PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Abberly Drive | 7/15 8:15 a.m. | Sergeant Williams responded to a disturbance in the area. Information was provided that the suspect was wearing only half of their clothes and did not live in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect was found asleep. After the suspect woke up, they displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and slurred speech. A firearm and narcotics were found on the suspect's person. An initial investigation found that the suspect was a convicted felon. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified as Douglas Boomer, 30, of Washington, D.C. Boomer was charged with public intoxication, weapon possession by a felon, sexual display, and concealing a weapon while intoxicated. Boomer was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a secured bond.

Providence Street | 7/15 7:32 p.m. | First Sergeant Demirci responded to a disturbance in the area. Upon making contact, the suspect initially denied drinking alcohol that day, but later changed their story. The suspect displayed signs of impairment with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath and an unsteady balance. The suspect was subsequently arrested. The suspect was identified as Kadajah Hix, 53, of Stafford. Hix was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Carter Street | 7/15 8:14 p.m. | Units responded to a public intoxication report in the area. Information was provided that the suspects were stumbling in the nearby cemetery. Upon making contact, two suspects were observed on a bench and displayed signs of impairment, with a strong odor of alcohol coming from their breath, slurred speech, and glassy eyes. Both suspects were subsequently arrested. The first suspect was identified as Gates Lund, 42, of Milford. The second suspect was identified as Matthew Young, 38, of Stafford. Lund and Young were both charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

Dunbar Drive | 7/15 1:58 p.m. | Deputy Pitts responded to a fraud report regarding unauthorized transactions. The victim reported receiving an alert about an unauthorized transaction for airline

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tickets on their account. The victim notified their bank and contacted the airline. Both launched an investigation. The victim's bank canceled the victim's card. No suspects have been identified at this time.
