WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

VANDALISM

Liberty Hall Drive | A deputy responded to a vandalism report regarding a damaged mailbox. The victim reported hearing a crash and then seeing debris in their yard. The victim was unable to identify a suspect. The deputy observed the debris, including two small black pieces, a black wire, a plug, and the damaged mailbox, which had broken off the pole.

DUI

Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the suspect had rear-ended a tractor-trailer. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect could not locate their driver's license, and when the suspect opened the vehicle's door, the deputy observed several opened alcoholic beverages. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol right before driving and that they were not paying attention to the road. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect did not have a valid driver's license. The suspect refused field sobriety tests and was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect refused to provide a breath or blood sample. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, refusal to test, drinking while operating a motor vehicle, driving without a license, and failing to pay full attention to the road.

Wawa | 830 Warrenton Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person attempting to drive. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect initially denied driving, but later changed their story. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect had driven to the store. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

WARRANT SERVICES

Malvern Lakes Circle | A deputy responded to a service request from Pennsylvania State Police regarding a wanted suspect in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect was arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with fugitive from justice and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

BRAVO ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Emancipation Highway | Deputies responded to a reckless driving report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was the passenger and had been hanging out of the window from the waist up. The caller was able to provide pictures of the suspect hanging out of the window while the vehicle was in motion. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and slurred speech. The suspect then admitted to hanging out of the window and consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was subsequently arrested. During transport, the suspect was verbally abusive toward deputies. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and disorderly conduct, and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

LARCENY

Belle Plains Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding stolen yard signs. The victim reported noticing their yard signs were missing after coming home on Wednesday. There were no cameras in the area to capture the incident.



CHARLIE ZONE

LARCENY

Cummings Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen package. The victim reported receiving an email that their package was delivered, but when they checked, the package was missing. No suspects have been identified at this time.

ASSAULT

Sunny Hill Court | A deputy responded to a report of an assault. Information was provided that the suspect had become upset with the victim, who was delivering packages, and then followed the victim to a second location. At the second location, the suspect reportedly pulled the victim out of their vehicle and assaulted the victim. The deputy observed redness and marks on the victim's body. After speaking with both parties, the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with assault and battery.

Brent Point Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. The victim reported that the suspect had been following their vehicle closely and made several threatening statements. The victim also noted that the suspect carried dangerous items in the vehicle and had exited the vehicle at one point. After making contact and speaking with the suspect, the deputy observed the dangerous items in the vehicle, and proceeded to obtain a warrant, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with simple assault and battery.

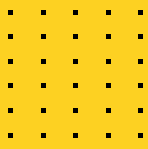
LARCENY

Wawa | 105 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect had stolen a carton of cigarettes. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect entered the store, waited for the cashier to be distracted by another customer, selected the cigarettes, concealed them in their clothing, and left the scene. No suspects have been identified at this time.

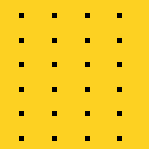
VANDALISM

Staffordboro Boulevard | A deputy responded to a vandalism report at the Staffordboro Commuter Lot. The victim reported noticing several scratches on their vehicle after parking in the lot that morning. The deputy observed the damage done to the vehicle. However, no cameras were installed in the area to capture the incident.





SCAM REPORT



Victim reported that after applying for a job, they were contacted to discuss the hiring process. The suspect then instructed the victim to send funds for licensure. After the funds were sent, the suspect canceled the victim's contract and later stopped all forms of communication. The victim suffered monetary loss and contacted his bank to ensure no additional loss was sustained.

Victim reported that they were expecting a check, but found it had been stolen, altered, and cashed by the suspect. The victim notified the IRS. No suspects have been identified at this time.
