WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE



LARCENY

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they observed a male skip-scanned nearly \$60 worth of items. He was charged with larceny and was released on his summons.

DUI

The intersection of Warrenton Road and Northbound I-95, deputy was traveling on Warrenton Road when he observed a vehicle speeding and having a hard time maintaining its lane. The deputy conducted a traffic stop as additional deputies responded to assist. During their conversation with the driver, it was discovered a firearm was in the center console. After the deputy and one of the SCSO drug recognition experts conducted field sobriety tests, the driver was placed in handcuffs. The driver was charged with driving under the influence of drugs, and carrying a concealed weapon while intoxicated. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$2,500 secured bond.

Doe Way, 11/6, deputy responded to an auto accident. A vehicle had struck a tree. While the driver advised the sun caused him to crash, the deputy deduced the three (3) beers the driver consumed before driving would be more likely the culprit. After conducting field sobriety tests, the driver was arrested for driving under the influence second offense in five to ten years. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$1,500 secured bond.

BRAVO ZONE



LARCENY

Pohanka Honda, 60 South Gateway Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised six sports editions of Honda Accords were tampered with and vehicle parts were stolen. The total amount of items stolen was approximately \$21,400. Deputy Gildea is investigating

EXTORTION

Barrie Place, deputy responded to an extortion call. The victim advised her now ex-partner was threatening the victim if she did not send money to him.

DUI

Butler Road, deputy responded to a drunk driver complaint. An off-duty Stafford County dispatcher noticed what they believed to be a drunk driver and provided live updates so deputies could locate the vehicle. The driver appeared intoxicated, admitted to consuming 6 beers prior to driving, and there was an open container of alcohol in the vehicle. The driver was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2, as well as, drinking while driving. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

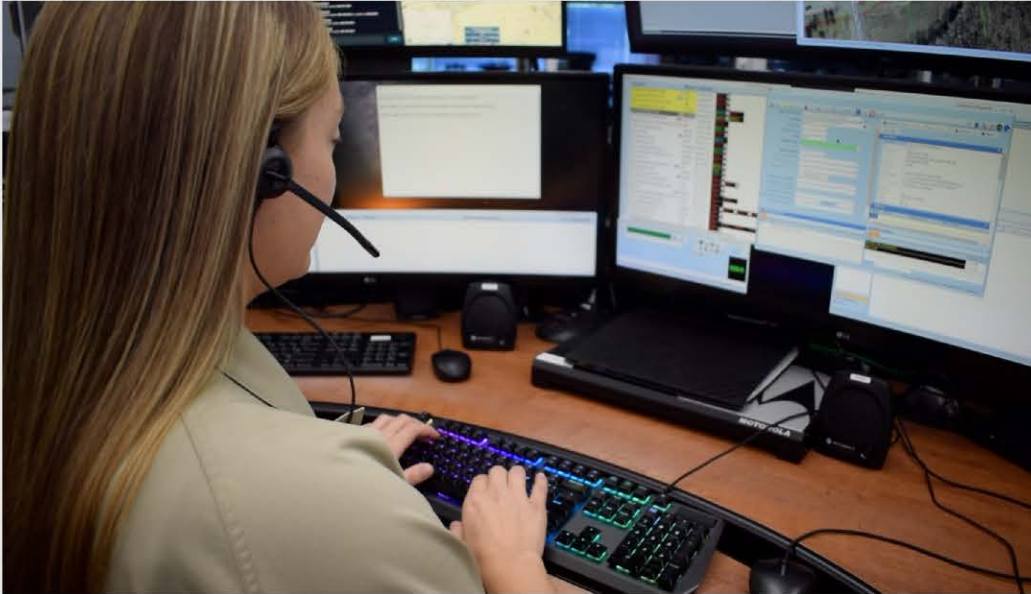
THREATS

Payton Drive, deputy responded to a report of threats. The victim received multiple profane and threatening messages from an ex-partner. The deputy obtained warrants for threats in writing, and using profanities over public airways. A service request was sent to the Spotsylvania County Sheriff's Office, which served the suspect on his warrants. The victim was provided additional resources from Empowerhouse, which assists those in abusive relationships.

VANDALISM

Chaplin Youth Center, deputy responded to a vandalism. A juvenile was kicked out a window after having his video games taken away. A criminal complaint for the destruction of property was filed.

CHARLIE ZONE



DISTURBANCE

Rowser Building, 1739 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to a report of vehicle tampering. Victims and witnesses advised a female, who they recognized from the SCSO Facebook post regarding a pursuit that occurred earlier this week, was attempting to enter multiple vehicles. The suspect was still on scene and the deputy was able to detain her. She was transported one building over to Rappahannock Regional Jail where she had been less than an hour ago. She was charged with three (3) counts of vehicle tampering and once again held without bond.

DUI

Exxon, 302 Town Center Boulevard, deputy responded to an unknown problem. The caller advised there was an unconscious male sitting in the driver's seat. Deputies arrived and located the sleeping driver. When the driver awoke from his nap, the deputy observed the driver was intoxicated. It would also be discovered the driver had a revoked license due to a prior DUI incident. The driver was charged with 3rd offense driving under the influence, and driving with a revoked license. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

WARRANT SERVED

Southbound I-95 at mile marker 142, deputy conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling 80 MPH in a 65 MPH zone. One of the passengers was discovered to be wanted out of Georgia for terroristic threats, domestic assault, simple battery, criminal trespassing, and destruction of property. He was taken into custody without incident. He was charged with fugitive from justice and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



DELTA ZONE



ASSAULT

Prime Galleria, 715 Garrisonville Road, deputy responded to an assault. It was discovered two (2) employees engaged in a fight after alleged name-calling. Both were charged with assault and battery and released on a summons.

LARCENY

Walmart, 217 Garrisonville Road, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they observed a male steal multiple headphones. The headphone hijacker was caught and charged with larceny. He was released on his summons.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Buffalo Mo's, deputies responded to a report of a bar fight. It was advised staff was attempting to remove suspects from the business but were having difficulties. After breaking up the bar brawl, three (3) males were charged with public intoxication. All three were held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Park Brook Court. Prior to daylight savings time, deputy responded to a disturbance. The caller advised he had gotten into a verbal argument with a known party before that party left the residence. The deputy was able to locate the female, who was intoxicated and in public. She was arrested for public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

WARRANT SERVED

Wawa, 105 Garrisonville Road, deputy observed a stolen vehicle in the parking lot and made contact with the driver. The driver admitted to using the vehicle without permission and was discovered to be in possession of suspected controlled substances. She was charged with unauthorized use of a vehicle through Prince William, and possession of controlled substances through Stafford. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.



SCAM-AWARE



The victim advised he attempted to apply for a loan with someone advertising as a division of SunTrust bank. After providing his information, the victim's bank account was drained.

The victim advised he received notice from his bank that someone attempted to use a fraudulent check in his name.
