# ALPHA ZONE



## **ASSAULT**

Taylor's Hill Way, deputies were at a residence to assist with a medical emergency. After the medical emergency was over and deputies were about to leave, a fight began between two females. The predominant aggressor was detained and charged with assault and battery and was released by the magistrate on personal recognizance.

Lapis Drive, deputy responded to an assault. It was discovered a verbal argument over accused infidelities occurred between romantic partners. The situation escalated when the suspect threw items at the victim, hitting him. A warrant for assault and battery was obtained.

## **LARCENY**

Walmart, deputy was informed by staff of a man actively shoplifting. The deputy was able to observe the suspect in the act and made contact with him. While conversing with the suspect, the stolen merchandise dropped out from his clothes. The suspect was charged with shoplifting and was released on a summons.

## **DUI**

I-95 Southbound exit to Eastbound Centreport Parkway, deputy responded to an auto accident. The driver of the striking vehicle had signs of intoxication. The driver admitted to consuming Guinness prior to driving. Along with being found at fault for the accident, the driver was charged with driving under the influence. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

## **WARRANT SERVED**

American Legion Post 290, deputy was on a traffic stop when he discovered the passenger was wanted out of Stafford for a probation violation. While being detained, a suspected controlled substance was located. The suspect was served on his outstanding warrant, and additionally charged with possession of a controlled substance. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

## **TRAFFIC OFFENSE**

Lancelot Lane, deputy was traveling on Truslow Road when he observed a vehicle with two different license plates failing to maintain the lane of travel. While on Plantation Drive the deputy activated his emergency equipment, but the vehicle would not stop. The vehicle would continue onto Knights Court, and onto Lancelot Lane before finally stopping. The driver did not have a valid driver's license and had suspected controlled substances in the vehicle. The driver was issued summonses for misdemeanor eluding, possession of controlled substances, driving without a license, and failure to maintain the lane of travel.

# BRAVO ZONE



## **TRESPASS**

Sheetz, deputy was on scene of a disturbance when he was informed of a trespassed person being on the property. After dealing with the original call, the deputy, with the assistance of a fellow deputy, located the trespassed person. While the suspect claimed he did not know he was trespassed, his criminal history would tell a different story. He was once again arrested for trespassing and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

## **WARRANT SERVED**

Little Falls Road, deputy responded to a wanted suspect being in the residence. The suspect was wanted out of both Orange and Stafford County. After being granted permission, the deputy entered the residence to locate the suspect. The suspect attempted to hide among clothes in a wardrobe closet, but was unsuccessful. After removing himself from under the undies, the suspect was taken into custody. He was served on his outstanding charges, as well as, additionally charged with obstruction of justice. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

## **BURGLARY**

Tobacco and Vape, deputy responded to a business alarm. When he arrived, he discovered the business had been broken into and items were taken. The investigation is ongoing

## **LARCENY**

Enon Road, deputy responded to a larceny. Stafford County Utilities reported an excavator was stolen from a construction site. The stolen equipment was located in a nearby creek.

# CHARLIE ZONE

## LARCENY

AZ Auto Sales, deputy responded to a report of stolen tires. Camera footage showed a Chevy Tahoe as a suspect vehicle.

Nissan of Stafford, deputy also responded to a larceny. Staff advised tires were stolen from a vehicle overnight.

Kohl's, deputy was informed by staff of two females actively shoplifting. Using the store's multiple cameras, the deputy was able to witness them collect just under \$1,000 worth of

merchandise. The two females were stopped during their exit and were identified as juveniles. Criminal complaints for shoplifting were filed for both suspects.



## DUI

Courthouse Road Commuter Lot, deputy was traveling on Courthouse Road when he observed a vehicle traveling 56 MPH in a 35 MPH zone and crossing over the double yellow line. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the driver. The driver had clear signs of intoxication and asked Deputy Jones to "just let me slide this one time". She instead slid to Rappahannock Regional Jail where she was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content above .2, disregarding a highway sign, and failure to maintain the lane of travel. She was held on a \$1,500 secured bond.

Lusterleaf Court, deputy responded to a single-vehicle accident. A vehicle crashed into an apartment building. The driver explained he believed the vehicle was in "park" as he attempted to put shoes on while in the driver's seat. The vehicle was not actually in "park" and lurched forward. While explaining the laced-up situation, the deputy noticed the driver had signs of intoxication. The driver was charged with driving under the influence and destruction of property. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,500 secured bond.

## WEAPON OFFENSE

Rappahannock Regional Jail, 1745 Richmond Highway deputy responded to a weapon offense. Staff advised they discovered an inmate concealing a knife. The knife was seized and the inmate was charged with prisoner in possession of a weapon.

# DELTA ZONE

## **LARCENY**

Haynes Plumbing, deputy responded to a larceny. A work truck was stolen.

Garrison Woods, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised her vehicle was stolen by a known party. Warrants were obtained, but have not yet been served.

Advance Auto Parts, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised two (2) suspects attempted to steal items, but were caught in the act. After being confronted, the suspects fled in a gray Lexus.

Lowe's, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they had video of a previous larceny. In the video, two (2) suspects stole over \$330 worth of items.

## **DRUGS**

North Stafford High School, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of drug activity. Staff advised they caught a student smoking in a bathroom. The student was found to be in possession of a THC vape. A criminal complaint for marijuana on school grounds was filed.

Colonial Forge High School, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of a vape detector going off in a bathroom. A student was found in possession of a THC vape. A criminal complaint for marijuana on school property was obtained.

H.H. Poole Middle School, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of drug activity. Recently burned marijuana-based products were found in a bathroom. A criminal complaint for marijuana on school property was obtained for a student.

## **PUBLIC INTOXICATION**

West Park Drive, deputy responded to a disturbance. While on scene, the deputy made contact with the suspect who was too intoxicated to be left alone. After giving the suspect multiple opportunities to call for a ride and the suspect refusing to do so, he was arrested for public intoxication. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

## **TRAFFIC OFFENSE**

Pancho Villa, deputy responded to an auto accident. While on scene, he discovered one of the drivers had a revoked license, no insurance, and the vehicle was unregistered. Suspected controlled substances were later located in his vehicle. The driver was charged with driving after forfeiture of his license, driving without insurance, driving an unregistered vehicle, and possession of controlled substances. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$1,000 secured bond.



# SCAM-AWARE



**Victim** received an email concerning a Venmo charge to his Navy Federal checking account. The email included a phone number (805-288-7672) for which he was instructed to call. Victim spoke with a man who had a Middle Eastern accent and told him that he had suspicious charges to his account which were then transferred into a Bitcoin account. Victim found this to be suspicious because he does not have a Bitcoin or Venmo account, so he believed that his account might have been compromised. Victim provided the individual with some of his personal information and scanned over a copy of his VA driver's license. Victim then pulled up, what appeared to be his Navy Federal account, on his computer and found Bitcoin activity which he did not recognize. He stated that he logged into the site, which appeared to be Navy Federal, on his laptop. He was then instructed that to rectify the situation, he would need to withdraw cash from his account and deposit it into a Bitcoin account. Victim made three deposits, after which, he reached out to Navy Federal only to discover it had been a scam. Monetary loss of \$40,500.

**Victim** was called by someone posing as her bank in an attempt to gain access to her account.
