LARCENY

Walmart, 217 Garrisonville Road, 5/7, 4:17 p.m. Deputy A.M. Oliveira responded to a larceny. Staff advised a male shoplifted on May 5th. On this day, the suspect was back at it, coincidentally wearing the same outfit he had on during the first larceny. Deputy Olivera made contact with the repeat rogue and discovered he was wanted out of Stafford County for a capias offense that was also connected to a larceny. The suspect was charged with two counts of shoplifting and served on his outstanding warrant. He was held at Rappahannock Regional Jail on a \$1,000 secured bond.

PUBLIC INTOXICATION

Pick-A-Part, 164 Norman Road, 5/7, 1:27 p.m. Deputy R.L. Beasley responded to a public intoxication call. It was advised a female suspect was on scene in an intoxicated state. Deputy Beasley located the barefoot suspect and quickly discovered she was in fact in an intoxicated state. She was charged with public intoxication and held at Rappahannock Regional Jail until sober.
