WEEKLY CRIME REPORT

ALPHA ZONE

ASSAULT

Basalt Drive, deputy responded to an assault. The victim was assaulted by the suspect over a misunderstanding of a vehicle. The suspect was charged with assault and battery. He was released on personal recognizance by the magistrate.



ROBBERY

Basalt Drive, while responding to the previous incident on Basalt Drive, deputies were notified of a robbery. The victim advised his candy bag, which also contained his phone and Air pods, was stolen by three individuals wearing spooky scary skeleton masks. After searching the area, the stolen items were located. Deputies are working to identify the suspects.

FRAUD

Country Manor Drive, deputy responded to a fraud. The victim advised for the past few days there have been several fraudulent withdrawals from her bank account.

DISTURBANCE

Quarry Road, 10/28, 9:20 p.m. Multiple deputies responded to a Halloween party on Quarry Road, but not to participate in the spooky activities. The street was completely gridlocked due to the number of vehicles, there was extremely loud music blaring, juveniles drinking underage and disturbing the peace. Deputies stayed in the area until the party could finally be cleared out.

BRAVO ZONE



LARCENY

Duff Green Park, deputy responded to a vehicle break-in. The victim advised her vehicle was broken into and her purse was stolen. She further advised her credit card was fraudulently used after the break-in. The deputy is working to unmask the suspect.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Walmart, 125 Washington Square Plaza, deputies responded to a disturbance. It was discovered the suspect was harassing women in the store. When deputies arrived, they made contact with the suspect who was intoxicated, and requested an Uber instead of being arrested. While it was not an Uber, deputies did provide him free transportation to Rappahannock Regional Jail, where he was charged with public intoxication and disorderly conduct. He was held on an unsecured bond.

WARRANT SERVED

Ficklen Road, deputies responded to a residence in an attempt to locate a wanted suspect. The suspect was wanted out of Spotsylvania for rape and sodomy. After a brief standoff of the suspect hiding in the basement, he was taken into custody without incident. He was served on his outstanding warrants, as well as, obstruction of justice. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

LARCENY

YMCA, 212 Butler Road, deputies responded to a larceny. The victim advised after a nice visit to the sauna, he noticed his credit cards were stolen from his locker.

YMCA, 212 Butler Road, while the deputy was investigating the previous larceny, he was advised of another. The victim advised his credit cards were also stolen and fraudulently used in Stafford.

CHARLIE ZONE

DUI

Jessica Chaney Bridge, 11/1, 2:15 a.m. Deputy B.E. Vaughn conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle that struck a median. The driver advised he had “a few” drinks prior to driving. That “few” was discovered to be four White Claws worth, making him rather intoxicated. He was charged with driving under the influence, and failing to maintain the lane of travel. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.



LASSAULT

Richmond Traffic Control, 55 Venture Drive, deputy responded to an assault. It was discovered one staff member assaulted another during a meeting about his work performance. Witnesses advised the suspect used brass knuckles during the assault. The suspect was charged with assault and battery, as well as, malicious wounding. He was released by the magistrate on personal recognizance.

DUI

Brent Point Road, deputies responded to a single-vehicle auto accident. The vehicle had made contact with a tree. The driver advised he drank “a lot” that night which might explain why he went off the road. He was charged with driving under the influence and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$1,000 secured bond

7-Eleven, 2842 Richmond Highway, deputies responded to an unknown problem. The caller advised there was a woman in the store with “blood all over her”. While the “blood” was determined to be fake for her Halloween costume, deputies discovered someone even more scary than her costume. Her driver was intoxicated. After conducting field sobriety tests, Deputy Pitts charged the driver with driving under the influence. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

WARRANT SERVED

Foxwood Drive. The suspect from the Target larceny was located in the area. Deputies made contact with the suspect and arrested him on his outstanding warrant. During a search incident to arrest, suspected controlled substances were located on his person. He was additionally charged with possession of controlled substances and was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail without bond.

ASSAULT

Walmart, 217 Garrisonville Road, deputy responded to an assault. It was advised a staff member was assaulted by a customer.

Rappahannock Regional Jail, 1745 Richmond Highway, deputy responded to an assault. It was advised the serial vandalizing suspect of Leeland Station assaulted a jail staff member once again, making it his sixth offense for assault and battery on jail staff. He continues to be held without bond.

DRUGS

H.H. Poole Middle School, 800 Eustace Road, deputy was conducting his SRO duties when he was informed of drug activity. Instead of preparing their costumes for tonight, it was discovered two students brought THC based products to school and gave it to another student. Criminal complaints for underage possession of marijuana, possession on school grounds, and distributing marijuana were filed for both students.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Mountainview Market, 1259 Mountain View Road, deputy responded to an intoxicated person. The caller advised an employee appeared under the influence. When Deputy Hubbard made contact with the suspect, she did in fact appear under the influence. She was arrested for public intoxication and released by the magistrate on personal recognizance.
