

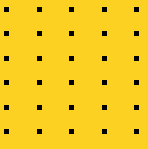

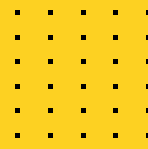
WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE



LARCENY

Nelms Circle | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding stolen license plates. The victim reported noticing the plates were missing while working on the vehicle at a repair shop. The plates were entered as stolen.

Wawa | 9 South Gateway Drive | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, slurred speech, an unsteady balance, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The deputy observed the suspect then consumed an alcoholic beverage in front of him. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect entered the store, selected alcoholic beverages, and passed all points of sale without paying. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication, two counts of shoplifting, and drinking alcohol in a public place.

Bridgewater Circle | A deputy responded to a larceny report regarding a stolen package. The victim reported that their package had been delivered and signed by somebody else. No suspects have been identified at this time.

WEAPONS

South Gateway Drive | A deputy responded to a disturbance with a weapon in the area. The victim reported that the suspect pointed a BB gun and fired at the victim's vehicle. After speaking with both parties, it was determined that the suspect had brandished the BB gun and was subsequently arrested. Multiple weapons and dangerous items were later found in the suspect's possession. The suspect was identified and charged with brandishing a firearm and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond. The BB gun and additional weapons were entered as evidence.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Walmart | 11 Village Center Drive | A deputy responded to a suspicious person report. Information was provided that the suspect was asleep in the parking lot. Upon making contact, the deputy observed the suspect asleep while holding a case of alcohol. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath, glassy eyes, and an unsteady balance. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

Target | 25 South Gateway Drive | Deputies responded to a person sleeping on a bench. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with slurred speech, glassy eyes, and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. The suspect was identified and charged with public intoxication.

BRAVO ZONE

DUI

White Oak Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated person report in the area. The deputy observed the suspect in a parked vehicle nearby. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and slurred speech. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. Due to there being a child in the vehicle, additional charges were brought forward. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, and cruelty and injury to children.

James Ashby Parkway and Kings Highway | A deputy responded to a motor vehicle accident in the area. Information was provided that a vehicle had struck a pole and was in a ditch. Upon making contact, the driver of the vehicle displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes and an unsteady balance. The driver admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. An open bottle of alcohol was later found inside the vehicle. The driver then admitted to consuming alcohol before driving. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence and drinking while operating a motor vehicle.

WARRANT SERVICES

Centreport Parkway and I95 | A deputy observed a vehicle failing to maintain its lane and conducted a traffic stop. An initial investigation found that the passenger was wanted out of Texas. The passenger was subsequently arrested. The passenger was identified and charged with fugitive from justice and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

212 Butler Road | A deputy observed a vehicle with a registered owner who was wanted by Virginia State Police and conducted a traffic stop at the nearby YMCA. The owner was wanted for making false statements when applying for a firearm purchase. Upon making contact, it was identified that there was also a passenger inside the vehicle. The driver then began cursing at the deputy and refused to follow instructions multiple times. The driver repeatedly instructed the passenger not to follow police orders before being detained. It was determined that the passenger was the wanted individual. The vehicle displayed a current inspection sticker, but an investigation into the vehicle revealed that it had an expired inspection. The driver was identified and charged with obstructing justice, driving with a revoked license, using counterfeit vehicle inspection stickers, and driving with an expired inspection. The passenger was identified and served on his outstanding warrant.

FRAUD

Madison Avenue | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding a system breach and unauthorized transactions. The victim reported that their business had been hacked, with the suspect accessing the company's account and attempting to pay themselves with a paycheck. The bank stopped the transaction, and no money was lost.

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Courthouse Road | A deputy responded to a suspicious vehicle report in the area. Information was provided that the vehicle was completely stopped on Courthouse Road and had sat through two green light cycles. Upon making contact, the deputy observed the suspect asleep behind the wheel while the vehicle was in drive. After the vehicle was parked, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with glassy eyes, an unsteady balance, and a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect then admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day. Open alcoholic beverages were later found inside the vehicle. An initial investigation revealed that the suspect's driver's license was not valid, and the vehicle inspection had expired. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the suspect's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence, drinking while operating a motor vehicle, a traffic violation, driving with an expired inspection sticker, and driving without a license.

Courage Lane and Richmond Highway | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically and conducted a traffic stop. Upon making contact, the driver and passengers displayed signs of impairment, with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. The driver denied consuming alcohol or having any weapons. An initial investigation revealed that the driver was wanted out of Fairfax County. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. Empty alcoholic beverages and two firearms were later found inside the vehicle. Additional charges were brought forward. The driver was identified and charged with driving under the influence, carrying a concealed weapon without a permit, driving without a license, and aggressive driving, along with being served on his outstanding warrant. A passenger was identified and charged with unlawful possession of an alcoholic beverage and public intoxication. A second passenger was identified and charged with public intoxication.

FRAUD

Pepper Tree Lane | A deputy responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized account openings. The victim reported running a credit check on their account and identified three cases of unauthorized account openings with DirecTV in Tennessee.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Taco Bell | 263 Garrisonville Road | A deputy observed a vehicle driving erratically in the area and conducted a traffic stop at the nearby Taco Bell. Upon making contact, the driver admitted to attempting to race a nearby vehicle. The driver displayed signs of impairment with an odor of alcohol coming from their breath and glassy eyes. An initial investigation revealed that the driver's license had been revoked. Field sobriety tests were administered, and a breath sample was received. The driver was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, a breath sample revealed that the driver's blood alcohol content was above the legal limit. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and driving with a revoked license.

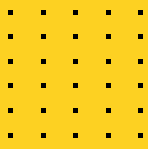
Wawa | 1172 Garrisonville Road | A deputy responded to an intoxicated driver complaint. Information was provided that the suspect was lying on the bathroom floor. Upon making contact, the suspect displayed signs of impairment with an unsteady balance and an odor of alcohol coming from their breath. The suspect's vehicle was found parked at one of the gas pumps. The suspect refused field sobriety tests and a breath sample. Camera footage confirmed the suspect pulled up to the gas pump, sat there for an extended period of time, then entered the store's bathroom. The suspect admitted to consuming alcohol earlier that day and coming from a bar. The suspect was subsequently arrested. At the Sheriff's Office, the suspect refused to provide a breath or blood sample. The suspect was identified and charged with driving under the influence and refusal to test.

Burning Tree Court | A deputy responded to a disturbance in the area. Information was provided that the suspect entered another resident's backyard and made crude comments before fleeing the scene. The resident then informed the deputy that the suspect lived nearby. The deputy and additional units responded to the suspect's residence. Upon making contact, the suspect was reluctant to exit the residence before finally stepping out to talk with deputies. However, once outside, the suspect ran toward their family member's vehicle and drove away from the residence. The suspect lost control of the vehicle before crashing it into a nearby residence. The victim then exited the vehicle and fled from the scene. The suspect was eventually detained. The suspect was identified and charged with unauthorized use of a vehicle, driving under the influence, grand larceny, two counts of hit and run, and reckless driving.

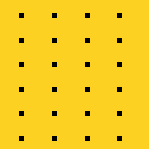
LARCENY

Books-A-Million | 1240 Stafford Marketplace | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that the suspect requested to see trading cards and then left the store without paying for them. Camera footage confirmed that the suspect approached employees, received the trading cards, and walked around the store before passing all points of sale without paying. No suspect has been identified at this time.

Wawa | 920 Wonder Road | A deputy responded to a larceny report. Information was provided that five suspects entered the store and stole cases of alcoholic beverages and soda. Camera footage confirmed that the suspects entered the store, grabbed the beverages, and passed all points of sale without payment. No suspects have been identified at this time.



SCAM REPORT



Victim reported receiving a text message and phone call claiming to be from Wells Fargo about an unauthorized purchase. The suspect then advised the victim that their account was compromised and that a new card would be issued. Upon receiving their new card, the victim received a second phone call about another unauthorized purchase. The suspect then claimed to be a federal agent with Wells Fargo and that the victim's account had been compromised again. The suspect then instructed the victim to withdraw funds from their bank account, avoid telling anybody about their actions, and deposit the funds into an Apple account. After the funds were deposited, the suspect stated that the process was complete and that the funds should be in the victim's account. The victim's legitimate bank later notified the victim about the fraudulent activity, and the victim spoke with the legitimate branch manager. The legitimate bank advised that the victim should contact Apple about the accounts. The victim also notified the FTC and SSA.
