ALPHA ZONE



FRAUD

Table Bluff Drive, 9/26, a deputy responded to a fraud. The victim had her identity used to rent a vehicle down in Florida.

LARCENY

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, 9/26, Deputies responded to a larceny. Staff caught two juveniles attempting to steal over \$300 worth of items. The juveniles had drawn over the bar codes in an attempt to make sure the security sensors did not go off. Considering that is not how security sensors work, the girl's plan failed. While speaking with the juveniles, the deputy observed one of the juveniles still attempting to conceal stolen items. Criminal complaints for larceny, shoplifting, and vandalism were filed for both of the juveniles.

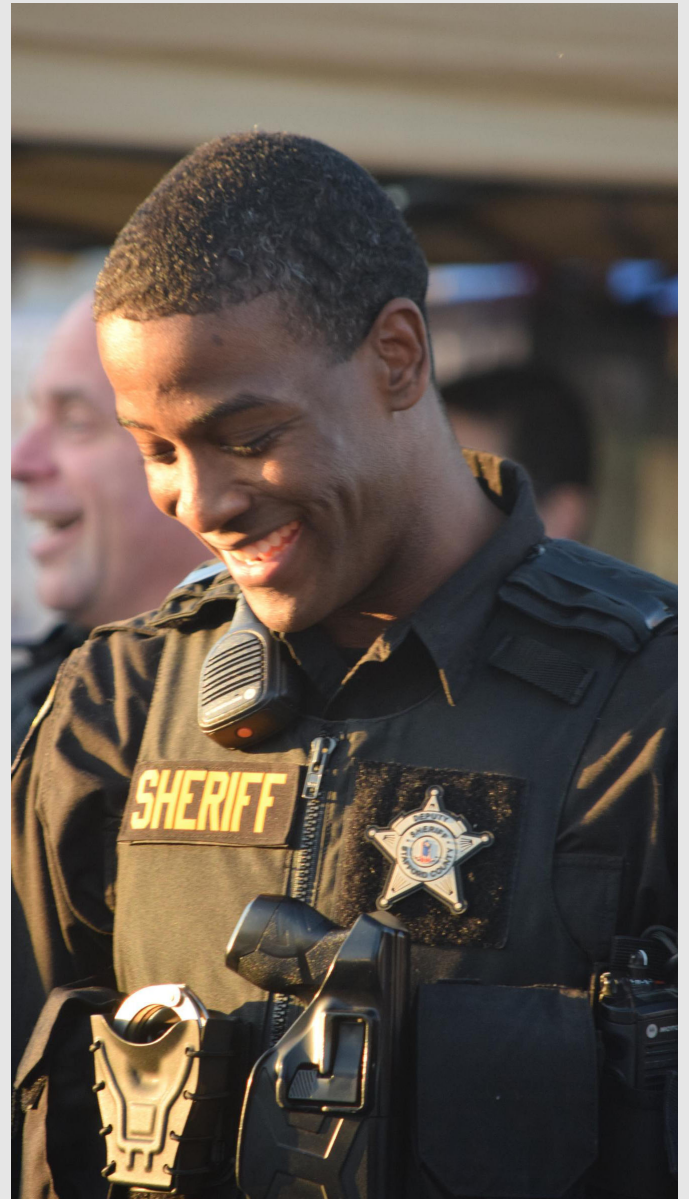
BRAVO ZONE

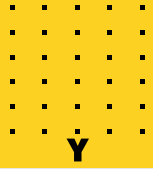
ASSAULT

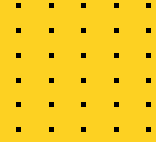
LARCENY

HIT AND RUN

Intersection of Garrisonville Road and Center Street, 9/24, 5:20 p.m. a deputy responded to a hit and run. The victim was rear-ended and the suspect vehicle fled the scene. Luckily, the victim was able to obtain the suspect vehicle's license plate. Deputy Vaughn located the driver who, not only did not have a driver's license but also thought the previous owner's insurance was automatically transferred to him when he bought the vehicle. The suspect was informed that this is not how insurance works. The driver was charged with hit and run, driving without a license, and driving without insurance. He was released on his summonses.

LARCENY

Ulta, 1150 Stafford Market Place, 9/25, 5:30 p.m. Deputy responded to a larceny. Staff advised a male and female stole a basket full of perfume. Our deputies are working on identifying the suspects.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

The suspect was charged with public intoxication, as well as, served on her outstanding warrant. She was held on a \$1,000 secured bond until she was sober.

Deputies discovered a verbal argument between the two escalated and the male assaulted her. It was also discovered the male was intoxicated. SCAM-AWARE



FRAUD

Ford T. Humphrey Building, 1225 Courthouse Road, 9/25, 10:48 a.m. A deputy responded to a fraud. The victim received a call from someone posing as a Lieutenant with the Stafford County Sheriff's Office. The fake Lieutenant advised she missed jury duty for a federal case and a subpoena was issued for her arrest. The victim thought about how weird the situation was and called the real Sheriff's Office to confirm it was a scam.

Fence Post Road, 9/26, 5:12 p.m. a deputy responded to a fraud. The victim received notification from his bank of a fraudulent transaction.

On 9/26, a deputy was dispatched to a fraud call. The victim advised someone charged her frequent flyer credit with American Airlines and booked a car in Pensacola, Florida.

Hunts Grove Road, 9/25, 10:48 a.m. The Sheriff's Office received a call in reference to fraudulent activity. The caller stated someone claimed to be with the Stafford Sheriff's Office and they were claiming she missed jury duty. They stated there was a "subpoena issued for her arrest". Someone posing as a Lt. with the Sheriff's Office who had a "strong southern accent" alleged she missed a court case that she was a witness to. Throughout the conversation, the impostor wanted the victim to stay on the phone because they wanted her to be within compliance. The victim thought wisely of the situation and contacted the Stafford Sheriff's Office.

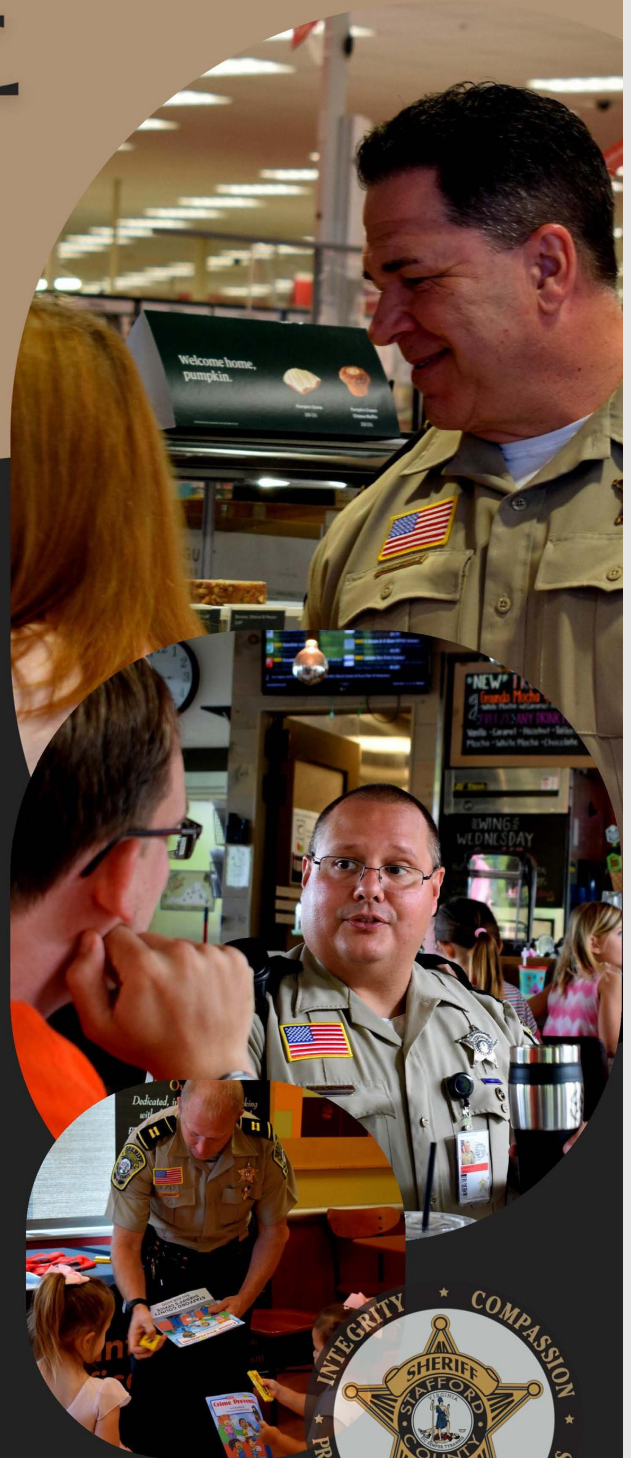
