

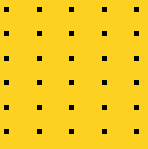

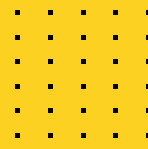
WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



MAY 25TH – MAY 31ST 2026



ALPHA ZONE



LARCENY

Walmart | 11 Village Parkway | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect was the passenger of a vehicle that had recently left the scene. Upon arriving on scene, the deputy spoke with the Loss Prevention team about the incident. Employees reported observing the suspect select a bag, remove the tag, and place items into the bag before passing all points of sale without paying. Deputies located the vehicle and returned the suspect to the store. The suspect admitted to stealing the items and fleeing the scene.

DUI

Pine View Drive | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the caller was the passenger of the vehicle and had been injured due to the crash. Upon making contact, the driver displayed signs of impairment with bloodshot eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The driver denied medical assistance from Fire and Rescue personnel. Next to the crashed vehicle, the deputy observed two open alcoholic beverages. The driver provided a breath sample and was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The passenger was transported to the hospital for their injuries, and additional charges were brought forward against the driver. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, maiming as a result of driving while intoxicated, reckless driving, and driving without a license.

WARRANT SERVICES

Malvern Lakes Circle | A deputy responded to a service request from Pennsylvania State Police regarding a wanted suspect in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect was arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with fugitive from justice and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

NARCOTICS

Warrenton Road and I-95 | A deputy observed a suspicious vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver admitted that they did not have a driver's license. The passenger also admitted to not having a driver's license. An initial investigation found that their licenses had been suspended. A search of the vehicle led to narcotics and drug paraphernalia being found next to the passenger seat. A scale with white powdery residue was found in the passenger's bag. The driver was identified and given a summons for driving on a suspended license. The passenger was identified and charged with possession of a Schedule I or II controlled substance.

BRAVO ZONE

FRAUD

Hamlin Drive | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding identity theft. The victim reported their loan application being denied because of multiple fraudulent accounts being opened under their name. The suspect also used one of the accounts to write fraudulent checks. The victim was advised to report the fraudulent activity to the FTC. A police report was needed for investigation.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Walnut Farms Parkway | Deputies responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect failed to follow directions and became argumentative with deputies. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

DUI

Manning Drive and Cambridge Street | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the suspect and passenger displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect and passenger then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and breath samples were received. The suspect and passenger were subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, driving without a license, and a traffic lane violation. The passenger was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Kings Highway | A deputy responded to an auto accident in the area. Information was provided that the suspect rear-ended the victim at a stop sign. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to not having a driver's license and provided their personally identifiable information. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect had provided false identification to the deputy and had a DUI-revoked license. The suspect then provided their legitimate identification and admitted to consuming alcohol right before driving. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, false identification to law enforcement, identity theft, and driving with a revoked license.

CHARLIE ZONE

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Courthouse Road | A deputy responded to an indecent exposure report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was standing nude near the train tracks. Upon arriving on scene, the suspect was found nude in their vehicle and displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech and an unsteady balance. The suspect was subsequently arrested. Narcotics and drug paraphernalia were found inside the suspect's vehicle. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication and indecent exposure.

Coal Landing Road and Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a suspect asleep on the corner of the road. After waking them up, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

DUI

Austin Run Boulevard and Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle parked on the side of the road and attempted to make contact. Upon making contact, it was determined that the suspect had stopped to urinate. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were refused, but a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

Richmond Highway and Castle Court | A deputy responded to a reckless driver report in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was driving erratically. The deputy then traveled to the suspect's residence and made contact. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. A child was determined to be in the vehicle, and additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and abuse and neglect of a child.

ASSAULT

Brent Point Road | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. The victim reported that the suspect had been following their vehicle closely and made several threatening statements. The victim also noted that the suspect carried dangerous items in the vehicle and, at one point, had exited the vehicle. After making contact and speaking to the suspect, the deputy observed the dangerous items in the vehicle. The deputy obtained a warrant, and the suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with simple assault and battery.

DELTA ZONE

ASSAULT

Weiss Market | 905 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to an assault report. Information was provided that the suspect had punched an employee in the face. Upon making contact, units attempted to detain the suspect, but the suspect began resisting arrest. The suspect was eventually detained and placed into a patrol vehicle. A deputy then spoke with the victim and witnesses, along with reviewing camera footage. The camera footage confirmed that the suspect punched the victim in the face. The suspect was identified and charged with assault and battery and obstructing justice. He was also trespassed from the Weis Market stores.

DUI

Chick-fil-A | 1094 International Parkway | A deputy responded to an auto accident. Upon making contact, the driver was found asleep behind the wheel, playing loud music. After the driver woke up, they displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and slurred speech. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier. Field sobriety tests were administered, but a breath sample was refused. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence.

LARCENY

Target | 1090 Stafford Market Place | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect had previously been trespassed from the store. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect placed several items into a backpack before passing all points of sale without paying. While investigating the suspect's backpack, it was determined that not all of the items were from Target. The suspect then admitted to stealing several items from other stores in the area. The suspect was identified and charged with five counts of concealment and two counts of trespassing. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond and trespassed from each store.

WARRANT SERVICES

Susan Street | Deputies observed a wanted suspect in the area. The suspect noticed the deputies and attempted to flee. The suspect was subsequently arrested. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The suspect was identified and charged with fleeing from law enforcement and public intoxication, along with being served on his outstanding warrants. Avelar Castro was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

SCAM REPORT

Victim reported they received a call, and the suspect claimed to be from Chase Bank's Fraud Department. The suspect then informed the victims that they'd be receiving a new card for their account. The victims noticed several unauthorized charges and notified their legitimate bank. The legitimate bank advised the victims of the scam and informed them that the charges would be refunded. Victims were also advised to notify the Social Security Administration regarding a potential leak of personal information.

Victim reported being notified by their university that someone had requested student loans using the victim's identity. The university stopped the request, and no money was transferred. A police report was needed for the investigation.

Victim reported finding a residence online and completing the application process. The victim was then contacted by the suspect, who claimed to be the property owner and requested a security deposit. After the funds were sent, the suspect then requested the first month's rent for the keys to be sent. The victim contacted the legitimate property owner, who advised the victim of the scam. The victim was advised to notify their bank to freeze their account and alert their credit bureaus to any suspicious activity.

Victim received a call informing them that they had won a sweepstakes. The suspect then claimed to deposit funds into the victim's account and instructed them to purchase gift cards. After the victim shared the gift card information with the suspect, the victim stopped contact with the suspect. The victim notified their bank and phone company. Victims were advised to block the suspect's number and change their account information.
