ALPHA ZONE



ASSAULT

Southbound I-95 towards the Warrenton Road exit ramp, deputy responded to an assault. The victim advised he was involved in a road rage incident. During this incident, the suspect exited his vehicle and slapped the victim in the head.

LARCENY

17 Commuter Lot, 10/23, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised his vehicle was entered and cash was stolen

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they stopped the suspect after he stole over \$400 worth of items. When the deputy made contact with the suspect, he provided a false identity. That was quickly discovered due to his unique face tattoo. Deputies also discovered the suspect was wanted out of Stafford for larceny, driving while revoked, and two counts of domestic assault and battery. He was also wanted out of Fredericksburg for violating probation on a felony offense. The suspect was charged with falsely identifying himself to law enforcement, shoplifting, and served on his outstanding warrants. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

DRUGS

Rivermont School, 30 Pulte Drive, deputy responded to drug activity. Staff advised they located a student in possession of marijuana. The marijuana was seized and a criminal complaint for marijuana on school grounds will be submitted.

DUI

Intersection of Warrenton Road and Cardinal Forest Drive, deputy was traveling on Warrenton Road when a vehicle passed him at a high rate of speed failing to maintain the lane of travel. Having witnessed the traffic violations, the deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the driver. Not only did the driver admit to consuming a few beers prior to driving, but there were empty beer cans and an open Tequila bottle in the vehicle. The driver was charged with driving under the influence and a traffic violation. He was held at Rappahannock Regional

BRAVO ZONE



ASSAULT

YMCA, 212 Butler Road, deputy responded to an assault. A staff member advised she was assaulted by a customer. When she confronted the suspect about the assault, he grabbed her wrist and refused to let go. The victim had to forcefully remove herself from his grasp to escape. A warrant for assault and battery was obtained

LARCENY

James Madison Circle, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised his vehicle was broken into and multiple items were taken from it.

DRUGS

Stafford High School, 63 Stafford Indians Lane, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of drug activity. Staff had searched a student due to an extremely powerful odor of marijuana coming from her backpack. They discovered marijuana, THC cartridges, and a suspected controlled substance. A criminal complaint for possession of marijuana on school property was filed. Additional criminal complaints may be filed later on.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Valero FasMart, 620 Cambridge, deputies responded detaining one male matching the description provided. While speaking to the suspect the deputy could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on his breath. Suspect also dropped a bottle of Fireball whiskey. During this time the suspect started to yell at the responding deputies. The suspect was asked a number of times by multiple deputies for him to provide an ID card or his name and social security number. The suspect refused and stated he'd give it once he was at the Sheriff's Office or the jail. He was charged with petit larceny and intoxication in public.

CHARLIE ZONE



ASSAULT

Department of Social Services, 1300 Courthouse Road, deputy responded to an assault that occurred the day prior. The victim advised an "unruly" client assaulted her after he was asked to leave due to his behavior. Deputy Jones is investigating.

DRUG

Rappahannock Regional Jail, 1745 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to drug activity. Jail staff advised an inmate was brought in from another jurisdiction who had a suspected controlled substance in his possession. A warrant for felony by prisoner was obtained.

1700 block of Courthouse Road, deputy responded to an auto accident involving three vehicles. It was discovered the suspect vehicle crossed the double yellow line and struck the other two vehicles. The driver of the suspect vehicle appeared intoxicated and admitted to consuming some margaritas prior to driving. She was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content between .15 and .2, as well as, failure to maintain the lane of travel. She was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

LARCENY

Coast Guard Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised she could not find her wallet. As she was searching for it, she received notification of a fraudulent transaction from one of the cards, making her realize her wallet was stolen.

7-Eleven, 2998 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised the suspect stole over \$75 worth of cigarettes.

DELTA ZONE

DUI

Intersection of Garrisonville Road and Eustace Road, 1 deputy was traveling on Garrisonville Road when she observed a vehicle traveling 57 MPH in a 35 MPH zone. Deputy conducted a traffic stop and the driver advised he had several beers while watching football about an hour ago. There was also an empty mini-bottle of alcohol in his vehicle. After conducting field sobriety tests, the deputy placed the driver under arrest for driving under the influence, drinking while driving, and reckless driving. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober



Bertram Boulevard, deputy observed a vehicle traveling 40 MPH in a 25 MPH zone. The deputy conducted a traffic stop and made contact with the intoxicated driver. The driver advised she was in a rush to get home because she felt that she was going to vomit. She was charged with driving under the influence and speeding. She was released by the magistrate on a personal recognizance.

WEAPON OFFENSE

North Stafford High School, 839 Garrisonville Road, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of a possible weapon offense. The reporting party advised they heard what sounded like a taser coming from a student. When the student was asked about the incident, she confirmed she was in possession of a stun gun. The weapon was seized and a criminal complaint for possession of a weapon on school grounds was filed.

LARCENY

Monticello Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised his Disney inflatable was stolen.

Greenridge Drive, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised his Grim Reaper and zombie decorations were stolen.

BREAKING & ENTERING

Ocala Way, deputy responded to a breaking and entering. The victims had their residence broken into and multiple items of value stolen. Detectives were informed of the incident and the investigation is ongoing.



SCAM-AWARE



Aspen Hill Drive, deputy responded to a fraud. The victim joined a Facebook fan group for Alan Jackson, the country music singer. While in this group, the victim was contacted by someone posing as Alan Jackson advising he was going through a divorce and needed money in the form of gift cards.
