WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Quarles Road | Deputies responded to a report of a suspicious person with a weapon. The victim reported that the suspect was banging on their door and attempting to make entry into their residence. Upon deputies' arrival, the suspect was detained. The suspect did not have any weapons on their person. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and erratic behavior. The suspect admitted to using marijuana earlier that day. Marijuana was later found on the suspect's person. Further review of the residence determined that the suspect had broken the victim's door handle. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and intent to damage property.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Target | 25 South Gateway Drive | Deputies responded to a person sleeping on a bench. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

LARCENY

Wawa | 920 Wonder Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that five (5) suspects entered the store and stole cases of alcoholic beverages and soda. Camera footage confirmed that the suspects entered the store, grabbed the beverages, and passed all points of sale without payment. No suspects have been identified at this time.

WEAPONS

Hulls Chapel Road | Units responded to Key Way regarding shots fired. Information was provided that the suspect had passed the victim on the road and began yelling profanities before firing two shots and fleeing the scene. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect and the victim were arguing before the shots were fired. Units canvassed the nearby area and found the suspect's vehicle parked at their residence. The suspect exited their residence and was subsequently detained. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol before driving and displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. An open alcoholic beverage was found inside their vehicle. Inside the residence, units recovered a firearm with a loaded magazine inserted and a spent shell casing on a nearby table. The suspect was identified and charged with disorderly conduct, brandishing a firearm, and reckless handling of a firearm.

BRAVO ZONE

NARCOTICS VIOLATION

Layhill Road and Cambridge Street | A deputy observed a vehicle run a red light and conducted a traffic stop. An initial investigation revealed that the driver's license was suspended, and they had a previous incident regarding narcotics. Upon making contact, the deputy observed four (4) individuals in the vehicle. Additional units arrived, and K-9 Kilo alerted that the vehicle contained narcotics. Narcotics were then found inside the center console and a backpack owned by one of the passengers. The driver and passenger were subsequently arrested. The driver was charged with possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance, along with being issued summonses for a red-light violation and driving on a suspended license. The passenger was identified and charged with possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance.

DUI

James Ashby Parkway and Kings Highway | A deputy responded to a motor vehicle accident. Information was provided that a vehicle had struck a pole and was in a ditch. Upon making contact, the driver of the vehicle displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an unsteady balance. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. An open bottle of alcohol was later found inside the vehicle, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol immediately before driving. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and drinking while operating a motor vehicle.

WARRANT SERVICES

212 Butler Road | A deputy observed a vehicle with a registered owner who was wanted by Virginia State Police and conducted a traffic stop at the nearby YMCA. The owner was wanted for making false statements when applying for a firearm purchase. Upon making contact, it was identified that there was also a passenger inside the vehicle. The driver then began cursing at the deputy and refused to follow instructions multiple times. The driver repeatedly instructed the passenger to follow police orders before being detained. It was determined that the passenger was the wanted individual. The vehicle displayed a current inspection sticker, but an investigation into the vehicle revealed that it had an expired inspection. The driver was identified and charged with obstructing justice, driving with a revoked license, using counterfeit vehicle inspection stickers, and driving with an expired inspection. The passenger was identified and served on his outstanding warrant.

VANDALISM

Centreport Parkway | A deputy responded to a vandalism report in the area. The victim reported that their motorcycle had been tampered with and would no longer start. A locksmith advised that the anti-theft mechanism had likely been activated. No suspects have been identified at this time.

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Brent Point Road | A deputy responded to a trespassing report. Information was provided that the suspect was walking around the victim's garage and driving around their property. Upon arriving on scene, the victim alerted the deputy to the suspect's location. The deputy began driving toward the suspect, and the suspect attempted to flee. The deputy and additional units conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the suspect. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an unsteady balance. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect's license was suspended. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and driving without a license.

Pepper Tree Lane | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized account openings. The victim reported running a credit check on their account and identified three cases of unauthorized account openings with DirecTV in Tennessee. The victim had no association with the addresses and needed a police report to for the investigation.

Courage Lane and Richmond Highway | 5/8 12:29 a.m. | Deputy Copeland observed a vehicle driving erratically and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver and passengers displayed signs of impairment, with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The driver denied consuming alcohol or having any weapons. An initial investigation revealed that the driver was wanted out of Fairfax County. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. Empty alcoholic beverages and two firearms were later found inside the vehicle. Additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified as Samuel Vasquez-Hernandez, 22, of Woodbridge. Vasquez-Hernandez was charged with driving under the influence, carrying a concealed weapon without a permit, driving without a license, and aggressive driving, along with being served on his outstanding warrant. Vasquez-Hernandez was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond. The first passenger was identified as Angel Rios-Sorto, 20, of Woodbridge. Rios-Sorto was charged with unlawful possession of an alcoholic beverage and public intoxication. The second passenger was identified as Mario Sandoval, 22 of Woodbridge. Sandoval was charged with public intoxication. Rios-Sorto and Sandoval were held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

DELTA ZONE

LARCENY

1455 Stafford Marketplace | 5/14 7:42 a.m. | Deputy Sullivan responded to a larceny report at the nearby Planet Fitness. The victims reported that their car keys were stolen from their locker, along with their wallets. The victims' vehicles were not damaged or stolen at the time of the report.

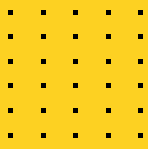
1220 Stafford Marketplace | 5/14 1:25 p.m. | Deputy Cassetta responded to a larceny report at the nearby Kohl's. The Loss Prevention team reported that three suspects had stolen merchandise the previous night. Camera footage confirmed that three suspects entered the store, selected several items, and then ran out of the store, passing all points of sale without paying. No suspects have been identified at this time.

920 Wonder Road | 5/14 7:33 p.m. | Deputy Perkins responded to a larceny report at the nearby Wawa. Information was provided that the victim had their e-bike stolen while they were in the store. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect picked up the e-bike and walked toward a U-Haul. No suspects have been identified at this time.

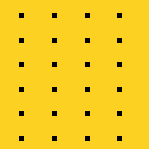
217 Garrisonville Road | 5/17 1:46 p.m. | Deputy Sprinkles responded to a larceny report at the nearby Walmart. Information was provided that the suspect had concealed items and entered the restroom without paying. Upon making contact, the suspect was subsequently arrested. During a search of their person, drug paraphernalia and narcotics were found. The suspect was identified as Cynthia Coon, 37, of Stafford. Coon was charged with petit larceny, two counts of concealment, and three counts of possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance. Coon was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond. All stolen items were recovered by Walmart.

DUI

Onville Road and Worth Avenue | 5/16 9:21 p.m. | Deputy Delaney and Stamm responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the driver crashed their motorcycle and was lying in the grass. Upon arriving on scene, Deputy Stamm observed the driver lying in the grass with an e-bike nearby. While talking with Deputy Stamm, the driver denied crashing the e-bike. The driver displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and the inability to stand. While being checked by Fire and Rescue, the driver admitted to consuming several alcoholic beverages earlier that day. The driver denied field sobriety tests and was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified as Ryan Strother, 25, of King George. Strother was charged with driving under the influence. Strother was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported receiving a text message and phone call claiming to be from Wells Fargo about an unauthorized purchase. The suspect then advised the victim that their account was compromised and that a new card would be issued. Upon receiving their new card, the victim received a second phone call about another unauthorized purchase. The suspect then claimed to be a federal agent with Wells Fargo and that the victim's account had been compromised again. The suspect then instructed the victim to withdraw funds from their bank account, avoid telling anybody about their actions, and deposit the funds into an Apple account. After the funds were deposited, the suspect stated that the process was complete and that the funds should be in the victim's account. The victim's legitimate bank later notified the victim about the fraudulent activity, and the victim spoke with the legitimate branch manager. The legitimate bank advised that the victim should contact Apple about the accounts. The victim also notified the FTC and SSA.
