

WEEKLY CRIME REPORT



MAY 6TH - MAY 12TH, 2024

ALPHA ZONE

LARCENY

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they caught a male suspect wearing a Super Mario hoodie stealing over \$350 worth of items. When the suspect learned that police were on the way he put his Crocs into "sports" mode and said "Let's-a-go!" before fleeing the scene.

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, deputies would also respond to Walmart for a larceny. The victim advised while shopping her wallet was stolen

ASSAULT

Lyons Boulevard, a deputy responded to an assault. A juvenile advised he was assaulted by a large group of other juveniles who also stole his phone. The incident was captured on video and the investigation is ongoing.

Mary Washington Hospital, deputies responded to an assault. The victim was transported to the hospital by a known party. The victim alleged he was walking home from a bar on Warrenton Road when four (4) to five (5) males jumped from a vehicle and assaulted him. Detectives are investigating.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Plantation Drive, a deputy observed a vehicle with no state inspection sticker and conducted a traffic stop. The driver immediately started the conversation in a belligerent manner and cursed at the deputy in nearly every sentence. Due to the driver's less-than-good manners, deputies responded to assist and discovered the driver had received a summons in March for the same issue. During the encounter, the driver would continually cuss at deputies despite a crowd of juveniles nearby. The driver received several summons for disorderly conduct, having an expired rejection sticker, and failure to obtain a Virginia driver's license.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Wawa, 9 South Gateway Drive, deputies responded to an intoxicated person call. The caller advised a male yelled at her demanding she call the police because he was drunk. Deputies located the suspect and confirmed his drunken claim as he continued to drink even more alcohol in front of the deputies. He was charged with public intoxication and consuming alcohol in public view. Due to his belligerent behavior, he was held pending his ability to participate in a bond hearing.




BRAVO ZONE

DUI

Highmark Brewery, 390 Kings Highway. A deputy was traveling on Kings Highway when she observed a vehicle turn right from a left-turn-only lane and failed to maintain the lane of travel. A traffic stop was conducted at Highmark Brewery as deputies responded to assist. The driver, who had no driver's license, advised he had only consumed ice tea; however, located in the vehicle next to his ice tea were multiple open cans of Modelo. The driver had clear signs of intoxication and after conducting field sobriety tests, was taken into custody. He was charged with driving under the influence, drinking while driving, reckless driving, failure to maintain the lane of travel, and driving without a license. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

FRAUD

Southern View Drive, a deputy responded to a fraud. The victim discovered an unknown pal created a PayPal account in her name and racked up a high debt.



CHARLIE ZONE

ALCOHOL OFFENSE

Stafford Middle School, a deputy was conducting her SRO duties when she was informed of a drinking disruption. Staff discovered three (3) students drinking from a water bottle that was definitely not filled with water. The alcohol was poured out and criminal complaints for underage possession of alcohol were submitted.

ASSAULT

Draper Circle, deputies responded to an assault. A juvenile was assaulted by another during a game of neighborhood basketball. A criminal complaint for assault and battery was filed.

WARRANT SERVED

Hospital Center Boulevard, a deputy conducted a traffic stop and discovered the driver was wanted out of Stafford County for a capias. She was served on her outstanding warrant and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



DELTA ZONE

DRUGS

North Stafford High School, a deputy was conducting her SRO duties when she was informed of another vaping offense. Staff discovered a student in possession of three (3) vapes, one of which being THC based. A criminal complaint for possession of THC on school grounds was submitted

DUI

Mountain View Road, a deputy responded to a vehicle parked in a ditch. The Chevy Impala was stuck in a ditch facing the wrong direction. If that wasn't a clue that this was a DUI, the driver had slurred speech and admitted to consuming four (4) Twisted Teas prior to driving. The driver's adventure was twisted when he was rerouted to Rappahannock Regional Jail where he was charged with driving under the influence.

Staffordboro Commuter Lot, a deputy was in the area when he located a running vehicle with a sleeping driver inside. The driver created his own personal sauna by turning the heat to full blast. Considering it wasn't December and Santa wasn't coming to town, the deputy found this to be odd. The driver had signs of intoxication, as well as, admitted to being intoxicated on the four (4) beers he consumed prior to driving. He was charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

400 block of Garrisonville Road, a deputy responded to a single-vehicle auto accident. A Fiat struck the median and bent the left wheel. The driver had clear signs of intoxication and admitted to consuming "a couple" drinks. "A couple" is more than enough to get you drunk as the 27-year-old found out when he was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2.

ASSAULT

Stafford High School, a deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of an assault. Staff received a video of a student assaulting another in the girl's bathroom. A criminal complaint for assault and battery was filed for the predominant aggressor.

LARCENY

Walmart, 217 Garrisonville Road, a deputy responded to a larceny. One DIY fan attempted to leave with over \$220 worth of tools. The hammer came down when staff stopped him and drilled him on his behavior. He was issued a summons for shoplifting.

VANDALISM

Foxwood Mobile Home Park, a deputy responded to a less-than-exciting art exhibit. Two (2) walkways had been vandalized by spray paint. Considering no one could understand the art it is hoped that the artist continues his day job.

ARSON

North Stafford High School, a deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of an arson incident. It was discovered a student set paper towels on fire because he thought it would be "funny." It was not a laughing matter when a criminal complaint for burning personal property was filed.

SCAM-AWARE

The victim reached out to a subject on Facebook Marketplace about a furniture set for sale. The furniture was listed for \$400 and the seller, a "Mindi Blosser" subject, requested a \$150 payment to hold the furniture. The victim used Zelle to transfer \$150 to the subject, but noticed the Zelle account displayed the name "Jennifer Myer". Following the transaction the victim did not receive a response. The victim's daughter subsequently messaged the seller requesting the furniture as well. The seller requested \$150 from her daughter as well. At this point, the victim determined that the listing was a scam.
