford Marketplace. Deputies responded to a disturbance. Deputies observed the suspect running across the parking lot. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. When questioned, the suspect admitted to having four alcoholic beverages earlier in the day. They were subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

WARRANT SERVICES

Timberlake Street and Providence Street. The Stafford County Sheriff's Office Street Crimes Unit observed a wanted individual as part of an armed robbery case earlier in the month. Alongside the Forest Heights Police Department, the Sheriff's Office had already arrested two other suspects involved. This suspect was observed inside a vehicle before being subsequently removed and arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with fugitive from justice.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported that they received an email claiming to be from PayPal, notifying them of fraudulent activity on their account. After calling the provided number, the suspect gained access to the victim's computer and instructed them to log into their bank accounts. After the victim logged in, the suspect claimed they would fix the PayPal account after funds were transferred. The victim then recognized it was a scam and hung up. The victim notified their banks and closed all online access.

Victim reported that they received a phone call indicating they had won the Publisher's Clearing House Sweepstakes. The suspect then instructed the victim to provide their card number to receive it. After providing the information, the victim recognized that it was a scam and changed their account information.

Victim reported they received two phone calls displaying no caller ID, claiming the victim had a summons for state and federal charges for failure to appear for jury duty. The suspects then claimed that the victim needed to post bond to avoid arrest, which could be done by sending Bitcoin through a QR code. When asked if the dispute could be handled in person, the suspects stated that the victim would be arrested if they came to the Sheriff's Office. The victim then began receiving text message instructions from the suspects claiming to be a part of the Department of Justice. After sending initial funds, the victim received a phone call from a second person who stated that the initial funds only covered the state warrants, but additional funds were needed for the federal warrants. Once the second set of funds was sent, the victim received another phone call from a third person claiming that since the warrants weren't paid at the same time, there was an additional fee and another open warrant, which led to the victim transferring more funds. When the victim attempted to ask any questions, the suspect instructed that there was a suppression order that prohibited the victim from contacting anybody else. It was at this time the victim realized they had been a victim of a scam.

Victim noticed a malware alert on their computer advising them to call a Microsoft representative. After calling the number, the victim was then transferred to the suspect, who claimed to be investigating dark web activity. The suspect then instructed the victim to send cash through the mail to fund the agents investigating the matter. After sending the packages with cash, a second suspect, claiming to be a part of ICE, contacted the victim and stated that they had intercepted the packages. The second suspect then stated that they would return the money after a police report was filed. The victim's family member noticed that there was a misspelling in the second suspect's credentials, indicating it was a scam. The deputy was able to get the packages held at the FedEx facility in California on Monday for their fraud department to investigate. The victim then notified different credit bureaus and changed their bank account information, along with cleaning their computer of viruses.

This report does not encompass all of the reported crimes that may have occurred in the county, but only those noted for media interest.
