WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

Larceny

Franklin Electric, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised he had footage of three (3) separate larcenies from the business.

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised the suspect stole over \$140 worth of items. They also determined the same suspect had stolen from them on November 15th. Due to the suspect wearing his work shirt during both larcenies, the deputy was able to identify the suspect and obtain warrants.

Breaking & Entering

Mountain View Market, deputy responded to a business alarm. When the deputy arrived, he discovered the glass door of the business had been shattered. The investigation is ongoing.

DUI

Falls Run Self Storage, deputy was traveling on Warrenton Road when a vehicle drifted into his lane, nearly colliding with him. The deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and made contact with the driver. The driver had signs of being intoxicated and admitted he "took a chance" on driving after consuming alcohol. The driver was charged with driving under the influence, two (2) counts of refusal, failure to properly signal, and failure to maintain the lane of travel. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,000 secured bond.

INTOXICATED PERSON

Truslow Road, deputy responded to a "suspicious person" call. The caller advised someone was at a residence they did not belong to. When the deputy arrived, he made contact with the suspect who was determined to be intoxicated. He was arrested for public intoxication and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Big Lots, deputy responded to an unknown problem. The caller advised there was a male lying on the ground vomiting. The deputy made contact with the male, who was intoxicated. It was also discovered the male was wanted for three (3) counts of 'failure to appear'. He was served on his outstanding warrants and additionally charged with public intoxication. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

BRAVO ZONE



DUI

Giant, 35 Town and Country, deputy responded to a drunk driver complaint. The caller advised they observed a female stumbling out of Giant get into a Jeep. When the deputy arrived on the scene, he observed the running Jeep parked between two parking aisles. While the driver was actively gnawing on a chicken wing, the deputy suspected there was a different kind of fowl playing afoot due to her signs of intoxication. The driver admitted to consuming Bud Light earlier, as well as being born in the year 8807. No DeLorean was located and the suspect was charged with driving under the influence. VANDALISM

McDonald's, deputy responded to an angry customer complaint. Staff advised a man in the drive-through was upset about his order from two weeks prior. When the customer did not have things his way, he threw a cup of milk towards staff members, but missed them.

CHARLIE ZONE

VANDALISM

Shirley Heim Middle School, deputy responded to a vandalism. The school building and school buses had been vandalized with spray paint.

FRAUD

Taft Drive, deputy responded to a fraud. The victim advised he received a message over WhatsApp from someone posing as a relative. The fake relative requested money to be transferred so his luggage could be delivered.

ASSAULT

Raynar Court, deputies responded to a disturbance. The caller advised their intoxicated family member was breaking things within the residence. While attempting to calm the suspect down, she assaulted a deputy. She was charged with assault and battery on law enforcement and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

Weis Market, deputy responded to an assault. It was discovered an employee was assaulted by two (2) individuals. Both suspects were located, one of which was a juvenile, and the other had active warrants. The adult suspect was charged with assault and battery, as well as served on his outstanding warrants. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond. A criminal complaint for assault and battery was filed for the juvenile, who was released to a family member.

DRUGS

Brooke Point High School, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of drug activity. A student was found in possession of a vape and marijuana. Criminal complaints for underage possession of tobacco and possession of marijuana on school grounds were submitted.

Rappahannock Regional Jail, deputy responded to a drug activity call. Staff advised they located items smuggled in by an inmate. A warrant for prisoner in possession of chemical compounds was obtained.





DELTA ZONE



LARCENY

Tobacco Hut, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised a male stole vapes during his shopping spree. Using the magic of technology, the deputy was able to identify a suspect. The investigation is ongoing.

Staffordboro Commuter Lot, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised he parked his vehicle at the commuter lot only to return to discover it was stolen.

Ulta, Stafford Market Place, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they had video of a larceny in which nearly \$7,000 worth of items were taken.

Home Goods, Stafford Market Place, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised her wallet was taken while she was in the store. She would later receive notice from her bank of fraudulent transactions.

Intoxicated Person

Affirmed Drive, deputy responded to an intoxicated person. The caller advised there was an unknown male laying in a neighbor's yard attempting to strip. Luckily, the deputy arrived before this turned into an indecent exposure call. The suspect was determined to be heavily intoxicated and arrested for public intoxication. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Staffordboro Commuter Lot, deputy responded to a reckless driver call. The caller advised the suspect vehicle was traveling on Richmond Highway and had swerved into oncoming traffic. The deputy located the suspect vehicle and conducted a traffic stop. The driver had clear signs of being intoxicated, as well as a suspended license. The driver was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content above .2, and driving while suspended. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

WARRANT SERVED

Target, Stafford Market Place, deputy responded to a wanted suspect being spotted. The suspect was wanted out of both Spotsylvania and Stafford County. The deputy made contact with the suspect, who admitted to having controlled substances on his person. The suspected controlled substances were seized. The suspect was served on his outstanding warrants, and additionally charged with possession of controlled substances. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

SCAM-AWARE

Victim received an email from PayPal and called the number in the email. Victim spoke with a person stating they were from PayPal her account was flagged for fraudulent activity. Victim confirmed her bank account information. Victim then noticed that there was a \$990.00 withdrawal from her PayPal account that was linked to her Wells Fargo banking account.

Victim received a call from Amazon, claiming that a \$1,500 laptop was charged to her account. Victim was confused because she did not have an account with Amazon, and was then advised that she was a victim of fraud and transferred to their fraud department. After being transferred, victim began speaking with someone who claimed to be from the FBI. Victim expressed her suspicion towards the subject therefore she received a text which included a picture of his government-issued ID Card. Subject informed the victim that her name was used for nine (9) different accounts that were used for laundering money for a total amount of approximately \$500,000. Victim was informed that a warrant was going to be issued for laundering money and faced a possible nine (9) years in federal prison, but she would avoid the charges if she withdrew \$40,000 from personal account and give it to an agent who would come to her location to pick up the box containing the money. Agent arrived, no words were allowed to be exchanged, and victim placed the box of cash in the vehicle.

Victim received an alert that someone had accessed his account from out of state, specifically Salt Lake Utah. Victim attempted to login only to find that he had been locked out of his account. He then contacted Coinbase about the situation. When he finally logged into his account, he found that his associated bank account had sustained a monetary loss of \$11,930.06.
