PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Target, 25 South Gateway Drive, 6/9, 11:56 p.m. Deputy W.A. Bolinsky responded to a verbal disturbance. While arriving on scene, the involved male party attempted to run away. He would quickly change his mind and stumble back to the scene, stating he was too drunk to run. After observing signs of intoxication, he was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.

When Deputy Robertson arrived, he had no trouble spotting the suspect due to him stumbling and actively holding a beer. The intoxicated male was discovered to be wanted out of Stafford County for a failure to appear offense. He was charged with public intoxication and served on his outstanding warrant. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$10,000 secured bond and until sober.
