# ALPHA ZONE



## **LARCENY**

Walmart, 11 Village Parkway, 10/2, deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised they observed the suspect attempt to switch her personal purse and shoes with brand new ones. The suspect was charged with shoplifting and was released on her summons.

## **DUI**

300 block of Warrenton Road area, 10/1, deputies responded to a reckless driver complaint. The caller advised a vehicle jumped the median. Deputies were able to locate the suspect vehicle with the driver still inside the vehicle. The driver would mumble incoherently and easily lose focus. After a few attempts, the driver advised he took medication and drove after getting into an argument with his girlfriend. The driver was charged with driving under the influence third offense within five to ten years, second offense refusal, obstruction of justice, and reckless driving. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

# ALPHA ZONE



## **TRESPASS**

Brushy Creek Circle, 10/2, deputies responded to an eviction. The suspect would refuse commands to exit the house, resulting in a barricade incident. Nearly an hour later, the suspect finally exited the residence and was detained. The suspect was charged with trespassing and obstruction of justice.

## **VANDALISM**

Taco Bell, 730 Warrenton Road, 10/1, deputy responded to a vandalism. Staff advised a juvenile punched a glass door and shattered it. The juvenile remained on scene and advised he did it out of frustration that his phone was taken away. A criminal complaint for the destruction of property was filed.

## **ASSAULT**

Stafford Lakes Parkway, 10/5, the deputy responded to a disturbance. It was discovered two individuals were involved in a road rage incident. During the incident, both parties stopped their vehicles in the roadway, got out of their vehicles, and assaulted the other. Due to their reckless behavior, both were charged with stopping on a highway, disorderly conduct, as well as, assault and battery.

# BRAVO ZONE

## **ASSAULT**

Stafford High School, 63 Stafford Indians Lane, 10/2, a deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of a fight occurring in the bathroom. Two students were fighting and as staff attempted to separate them, one of the students assaulted the staff. Criminal complaints for the student were filed for assault and battery.

## **FRAUD**

Fairfax Circle, 10/3, a deputy responded to a fraud. The victim advised she was contacted by someone posing as an FBI agent. The fake agent suggested the victim's bank accounts were compromised and the only way to avoid losing money was to convert everything into Bitcoin.

## **ASSAULT**

Quinton Lane, 10/4, a deputy responded to an assault. The victim advised he was driving in the area when the suspect, who was known to the victim, struck the driver's side window and the victim with a pipe. The deputy located the suspect who originally denied being the suspect, but later came clean. The suspect advised he did it because the two had "beef". He was charged with assault and battery, destruction of property, and obstruction of justice.



# CHARLIE ZONE



## **DUI**

Stafford Hospital, 101 Hospital Center Boulevard, 10/3, a deputy was traveling on Richmond Highway when a vehicle in front of him drove through a red light. The deputy conducted a traffic stop for the clear traffic violation and made contact with the driver. The driver had clear signs of being intoxicated and advised he drank "one pint" prior to driving. An open bottle of whiskey was located within the vehicle. The driver was charged with driving under the influence with a blood alcohol content over .2, drinking while driving, and failure to obey a traffic light.

## **LARCENY**

Chichester Drive, 10/4, deputy responded to a larceny. The victim advised some time in the last week his firearm was stolen from his residence.

## **FRAUD**

Linwood Court, 10/4, a deputy responded to a fraud. The victim received notice from her bank of multiple fraudulent transaction attempts. None of the attempts were successful.

# DELTA ZONE

## **ASSAULT**

Garrison Woods subdivision, 10/2, deputy responded to an assault. The juvenile victim advised she was assaulted by another juvenile she had problems with in the past. The deputy made contact with the suspect juvenile who advised she "didn't do anything wrong". That was incorrect and a criminal complaint for assault and battery was filed.

## **LARCENY**

Walmart, 217 Garrisonville Road, 10/3, deputy responded to a report of a larceny. Staff advised the suspect stole over \$50 worth of items when staff confronted him. When the suspect left the store, he did so only after providing his information to staff. The deputy used that information to locate the suspect. The suspect made a few different stories about what happened before admitting to the larceny. He was charged with shoplifting and was released on a summons.

## **PUBLIC INTOXICATION**

Target, 1090 Stafford Market Place, 10/3, deputy responded to a disturbance. The caller advised there was a man inside the business pointing a scanner gun around shouting "freeze" and "get on the ground". Deputy Martin located the scanner suspect who, not only appeared intoxicated but advised he had taken narcotics prior. He was arrested for public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

# DELTA ZONE

## **FRAUD**

Mine Road, 10/3, Deputy responded to a fraud. The victim advised she attempted to buy a Pitbull off Facebook. The seller, at first, only requested \$100, but continually asked for more.

## **BREAKING & ENTERING**

Steven Circle, 10/3, deputies responded to a report of a breaking and entering. The victim advised she returned home to see an unidentified juvenile in the residence. The juvenile had broken a window to unlawfully enter the residence. The suspect was last seen wearing a black jacket, blue jeans, red shoes, and a hat. Detectives are investigating.

## **ASSAULT**

At the intersection of Garrisonville Road and Shelton Shop Road, 10/3, a deputy responded to an assault. The victim advised the day prior he was involved in a road rage incident. During the incident, the other driver described as a 50-year-old black female wearing a Cowboys jersey exited her vehicle and smacked the victim.

## **LARCENY**

Fiddlers Court, 10/5, 11:10 a.m. Sergeant R.K. Pinkard responded to a larceny. The victim advised she had two iPhones and an iPad stolen from her vehicle overnight. A neighbor's camera caught the larceny on video.

Hedgeapple Court, 10/5, 2:21 p.m. Sergeant J.J. Kreider responded to a larceny. The victim advised she had her wallet stolen from her vehicle overnight.



# SCAM-AWARE



## **FRAUD**

On 10/2, the victim received a phone call from someone claiming she won the lottery. The victim provided all of their personal information to the caller, including address, bank, and account number. The caller attempted to have the victim mail them a cashier's check to cover the taxes for her winnings but this did not take place. The victim, instead, contacted their bank and closed out accounts realizing this had been a scam.

On 10/2, the victim received a call from their bank regarding unusual activity on their bank account. The bank representative asked the victim if they knew a Jonathan Mitchel and stated that Jonathan tried to transfer money totaling \$800 from the victim's account. The "bank representative" sent the victim an email that appeared to be legitimate but the victim was suspicious of the interaction and hung up stating that he wanted to call him back. The victim contacted their bank only to confirm the caller was not with their bank, but instead, an attempt to compromise the victim's financial accounts.

The victim was contacted by Atlantic Union when an unknown person attempted to cash a check with the victim's name on it. The victim was also informed someone also called the branch location and transferred \$19000 from the victim's money market account to the victim's checking account in an apparent attempt to withdraw the money. The victim experienced no monetary loss.

On 10/3, the victim noticed their bank account had transactions that did not belong to them. Upon contacting the bank, the bank advised the victim's social security number and account information were used over the phone to access the victim's HELOC account. The bank also advised the victim that they had recordings of a man who called in and used the victim's name and social security number. Simultaneously, the victim's mail had been placed on a 30-day hold, per the victim's mailman. The victim froze all credit cards and changed all account passwords.

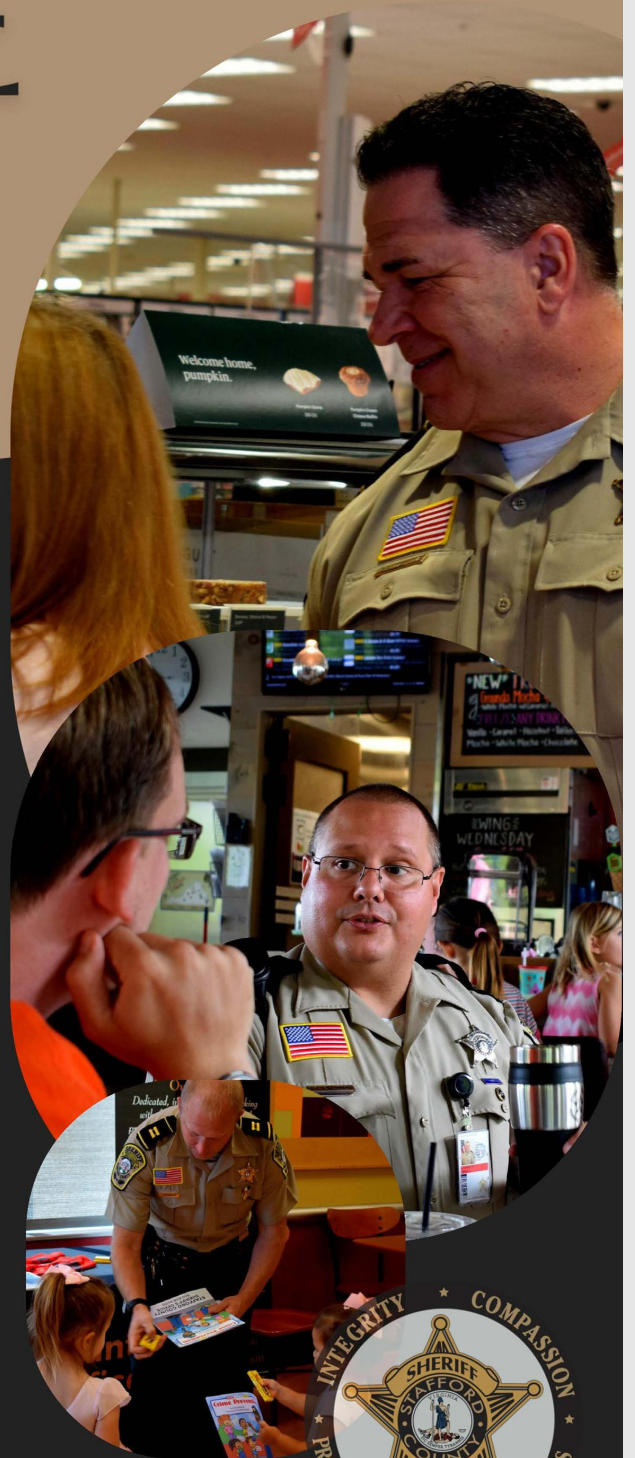
